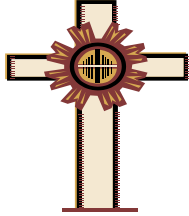

Insurance Corner

Sometimes it is easy to overlook the simplest of things.

Take the beneficiaries on your life insurance policies. If your policy was applied for and issued several years ago, it could very well be that the beneficiary originally designated to receive the proceeds from that policy needs to be updated. If you bought the policy when you were single, for example, you may have named your parents as beneficiaries. If you have since been married, that could be updated to reflect your spouse, and even your children.

Most people list a primary beneficiary - that person is specifically designated as the first in priority to receive policy proceeds. We also encourage the naming of a contingent beneficiary - an alternate person designated to receive policy proceeds, usually in the event that the original beneficiary pre-deceases the insured.

When I call to arrange your annual "insurance check-up," one of the matters that we can discuss is the status of your beneficiary designations. If they need updating, and they often do, I can usually complete the paperwork during the appointment.

I look forward to meeting with you to review all your life insurance policies.

In My Opinion - How Was Your Year?

As we come to the end of our fraternal year, it is a good time for a review of the status of the Pro-Life movement. Of course, the big news was the death of Pope John Paul II and the election of Pope Benedict XVI. Pope John Paul was an outspoken advocate of a "Culture of Life", opposed the secular "culture of death" and was a great leader in the Respect Life movement. Pope Benedict is likely to continue papal pro-life leadership, but it is too soon to tell if he will be as passionate and eloquent as John Paul. Regardless, we will miss John Paul.

The Terri Shiavo case brought euthanasia a step closer in the US. The courts ruled that her husband could starve her to death and went out of their way to prevent any interference with that death, even ruling that her family and priest could not be present to comfort her in her last hours. The courts even posted armed guards by her room to prevent her family from seeing her. Michael's lawyer described her death as "peaceful", but Fr. Frank Pavone from Priests for Life said it was a prolonged, agonizing death (Fr. Pavone was allowed to see her a few days before her death, while the starvation was in progress).

Last year, President Bush signed into law a ban on partial birth abortions, but immediately some district court judges ignored the law, the legislature, and the will of the people and banned enforcement of the law. These judges decided the "rights" of a woman to kill her almost born child supersede all else, including the law of the land. So the ban remains unenforceable while higher courts debate the issue. We need to get pro-life judges appointed to the federal courts to end this nonsense.

There is good news, though. In April, President Bush signed into law the Unborn Victims of Violence Act. This law recognizes unborn children as victims when they are killed or injured in a crime of violence, though abortion is specifically excluded. Also known as "Laci and Conner 's Law", the publicity surrounding the Laci Peterson case helped pass this law over the determined opposition of the pro-abortion lobby. There are several bills working their way through the various committees and legal processes. The biggest is the "Life Begins at Conception Act", which defines human life as beginning at conception. This directly addresses the core of the Roe vs. Wade decision – in that decision, the court specifically said that if the legislature defines when life begins, Roe vs. Wade becomes invalid. Of course, opposition is vehement and hostile. A parental notification bill overwhelmingly passed the House in April and is now in the Senate. This bill makes it a federal offense to transport a minor across state lines for an abortion if it is done to evade a state parental notification law.

The hottest issue currently in the news is the confirmation of President Bush's nominees as federal court judges. The Senate has been unable to even vote on these extremely well-qualified candidates because of determined opposition from a minority of senators who do not want to allow a full Senate vote on the nominees. These senators oppose any nominee who is not radically pro-abortion but are afraid they will lose, so they are doing everything they can to prevent the Senate from voting on the candidates. **Call or write your congressman and senators and tell them to end this "litmus" test on judicial nominees and to vote purely on their qualifications.**
