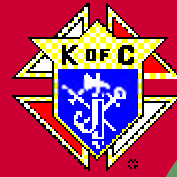

Chancellor's Challenge by Dick Petersen

Keeping Christ in Christmas

In his book, "The Ascent to Truth", Thomas Merton writes:

"When the angel of Nazareth spoke, God awoke in the heart of this girl of Nazareth and moved within her like a giant. He stirred and opened His eyes and her soul saw the in containing Him she contained the world besides. The Annunciation was not so much a vision as an earthquake in which God moved the universe and unsettled the spheres, and the beginning and end of all things came before her in her deepest heart. And far beneath the movement of this silent cataclysm she slept in the infinite tranquility of God, and God was a child curled up who slept in her and her veins were flooded with His wisdom which is night, which is starlight, which is silence. And her whole being was embraced in Him whom she embraced and they became tremendous silence.

It is the mission of Our Lady in the world to form this Christ of hers, this Giant, in the souls of men much as He transformed Himself in her. She brings them

His grace, and His grace is His life-giving presence. He is born in every man in Baptism, but we do not know it. He casts His shadow over the soul that first senses Him in the peace of contemplation: but that is not enough. At the summit of Mystical life, God must move and reveal Himself and shake the world within the soul and rise from His sleep like a giant."

I first read this while attending a class on Merton this summer. This short passage vividly and powerfully describes the true meaning of Christmas.

The Annunciation and the forthcoming Nativity were not just

nice bible stories for children, they were rather the single most important events in human history. Completing for all time God's promise of Redemption for us. Merton poignantly describes how intimate God's love is for us. So great is His love that it has to consume us and become living in us.

It is sad how many people still



do not realize the awesome power of this simple beginning. Christmas remains just another holiday where we pay homage to one another rather than to our loving God. Today we are still amazed by the earthly visions of changing power—

- ◆ Destruction of the twin towers
- ◆ Bombing in Afghanistan

Yet, 2000 years ago, God showed us that the power to change the world lay in a simple, holy, silent night, when He sent His only Son into the world to be with us and redeem us for all time.

The challenge for December is for us to focus our thoughts throughout this holy season on the message given to us that night. To realize that Christmas is a time to reflect on the goodness of our God and give thanks for His infinite mercy.

Father Weithman gives the "Good of the Order" Talk at November's Meeting

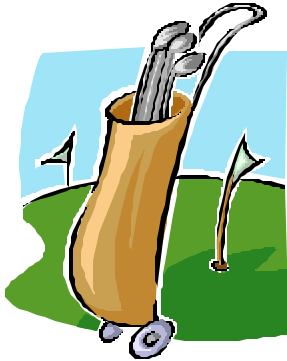
Our chaplain, Father Weithman gave the "Good of the Order" talk at November's business meeting. The subject of his talk was "Vocations". Father began by stating that at present there are only 17 candidates for the priesthood for the next ten years. The lack of priest may in part lie in our attitudes toward our priests. Whether or not we like the personal-

ity of our priests, they are still worthy of our respect in their position as priest. He noted that the reason many young men entered the priesthood was a call to help others. Due to the lack of priests, the remaining ones are now called upon to manage parish financials, staff, etc.. Rather than attend to the pastoral duties which they thought were their call to

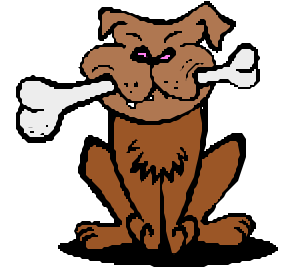
the priest hood. He described how it is important to affirm our priests as they go about their work alone most of the time without any one to share their happiness and grief. Father Weithman helped us to see that our challenge today is to make the priesthood back into a calling which is revered. In doing so more young men may take up the challenge.

THE AMERICAN FLAG

I was not fully aware of the reasons for this ceremony. I proudly send it on and recommend its use whenever you have the opportunity. In the coming weeks, we will visit through TV and news reports the funerals of many people. In those clips, we will see the folding of our flag over the caskets of many victims of 11 Sept. When you see this, I want you to remember something very special. Those whose bodies are laid to earthly rest will be honored by a tradition of folding the American Flag. This is not just a nice gesture, but has great meaning from our history - a history which even terror cannot overcome. And so, as you get the lumps in your throats, tears in your eyes, and struggle with bitterness, anger, and frustration, here is something to remember how special these people were.

WHY THE AMERICAN FLAG IS FOLDED 13 TIMES

Have you ever noticed on TV or at military funerals that the honor guard pays meticulous attention to correctly folding the American flag 13 times? I've known how the 21 gun salute was determined (adding the individual digits of 1776), but only recently learned why the flag was folded 13 times when it is lowered or when it is folded and handed to the widow at the burial of a veteran. Here it is:



- ◆ The first fold of our flag is a symbol of life.
- ◆ The second fold is a symbol of our belief in eternal life.
- ◆ The third fold is made in honor and remembrance of the veterans departing our ranks who gave a portion of their lives for the defense of our country to attain peace throughout the world.
- ◆ The fourth fold represents our weaker nature, for as American citizens trusting in God, it is to Him we turn in times of peace as well as in time of war for His divine guidance.
- ◆ The fifth fold is a tribute to our country, for in the words of Stephen Decatur, "Our Country, in dealing with other countries, may she always be right; but it is still our country, right or wrong."
- ◆ The sixth fold is for where our hearts lie. It is with our heart that we pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States Of America, and to the Republic for which it stands, one Nation under God, indivisible, with Liberty and Justice for all.
- ◆ The seventh fold is a tribute to our Armed Forces, for it is through the Armed Forces that we protect our country and our flag against all her enemies, whether they be found within or without the boundaries of our republic.
- ◆ The eighth fold is a tribute to the one who entered into the valley of the shadow of death, that we might see the light of day, and to honor mother, for whom it flies on Mother's Day.
- ◆ The ninth fold is a tribute to womanhood; for it has been through their faith, their love, loyalty and devotion that the character of the men and women who have made this country great has been molded.
- ◆ The tenth fold is a tribute to the father, for he, too, has given his sons and daughters for the defense of our country since they were first born.
- ◆ The eleventh fold represents, in the eyes of a Hebrew citizen, the lower portion of the seal of King David and King Solomon, and glorifies in their eyes, the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob.
- ◆ The twelfth fold represents, in the eyes of a Christian citizen, an emblem of eternity and glorifies, in their eyes, God the Father, the Son, and Holy Spirit.
- ◆ The 13th fold represents our first 13 States from which our brave, valiant forefathers came together to form our near perfect union.

When the flag is completely folded, the stars are uppermost reminding us of our nation's motto, "In God We Trust". After the flag is completely folded and tucked in, it takes on the appearance of a cocked hat, ever reminding us of the soldiers who served under General George Washington, and the sailors and marines who served under Captain John Paul Jones, who were followed by their comrades and shipmates in the Armed Forces of the United States, preserving for us the rights, privileges, and freedoms we enjoy today. There are some traditions and ways of doing things which have deep meaning. You will see many flags folded in the coming weeks, and now you will know why.
