In My Opinion ... Is It Human?

Embryonic stem cell research is in the news again. In May, the House of Representatives passed HR 810, which mandates federal funding of research that requires the killing of human embryos in order to obtain their stem cells. The Senate is scheduled to vote on this bill and its own version, SB 471, in September.

As I pointed out in my last article, embryonic stem cell research has not lived up to its promise while adult stem cell research has provided a number of promising breakthroughs. Still, most people favor embryonic stem cell research because the media constantly raves about the possible cures and fixes promised by the researchers. The media also attributes adult stem cell breakthroughs to embryonic stem cell research as if there were no difference between the two.

Even among Catholics, there is support for embryonic stem cell research because of the promises of cures for MS, Parkinson's disease, spinal cord injuries, and many other diseases and injuries. Their attitude is "well, the embryos will be destroyed anyway, so why not use them for some good?" This seductive argument appeals to many, even those who are otherwise pro-life. The problem is that **these embryos are human beings**, even if they are not fully developed yet. The Catholic Church and many popes have repeatedly stated that life begins at conception. Pope John Paul II was especially outspoken on this. This is one reason the Church opposes invitro fertilization - many eggs are fertilized, some are implanted in the womb, and the rest are destroyed. **Each embryo (fertilized egg) is a human being, so destroying it is killing another person.** The fact that parts of this person could be used to save another does not justify killing him or her.

Suppose your daughter has MS - you know she is going to die of the disease eventually. A researcher tells you he believes he can cure MS if he uses her blood and organs in experiments that might produce medicines and genetic treatments. Not only that, but he promises that his research will also cure cancer, diabetes, and new organs for transplants. You ask him when these breakthroughs will occur and he says "within the next few years". You ask him what his research has accomplished so far and he says "nothing yet, but it has great promise". Will you allow him to kill your daughter to obtain organs and blood for his research? After all, she is going to die anyway.

This is the problem with embryonic stem cell research - it kills human beings for their parts. This can never be justified. Now is the time for you to act - even though Senators DeWine and Voinovich are pro-life, we need to let them know we oppose embryonic stem cell research.

Call or write your congressman and senators and urge them to vote "no" on expanding embryonic stem cell research funding (HB 810/SB 471).

Reading of the Minutes: Corrections were made to the minutes and a motion was made to dispense with the reading of the minutes and accept them as published with the submitted corrections. The motion was seconded, and approved by the council.

Admissions: 2 Form 100s were presented tonight. There is a First Degree Scheduled for Sept. 28th. 3 form 100's have been turned in depending on When the applicants are available the 1st degree may need to be rescheduled for Oct. The Admissions committee has a good group of volunteers now and will be getting together to organize the committee.

Grand Knights Report: The Grand Knight informed the council that we had been assessed \$250.00 for liability insurance. We welcomed Chris Chenault a new member attending a meeting for the first time. All program directors have been given the state programs for the year. They should begin making a budget for each program so that we can create an accurate budget for the council in the coming year.

Chaplin's Report: No Report

Treasurers Report: The Treasurer stated that we have XXXX in the Savings account and XXXX in the Checking account, and XXXX in a CD. This amount includes Measure Up monies that need to be sent in. A communication error resulted in these monies not being sent in on time. They will be sent out as soon as possible.

Trustees Report: The Trustees audit is due next Mon. Aug. 15th. They will be reviewing the information this Sat. Aug. 13th. The Trustee will also be reviewing spending in programs and hope to be able to report their findings in October.

Chancellors Report: No Report

Service Committees:

Membership: Pizza Party at the end of the month. There was discussion as to whether we should cancel it or go forward. It was decided we should go forward and we should try to call and specifically invite new members to the party. There have been 15-17 new members over the last year.

It was recommended that we begin to establish a calling chain to

get Knights involved. There are many distractions in everyday life that make it easy to forget announcements and e-mails.

Program Director: No Report

Community Director: We have confirmed that the Firemen would like us to help with their annual breakfast prepared by the Chief. This will cost us about \$200-\$250.00 well below the \$750.00 that a motion had been made to approve in July. It was also noted that the Firemen are also looking for a summer activity to help in the community. We have begun to look into doing a combine activity. This discussion will continue and the findings will be reported back when completed.

Church Director: Adoration for 9/19 is full. We would like to look into getting every Knight to volunteer for one Adoration slot. This would mean no one would have to do more than 1 every couple of years. We have also discussed with Father Klima how we can assist him this year. Items mentioned were:vestments for funerals, additional Holy Water fonts, and replacement linens. All these items are being researched for costs and types needed.

The Knights are looking into placing an ad in the Church bulletin on the Knights contributions to the Seton Community and inviting new members to join.

The Shelter was found to be in need of repairs XXXX dollars were provided by the Grand Knights discretionary fund to help fund the project before the festival. The rafters of the shelter had become covered in bird droppings. The lights were temporarily removed and the rafters were power washed, then framing was done to close in the eves. Additional work closing in the rafters will be done on Aug. 13th. A canopy was requested for the grills next to the shelter last year, but it is not needed for this year.

