# Chancellor's Challenge

May is the month when we particularly honor the most important women in our lives. It is dedicated to Mary our eternal mother. We celebrate Mother's Day to honor the women who gave us life and raised us. Yet, unfortunately there is another group of important women who are often forgotten. These are the religious women who have taught us and helped to nurtured our spiritual lives.

On April 7, 2002, I had the honor of attending my Aunt Joan's Golden Jubilee (50 years) as an Ursuline nun. There were six nuns celebrating their Jubilee that day. I reflected that in today's world we rarely even think of the nuns any more. They are not as prominent in our world since they don't wear the old habits we knew from growing up in the 50's and 60's. Now they tend to blend in to every day life. Yet these women are mainly responsible for the establishment of today's Catholic education system. Orders of these holy women are caring for the less fortunate throughout the world silently and humbly. Where would today's church be without the unselfish devotion of these special women.

As a prelude to the the Jubilee Mass, the nuns of the Ursuline order sang the following song which gives us an insight into why these women have had such a tremendous impact on our lives and the Church.


