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Respect All Life

As we begin a new fraternal year, I would like to introduce myself to the new members of our council and refresh all of our members about Respect Life and what it means. My name is Edd Chinnock and I have been the council's Respect Life coordinator for about 4 years. In this capacity, I represent the Knights of our council in all Respect Life issues, in particular as your representative on the Seton Parish Respect Life committee. My wife, Vicki, is currently the chair of that committee.

Respect Life means just what it says – to respect ALL life from conception until natural death. We promote what Pope John Paul II called a "Culture of Life" to combat the culture of death that is so prevalent in our world today. Both Pope John Paul II and Mother Theresa pointed to legalizing abortion in many countries around the world as the key factor in changing from respecting life as we did in the recent past to accepting and even demanding death. Along with this comes a general disrespect for the health and well being of others and an increasingly selfish attitude about everything.

Because of this, and because of the shear number of deaths from abortion (about 1 million babies killed every year in the United States alone), abortion naturally becomes the main focus of many Respect Life activities. <u>An estimated 40 million babies have been killed through abortion since 1973</u>, when the US Supreme Court legalized abortion through its Roe v Wade decision. Against that incredible loss of life, the genocide in Darfur and Rwanda, the war in Iraq, the terrorist attacks around the world, and even Hitler's Holocaust pale in comparison. The big anti-abortion event each year is the **March for Life** in Washington D.C. on January 22, the anniversary of Roe v Wade. Hundreds of thousands of people from all over the United States gather to show our elected representatives how we feel about this horrible loss of life.

For the last 10 years or more, Seton has sent representatives to the March for Life. I have gone the last 6 years and our deacon, Hector Raymond, has gone several times. The Columbus Knights of Columbus sponsor a bus trip to this wonderful event that includes transportation, hotel rooms in 5-star hotels, the Ohio Congressional breakfast, the Mass for Life the night before, and the March itself. **This event is truly awesome in every sense of the word and I** encourage every Knight to participate. It would be wonderful if we could fill one or more buses with just the members of Council 11187! This trip has three highlights:

The Mass for Life on the evening before the March. There are so many Cardinals, Bishops, priests, deacons, and seminarians that the entrance procession alone takes over 20 minutes! The Basilica of the Immaculate Conception holds about 6,000 people but we manage to cram about 10,000 Pro-Lifers in. The number of young people is awe inspiring! You have to see it to believe it!

The Ohio Congressional breakfast. People from all over Ohio gather to meet our Congressional representatives and listen to Senator Voinovich and others speak about Pro-Life issues.

The March for Life. We gather near the Ellipse and march up Constitution Ave to the Supreme Court building. You have to actually be there to appreciate the shear number of people and the incredible number of young people that participate.

For the past several years, our council has generously supported this March by paying for several SPY students to take the trip. I

strongly encourage all Knights of our council to go on this great trip with us! Contact me for more information.

On a local level, the Seton Respect Life committee is helping several other Pickerington churches to sponsor the third annual **Pickerington Life Chain** in October. On a Sunday afternoon in late October (Respect Life month) we gather in downtown old Pickerington and quietly protest abortion and encourage a culture of life with others from our community who feel as we do. I will let you know the exact date later, but <u>please support this effort with a</u> <u>couple of hours of your time!</u> As Pro-Life Knights, we need to stand up and be counted when it counts!

The Seton Respect Life committee works hard to encourage respect for all life, so we don't concentrate just on abortion. We visit our local nursing homes, help with the military outreach and Crank's Creek projects, support Pregnancy Decisions Heath Centers with our annual baby items drive, and many other activities. We do whatever we can to encourage a Culture of Life, especially within Seton and Pickerington. In September, the committee will begin a new year of activities and <u>we would love to have a lot of new</u> <u>members</u> – remember: "many hands make light work". **Please prayerfully consider joining our committee to help restore a Culture of Life in our community and country**. And encourage your wives and teen/grown children to join us as well!

