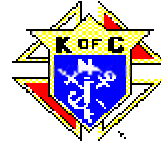

to sing at the Mass on the third Sunday of Advent. What next, singing waiters at the Fish Fry?

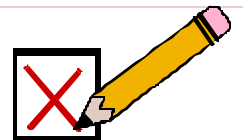

Look upon our world and our lives.

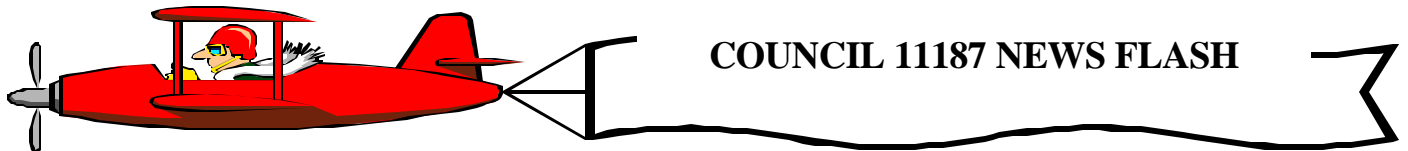
Pray for us to your Son
