

In July we celebrate the foundation of our country by honoring July 4, 1776 when the Declaration of Independence was signed. The events

of last month's California Circuit Court judgment regarding of the Pledge of Allegiance being unconstitutional because of the words "under God" brought home to me how far we have strayed from the ideals upon which this country was founded. Our country was founded on the ideals that we would be a nation where everyone was free to worship as we please. Unfortunately most people have not read the Declaration of Independence.

In declaring our independence the signers cite *"We hold that these truth's are self evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the Pursuit of Happiness..."*. You can argue over the semantics of whom the Creator is, but generally we accept this to be God. The signers also close the document citing *"And for the support of this Declaration, with a firm reliance on the protection of divine Providence, we mutually pledge to each other our Lives, our Fortunes and our sacred Honor."*

Our country has from its very beginning taken its formation, rights and protection from God. It is more than fitting that we give thanks to Him in our pledge of allegiance to this nation. Unfortunately we have come to a point where people do not respect these founding principles. They feel that their agenda supersedes the values of our country. They can't understand that the values which they are trying to destroy are the very values which make it possible for them to have their agendas. It is far too long that the vocal minori-

ties have abused the generosity of the American people and their values to forward their cynical approaches to life.

The current status of our country requires as to take action as a Christian/Catholic people. We need to become more involved in the political process in this country to uphold the rights of these groups without allowing them to try and make everyone subject to their special agendas. Amendment to the By-Laws by Greg Lowe

The following amendment changes will be voted upon at the July Business meeting.

ARTICLE V

Balloting for Candidates

Section 1. The Grand Knight shall appoint an Admission Committee of no fewer than three (3) members, one of which shall be the Membership Director. Within five (5) days after the presentation to him of an application for membership in the council, the Grand Knight shall refer the application to the Admission Committee and thereupon said Committee shall contact the applicant to schedule an informal meeting with the members of the Committee. The Committee shall, at the discretion of the Grand Knight, conduct such meetings either (a) on a regularly scheduled, monthly basis, or (b) on an "ad hoc" basis as needed. The purpose of such a meeting shall be twofold: (i) to afford the applicant an opportunity to inquire as to the nature of the council's activities/organizational structure and receive information regarding any other matters pertinent to the Knights or the council; and (ii) to provide the Committee with an opportunity to inquire as to whether the applicant is a practical catholic at least eighteen (18) years of age. After completion of such a meeting, should the Committee members file a written report withholding endorsement because the applicant has informed the Committee that said applicant is not a practical Catholic at least eighteen years of age, said applicant shall be deemed rejected. Otherwise, the recommendation of the Admission Committee shall be evidenced by the certificate of the Chairman of the Committee on a form to be prescribed by the Board of Directors. In the event of the failure or neglect of the Admission Committee to make a report within five (5) days after meeting with an applicant, the Grand Knight shall forthwith present said application to the council for action.

Unless the application is rejected for the reason stated above, it shall be read by the Grand Knight at the first meeting following the time allowed for the report of the Admission Committee, and except when notice of applications shall be published as provided for in Section 110 of the Laws of the Order, the council shall proceed forthwith to ballot for the admission of such applicant after said reading.

The Grand Knight and Deputy Grand Knight shall privately inspect the ballot box, both before and after the ballot, and the former shall announce the result. Balloting of the candidates shall be in charge of the Warden who shall distribute ballots to all members present. He shall place the ballot box on the salutation table and take his place six feet therefrom. He shall then request that all officers vote and after they have voted, he shall request members to vote. They shall advance in single file and deposit their ballots, but no member shall pass the Warden until the member preceding him has voted. After all who desire to do so have voted, the Warden shall exhibit the ballot box to the Grand Knight and Deputy Grand Knight and they shall count the votes. If the number of negative ballots cast does not exceed one-half of the members present, the applicant shall be declared elected, otherwise rejected. The exact number of negative ballots shall not be stated. If more than one candidate is to be balloted for at a meeting, the Grand Knight may announce that the first ballot shall be a general one upon all candidates, and that if not more than one-half of those present shall cast negative ballots upon such general ballot no other ballots shall be taken. If such announcement is made, and not more than one-half negative ballots are cast upon said general ballot, all candidates so balloted for shall be declared elected. If more than one-half negative ballots are cast upon said general ballot, then an individual ballot shall be taken on each candidate.


Section 2. If by unanimous voice vote the assembly members agree, then a written ballot will be dispensed with.

COUNCIL 1187 SCHOLARSHIP ANNOUNCEMENT SCHOOL YEAR 2002—2003