Family: The Meeting was temporarily suspended to allow Chris Schubert to come in and be awarded a scholarship. Chris offered his thanks and appreciation for the scholarship, and he credited the Knights for inspiring him to get involved in forming a group to raise money for MS, where they were able to raise \$2,000, more than any other group. Chris was applauded for all of his efforts. Once the presentation was complete the meeting was resumed. Dick Petersen is looking into a Family Mass.

Youth: We have decided to participate in the State Soccer competition. This event will take place on October 8th. Volunteers will be needed. If you wish to volunteer you will need to take Protecting Gods Children.

Kroger: No Report

Squires: The Squires now have a full councilor crew. The Squires brought in one new member last month. For projects they are now selling T-shirts - I love My German Shepard - with pictures of Pope Benedict on the back, and they will be helping with the flea market at the Seton Festival.

4th Degree report: There has now been established a new Central District in Ohio. Frank Iannaggi has been made the Master of this new District. Joe Rossi has been appointed his Executive Secretary, and Charlie Giametta has been appointed Marshall. Be sure to offer your congratulations to these fine Sir Knights.

District Deputy Report: Membership should be a primary goal for the Council. A 1st degree in October is required. A new requirement for Youth of the Year is that the Youth must be a

family member of a Knight. Any gender is eligible. Be sure to check out the State and Supreme web sites. As a matter of record it was found that Suspensions of members because they are no longer a practicing Catholic do not count against your membership goals. The Knights recently took in their 1.7 millionth member, 30% of which are insurance members. Poland has recently requested to start a Council in Poland. This would be the first it that country.

Old Business:

Seton Open: We are still looking for help on providing food for the open. If you can help with the food contact Bernie Holland to volunteer.

Football Raffle: Received from the State Football Raffle tickets. We are still in need of a director for this program as well as sales volunteers. If you can help with the raffle please contact the Grand Knight.

Motion: A motion was made in July to approve spending up to \$750.00 on a breakfast to be prepared by the Fire Chief. This motion was taken off the table and the floor was opened for discussion. It was noted that further research had revealed the cost of the breakfast to more likely be \$250-300. Since this was well below the \$750.00 cap the motion was call to vote and passed. All Knights are invited to attend the breakfast we would like all officers to attend if possible to show their support for the Firefighters.

Defibrillator: Bud Joos brought back information on the Defibrillator. They are very reliable. The Red Cross says that no training is necessary, but many insurance companies require that they only be used by trained personnel. CPR courses are \$4-500 each. There are 2 paddle sizes adult and children. It was decided to ask Father if he thinks the device is worth looking into before going any further.

New Business:

Festival Time: It was decided we would set up a booth for Sat. to answer questions about joining the Knights and supply form 100's to those interested in joining. The Food booth needs help on Friday, Saturday and Sunday morning. Mike Sergio needs dealers for Fri. & Sat. between 5:30 and 1:00 am.

5th Sunday Mass Suggestion: Joe Rossi suggested using a 5th Sunday Knights Mass to help make the Knights more visible in the Church. On every 5th Sunday the Knight would all attend one Mass together wearing shirts? An information table could also be setup outside after these Masses.

Newsletters: We are going to discontinue placing the newsletter in everyone's boxes. The newsletter will continue to be available on line, and we will keep about 50 printed copies under the Knights poster in Herman Hall. We will also try to use the full boxes to do some membership maintenance.

Journey of conversion for the parish (RCIA) A little bit about the Rite of Christian Initiation from the Catholic Update:

The bishops want the RCIA to be a priority in the parish precisely because it *does* (or at least it can) renew parish life. The RCIA is a journey of conversion for the person participating in the initiation process, and by extension it can be a journey of conversion for the whole parish! That is, conversion happens if the parish fully embraces the process of initiation and walks the journey of faith with the candidates for initiation.

Let's look closer at this notion of conversion. The *Rite* tells us that those requesting initiation "seek the living God and enter the way of faith and conversion." This indicates that those folks who come to our parish doors saying, "I want to be Catholic," are indeed "seeking" something. Although they may not articulate it as such, what they really seek is God. So, the parish invites them to into this wondrous process whereby they develop, deepen and enrich their relationship with this loving God in Christ Jesus through the Holy Spirit.

Now, if RCIA really is this wondrous journey of conversion to God in Christ, then the *sponsors* who walk with the candidates - supporting them, praying for them, witnessing to their faith, guiding them along the path - cannot help but experience some kind of conversion themselves. Likewise, the Christian community that supports, prays for, guides and celebrates with the candidates also renews its own conversion to God in Christ.

Indeed, we Catholics believe that conversion to Jesus Christ is a lifelong and ongoing process. Thus, when we witness others changing their lives, giving up old ways of doing and being and committing themselves to Jesus Christ, it makes us want to recommit ourselves as well. And when the members of the parish recommit themselves to Christ, the parish is indeed renewed.

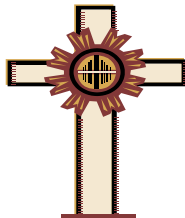
