CHANCELLOR'S CORNER

Brother Knights,

In 1914, President Woodrow Wilson officially proclaimed the second Sunday in May as Mother's Day. It is on this day each year that we take time to honor the person who has the most profound influence on our lives. Sorry, fellas, but we fathers generally come in second place when it comes to shaping the personalities, beliefs and faith of our kids.

Throughout the ages, authors and great thinkers have paid homage to motherhood. Abraham Lincoln said, "I remember my mother's prayers and they have always followed me. They have clung to me all my life. All I am or can be I owe to my angel Mother." George Washington is quoted as saying, "My mother was the most beautiful woman I ever saw. All I am I owe to my mother. I attribute all my success in life to the moral, intellectual and physical education I received from her." Oliver Wendell Holmes said, "Youth fades; love droops, the leaves of friendship fall; a mother's secret hope outlives them all." And an old Jewish proverb states that "God could not be everywhere and therefore he made mothers." All of us, sons and daughters alike, owe much to our moms for the individuals we have become as adults.

Down the Slippery Slope

The Supreme Court took the first step on the slippery slope of moral relativism with its "Roe" decision legalizing abortion throughout the entire nine months of pregnancy. Since then it has continued ever faster down the slippery slope with decisions that erode respect for life and support the culture of death. The decisions made by liberal judges across the country are now being based on moral relativism - moral standards based on what society now considers correct - rather than on the strict set of unchangeable God given morals that our country was founded on. These 'shifting sands' undermine the laws that govern our society - what was illegal today may be legal tomorrow and vice versa.

We live in a society that is radically changing the internal attitude about how we look at human life. In "The Catholic Way", Pittsburgh Bishop Donald Wuerl describes this attitude shift:

"Increasingly public policy reflects a disregard for God's dominion over life and attempts to substitute our own power. This is the most significant single attitudinal change in modern history. Our culture and civilization are based on the principle that God alone has dominion over human life, and neither individually nor collectively are we free to destroy innocent human life. Opposing this truth is the contention that we are the lords of life and that, if we decide we have good reason, we can make legal the taking of innocent human life.

Nothing has more advanced this false vision of life than the case for legalized abortion. At the heart of the abortion argument is the belief that we have dominion over human life and can take that life if it becomes inconvenient to us. Scrape away all of the rhetoric, and at the core of the abortionist movement is the rejection of the injunction, 'You shall not kill'.

The effects of the culture of death are not confined to the unborn. The elderly and disabled of our society are more and more considered as burdens. The disrespect for human life that began with the very first legal abortion has now grown into a culture where people will have to meet a 'quality of life' standard in order to justify their continued existence.

The assumption that to be old, disabled, or dying renders you worthless has fostered a terrible premise that seeks to eliminate the 'imperfect' from our society. Masked by a false mercy, euthanasia is often promoted as the right and good thing for society to do. Many are actively working to legalize euthanasia, already a reality in one state.

The word 'euthanasia' means a 'happy' or 'easy death'. Today in our culture the word is translated as 'mercy killing'. Most of the media emphasis is now on *mercy*, but we must never forget that the action is *killing*. Advocates of assisted suicide, carried out either by a physician or by a family member, challenge the Church's teaching. They say, in effect, 'I can end life if I have the intention of doing it with mercy.' Yet suicide and euthanasia are 'false mercy.' We do not respect human life by destroying it."

From "The Catholic Way", Bishop Donald W. Wuerl, Chapters 71-72.

As pro-life Knights, we must support political candidates and judges who will reject moral relativism and support unchanging moral standards as given to us by God and accepted by all societies in the past.

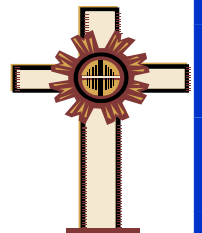

- 6) Return applications to Ron Schubert, 12231 Fedder Ct., Pickerington, OH 43147 or church mail box.



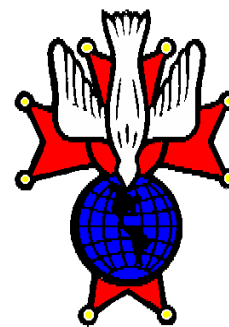
