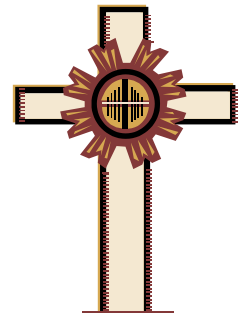

Chancellors' Corner



Brother Knights,

“And it came to pass in those days, that there went out a decree from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be taxed. And all went to be taxed, every one into his own city. And Joseph also went up from Galilee, out of the city of Nazareth, into Judea, unto the city of David, which is called Bethlehem; (because he was of the house and lineage of David) to be taxed with Mary his espoused wife, being great with child. And so it was that, while they were there, the days were accomplished that she should be delivered. And she brought forth her firstborn son, and wrapped him in swaddling clothes, and laid him in a manger because there was no room for them in the inn.

And there were in the same country shepherds abiding in the field, keeping watch over their flocks by night. And lo, the angel of the Lord came upon them, and the glory of the Lord shone round about them and they were sore afraid. And the angel said unto them, ‘Fear not! For behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, which is Christ the Lord. And this shall be a sign unto you: Ye shall find the babe wrapped in swaddling clothes, lying in a manger.’ And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God, and saying ‘Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will toward men.’” Luke 2, 1-14.

Having given considerable thought to what I would write in this column this month, I quickly came to realize that no words that I could craft would convey the meaning of the season more succinctly than those of St. Luke. The 31st annual MARCH FOR LIFE Washington, D.C. Wednesday January 21 and Thursday January 22

The Greater Columbus Chapter of the Knights of Columbus is sponsoring a bus to travel to Washington, D.C., for the annual March for Life on the anniversary of the Supreme Court's decision legalizing abortion, Roe vs. Wade.

The Knights of Columbus strongly support Right to Life issues and the Pope's call for a "Culture of Life". Show your support for Life and your opposition to abortion by coming with us to the March for Life. Edd Chinnock went last year and Hector Raymond went in previous years - talk to either of them about this wonderful trip and the tremendous impact thousands of marchers have on our lawmakers. Help Council 11187 have the strongest showing of any council in Columbus! Let's fill that bus from our council alone!

The bus will leave from Reynoldsburg at 7:30 a.m. on January 21, 2004 and will return at approximately 2:00 a.m. on January 23, 2004. The cost is \$150.00 per person, two to a room. A \$50 non-refundable deposit is required to reserve your space. Get your registration forms turned in as soon as possible because reservations will be taken on a first come, first serve basis (there will be only one 56 passenger bus). The registration deadline is December 20.

- Lodging at the Hyatt Regency Capitol Hill
- Mass for Life at the Basilica
- Ohio Congressional breakfast
- Rally and March for Life

The last week has been another busy one for the Council. It began with our Memorial service for our departed members followed by a trip to Chillicothe to visit with the Vets on 11/1. We had 12 people in attendance from our Council - thanks again Lorraine & Joe for shopping. Then our degree team held a First Degree on Wednesday at Holy Family for the new Council being formed, a Chapter meeting on Thursday, the Veterans Day Parade on Friday, Wives Appreciation on Saturday and the Pancake Breakfast on Sunday. We'll get more information on each of these a little later but I want to thank all of those that participated in any (or all!) of these events.

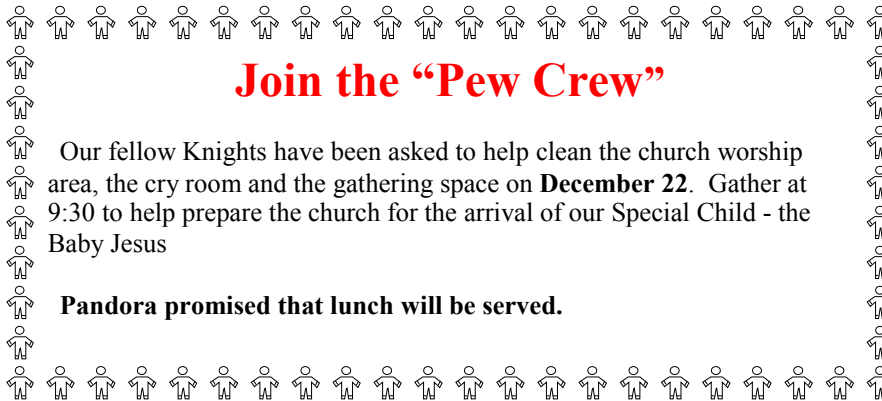
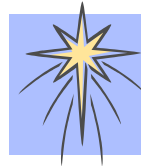
