I contacted Father Steve to confirm that October is the month that we especially honor the Blessed Virgin Mary and the Rosary. He said I was right in that but October is also the 'Right to Life'

month. So, I went from trying to come up with a subject and I wondered how I could tie the two together. Then it came to me, isn't this one and the same; the

Blessed Mother and the 'Right to Life?' The themes that the media plays goes something like this. The 'Soaps' are often about an unwanted child and the expectant mother is checking her alternatives abortion or adoption. The third option is always, I'll raise this child but it will probably ruin my chances for getting the good things in life.

As most of you know my profession is veterinary medicine, and during the first

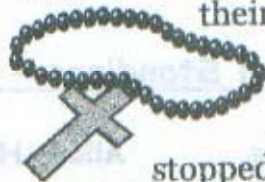
twenty years my practice was predominantly large animals. No, I never treated elephants or rhinos, my animal practice was food animals. There were two things that I will always remember. The first one is the struggle that a premature calf will make to try to live. Most of the time, if the calf was three or more weeks early they didn't have enough lung capacity to survive. But the struggle to live would continue for an hour or so. And the owner and I would do all in our power to try to make the impossible happen just because the calf was trying so. The other thing that I will always remember is that normal female animals will not kill their young on purpose. The only exception was a condition that we called 'sow hysteria.' This condition occurred when the mother pig was birthing. I would get a call from the owner who usually was so upset as the mother was trying to kill her young as they were born. I would try sedatives, even anesthetics, but the results were poor. So by now you are saying, 'WHAT'S YOUR POINT!'

There are two points. One, that even the premature will

struggle with all their might to live and breathe the same air that we breathe. The argument that we have the power to end the lives of children because they are not real or they won't know the difference is just not


Dear Fellow Knights,
