### Christians Are the Rhizomes of Human Life

Rhizomes - Any fleshy stem that grows horizontally, as a food-storing organ, beneath the surface of the ground, and enables a plant to reproduce itself. A rhizome, also called rootstock, is not a root, which is a

foodgathering organ; rather it grows roots on its lower side and shoots from its other side. Unlike tree roots, rhizomes

have nodes, buds, and tiny leaves and do not die when cut; replanted, they yield new plants.