Business Meeting Minutes

Business Meeting Minutes July 11, 2007

Meeting opened at: 7:30 pm

<u>Roll of Officers</u>: Advocate, Treasurer Inner Guard and Lecturer were excused, all other officers were in attendance.

<u>Reading of the Minutes</u>: A motion was made to approve the minutes as published. The motion was seconded. There was no discussion. The motion was call to vote and passed.

<u>Chaplain's Report</u>: Deacon Hector talked about the changes in the Mass in an editorial

Report on Admissions:

Grand Knights Report: the Grand Knight Thanked everyone for the opportunity to serve. He is looking forward to a fun and productive year. He then offered his thanks to Lloyd for his leadership last year; his work has started us back in the right direction.

On Monday July 2nd the Grand Knight had a meeting with Fr. Jim. The Grand Knight believed this will be an important part of our parish commitment to keep the lines of communication open.

Fr. Jim expressed that he wanted us to work on getting our brother Knights that are not attending church on a regular basis to start attending again. This, as I said in the newsletter article, will benefit both the parish community and our council.

We are looking at the Parish Vision Plan to see if we would be able to contribute more to the community than just our fund raising activities. It is important that we are active in the parish community, we will be looking at areas that we may be able to assist or have an impact on.

The Grand Knight also talked with Fr. Jim about our visibility within the parish. While we are not able to hang our awards on the classroom walls, he has given permission to use the wall in the corridor by the library; this is a high traffic area. The reason the classroom is not available is that 99 percent of the time ... it is a classroom, we use it as a meeting room four times a month, so that is understandable. Plus in addition to the wall outside the library we will be able to get a display case for the PAC, which will give us even more visibility.

The Grand Knight thinks that this is an important part of our relationship with our parish. Some people may think that if Fr. Jim is not asking for money, then we are not needed, but if we become more involved with some other areas we can do more and the rewards maybe greater.

An area we have been falling behind is when we have an illness or funeral, in Assembly 809 we had someone responsible for sending out a card. So the Grand Knight is looking for someone to take that this on. Terry Reine Volunteered to start this back up for the Council. It was discussed at the officers meeting that in lieu of flowers being sent out; the Council will instead purchase a Perpetual Mass card instead. Mark kind of volunteered to take this on.

The Grand Knight then asked that any request for funds be presented to the officers prior to the business meetings. This excludes any of the fund raisers currently on the books. The Grand Knight will table any request that is brought up in the business meeting until the elected officers; have a chance to review it. Just give a synopsis of the proposal and email it to the Grand Knight, he will in turn disperse it to the other officers.

And as always you are all invited to the officers meetings, these are not closed to the membership.

Communications: We received a thank you note from Marianne Wenger in support of the Military Outreach program they wrapped up. Brother Wayne pointed out that there is a bulletin board out in the gathering space with pictures of the soldiers receiving the care packages.

Treasurers Report: Bob will be adding an article in next month's newsletter explaining the mechanics of submitting requests for money. This will change part of the way we do business. I also recommend that the various committees start looking at last year's program. Since there was no Treasurers report the financial status of the council was questioned. In May we listed XXXX in our checking account. There was no report made in June.

Bills: A question was called about the difference in expenses for the Cleveland Convention. It was noted that Dick covered the registration expenses for both couples. It was also noted that the reimbursement checks for the convention will come to the Financial Secretary.

A motion was made to submit the bills to the Trustees for approval. The motion was seconded and approved.

Financial Secretaries Report: The Financial Secretary received the information for the job and is in the process of translating the software package. The Audit will be done in the next couple of weeks.

<u>**Trustees Report</u>**: The Trustees have reviewed and approved all of the bills submitted tonight. They also confirmed that the Audit was due by Aug the 15^{th} .</u>

Chancellors Report: No Report

Report of Service Committees/Programs:

Membership: We will be shooting for an August 14th first degree. It was requested by State that we hold a first degree on either the 12th or 14th of August. If a council brings in at least 1 member on either the 12th or 14th the Grand Knight will receive a check for \$50.00. The Membership chairman has requested that all members try to participate in the recruiting process.

