Chancelor's Challenge

Do we really have trust and confidence in our God?

Over the past two weeks, I have been attending the Lay Ministry Summer Institute courses on Thomas Merton. Father Louis, as he was called at the monastery, was a Trappist monk from Gethsemane Abbey in Kentucky. Although called to a silent, contemplative life, Tom Merton's gift to us was to write about the life of contemplative prayer. Written in the 1950's his book "The Seven Story Mountain" became a best seller—and is well read even today. He was prompted to write this book by his abbot so others could get a glimpse of the monastic life. This book was instrumental in calling many men to the monastic life and lay persons to consider the way of contemplative prayer.

Even though there are volumes I could write regarding Thomas I would like to begin with a simple prayer that he wrote late in his life. Please note that this prayer was written after Thomas had spent most of his adult life as a monk, hermit and contemplative and was considered a very wise and holy man.

Prayer of Trust and Confidence

My Lord God

I have no idea where I am going

I do not see the road ahead of me

I cannot know for certain where it will end

Nor do I really know myself

And the fact that I think that I am following your will

Does not mean that I am actually doing so

But I believe that the desire to please You does in fact please You

And I hope that I have that desire in all that I am doing

I hope that I will never do anything apart from that desire

And I know that if I do this

You will lead me by the right road

Though I may know nothing about it

I will trust You though I may seem to be lost and in the shadow of death

I do not fear for You are always with me

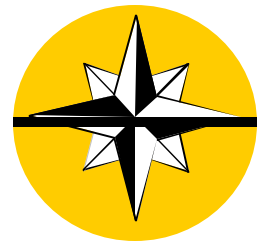
And You will never leave me to face my perils alone.

I offer you this prayer as it expresses what all of us feel throughout our lives. Our call to be men of faith is not guided by the logical, factual data of the world, but rather by the gentle prodding of the Holy Spirit. It is important for us to regularly reflect on our relationship with our God and to let Him speak to us in our hearts. This prayer shows us how our faith must be simple and trusting.

The challenge for August is to reflect and pray on how we have trust and confidence in our God to lead on the right path



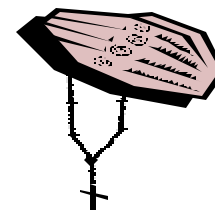

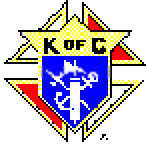
