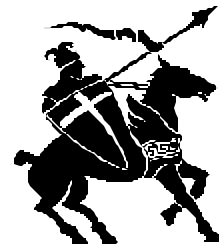

Chancellor's Challenge

Since this is the month of June, I felt it appropriate to offer up the following story of how Father's Day was started.

Father's Day, contrary to popular misconception, was not established as a holiday in order to help greeting card manufacturers sell more cards. In fact when a "father's day" was first proposed there were no Father's Day cards!

Mrs. John B. Dodd, of Washington, first proposed the idea of a "father's day" in 1909. Mrs. Dodd wanted a special day to honor her father, William Smart. William Smart, a Civil War veteran, was widowed when his wife (Mrs. Dodd's mother) died in childbirth with their sixth child. Mr. Smart was left to raise the newborn and his other five children by himself on a rural farm in eastern Washington state. It was after Mrs. Dodd became an adult that she realized the strength and selflessness her father had shown in raising his children as a single parent.

The first Father's Day was observed on June 19, 1910 in Spokane Washington. At about the same time in various towns and cities across American other people were beginning to celebrate a "father's day." In 1924 President Calvin Coolidge supported the idea of a national Father's Day. Finally in 1966 President Lyndon Johnson signed a presidential proclamation declaring the 3rd Sunday of June as Father's Day.

Father's Day has become a day to not only honor your father, but all men who act as a father figure. Stepfathers, uncles, grandfathers, and adult male friends are all be honored on Father's Day.

For me "Father's Day" is gaining more significance as my father is 77. Even though he is healthy as a horse, I am beginning to sense that there are not too many more times I will get to share this day with him. Isn't it funny that for all the bright adages and sayings we have about life, we don't really internalize them until we experi-

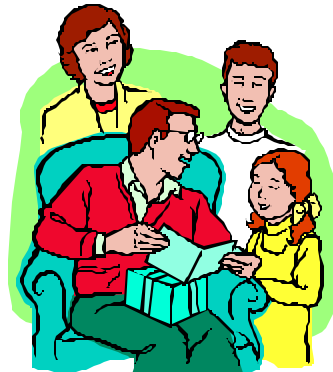
ence them.

It is hard to even begin to imagine any holiday without Dad. Dad, together with Mom, raised 11 children. Dad made sure all of us understood the meaning of family and faith. He taught us to be honest, hardworking people. Even though Dad was an executive in a company, we were always working hand in hand with the people in his company. He never looked down on anyone and taught us the meaning of being servants to one another through his example. Dad would be considered a very "traditional" Catholic, but his wisdom is sorely needed in today's world. He was raised, as many of our fathers, during some of the toughest times our country has experience. Those times helped him to understand much goodness in life and I hope to continue to learn from him in the remaining years.

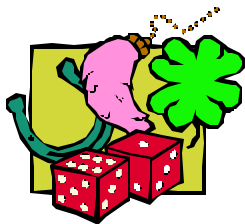

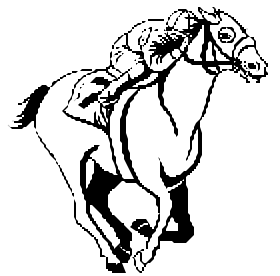


Dear Brother Knights,

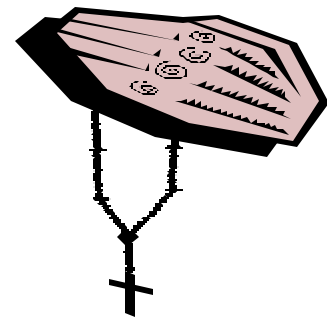

COUNCIL 1187 SCHOLARSHIP ANNOUNCEMENT SCHOOL YEAR 2002—2003

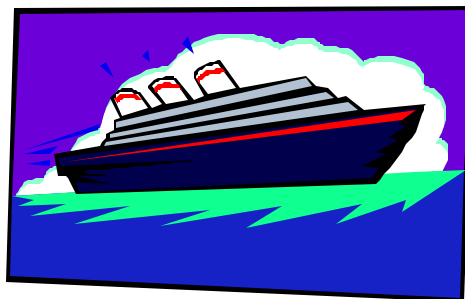