Program Director: No report

<u>Church Director</u>: We are looking at having a Knight's Mass on every 5^{th} Sunday. We are looking to talk to Father about this. The Adoration schedule is doing well. We have 3 dates available in August. 2 of the 3 were filled at the meeting. We will try for the installation of officers at the August 1^{st} Saturday Mass.

Squires: On the Weekend of the 29, 30 and 1^{st} of July we had 3 squires and 2 state officers attended the Squires State Convention. The kids did a great job of conducting the meeting and getting business done. The kids won 1^{st} and 2^{nd} place in volleyball. For spiritual award they tied for 1^{st} . For membership they received 1^{st} place, for service they received 1^{st} place. They didn't place in circle activities and in special activities they placed third; they also won the most active circle in the state award.

New Business:

National Catholic Youth Conference: The Nationals Catholic Youth Conference is coming on Nov. 8-10th at Nationwide Arena. Registration is \$180.00/person. There is an additional fee of \$90.00 for meals and a \$15.00 fee for a Diocesan tee shirt. This makes the total per person \$285.00 we have a group of 10 youth interested in going to this here at Seton. A motion was made to support sending the Seton youth to the conference with \$570.00. The motion was seconded and the floor was opened for discussion. It was discussed how to choose who gets the funding and it was decided that it should be split as needed to reduce the expenses of those youth attending. The motion was then tabled so that it could be published and will be brought back to the assembly next month.

Building Committee: We have not yet received a bill for the magnets but we have begun filling orders. It was questioned how we are shipping the magnets because of their weight. Financial Procedures - requesting funds

This article will attempt to clarify the financial procedures that have caused some past confusion and to explain some changes that will enable the Council to fully comply with directives from other authorities and to improve the Council's financial accountabilities.

Budgets versus Authority to Spend

These items are separate processes. One has NO impact on the other. Budgets are used to guide the Council's financial operations during the current year, while "authority to spend" is an approval process whether an item is included or not included in the budget. Including an item in the budget is NOT approval to spend unless it has been presented to the membership.

If you are one who routinely spends money on a particular item or event, i.e., chairperson, you may be asked to provide input into the planning for the budget; nevertheless, you must request membership approval to actually spend the money.

There are limited exceptions to this requirement. One is the Grand Knight's discretionary ability to approve up to \$500 for a Knight in need. When he exercises this discretion, the Grand Knight will notify the membership at the next membership meeting. Other exceptions are payments to Supreme and State Chapters for "per capita" and related membership expenses, for example.

All other expenditures will require membership approval before encumbering the funds. If it is a recurring expenditure, e.g., first Saturday, postage, meeting refreshments these expenses should be approved an annual basis and presented to the membership before hand. The budget process provides and excellent vehicle to track expenditures against the approved amount and will quickly hi-lite when an approved amount is exceeded and additional approval is required.

Non-anticipated expenses must be approved as the need arises.

No expenditures will be reimbursed without membership approval.

It is worth noting that exact amounts are not necessary for approval. A "not to exceed" amount is acceptable.

All requests for reimbursement of previously approved expenditures must be presented with a "Request for Reimbursement" form, which can be found on the web page, along with appropriate receipts. The form must be signed by the Knight making the expenditure and, for those events having multiple chairpersons; the form must be signed by all chairpersons. Requests should be presented in a timely manner and not left to accumulate. We will do our best to make reimbursement within 2 weeks of receiving the request.

Receipts and Deposits

All receipts and deposits <u>must</u> be processed through the Financial Secretary. No exceptions! The Financial Secretary will take possession of all receipts and deposits and will make himself available accordingly or will provide prior delegation. In the event that prior arrangements can not be made with the Financial Secretary to take possession, minimally, the Financial Secretary will be notified that a deposit has been made and the deposit receipt will be delivered to him. If the deposit is a night drop, a copy of the deposit form and a breakdown of the deposit by denomination will be presented to the Secretary prior to his contacting the bank.

Night deposit bags and deposit forms are available from the Financial Secretary.
