50-50 changes made — Knights at the December business meeting approved revising the 50-50 drawing program as follows:

- One regular drawing for which each attending Knight contributes \$1. Winner gets half of total.
- A second drawing for which council will "seed" \$50 All Knights are eligible, but money will "roll" to next meeting if the winner is not present. The other half of first drawing will be added to second drawing total. When the second drawing is won, council will provide a new \$50 seed.
