Business Meeting Minutes for January 10, 2006

The Meeting Opened at 7:31 pm by the Grand Knight Lloyd Stauffer

Role Call: Chaplin, Financial Secretary, were excused, Lecturer and Chancellor were absent. All other officers were present

Reading of the Minutes: A motion was made to dispense with the reading of the minutes and approve them as published. The motion was seconded. There was no discussion and the motion was then passed.

Admissions:

2 Form 100's were presented. It was announced by the Grand Knight that we are at 100% of our goal but do not stop recruiting. The First candidate was Luciano Edward Tavares a member of Seton Parish. He was nominated by Harry Clyburn. The 2nd candidate was Daniel W. Sheppard also a member of Seton Parish. Daniel was nominated by Hector Raymond.

Grand Knights Report: The Grand Knight welcomed all the new and reoccurring faces and expressed his appreciation for the participation. The Council is growing but is still short on the insurance membership which would qualify us for the Star Council. The Grand Knight reminded everyone that our focus this year is not on Star Council but the continued growth of our council and our continued movement onward and upward which is doing very well.

The Grand Knight talked about his article in the newsletter and the large demand for Knights in need funds over the last couple of months, especially in December. The Knights in need fund is a constant fund of \$1500 that gets replenished. Because of the strong use of this fund we are asking individuals to help support this fund if you can.

Communications: Ed Loch – Offered his thanks for all the Knights do. He can hardly use his legs anymore. Bob Mc Nichol has helped a lot around his house. Bud Joos has helps drive him around. He needs a wheelchair for his upper level. He recently almost lost his insurance and with prayer found that there was a mistake and his insurance will continue. Purchase of a wheel chair will be looked into.

Chaplain's Report: No Report

Treasurers Report: All Bills have been paid at this time.

Financial Secretary Report: The Financial Secretary was not present so only part of the bills were available

Trustees Report: Brother Neil Ferguson reported that although we are not going to attempt to force our insurance goals, the insurance is the backbone of the Knights. The insurance is what helps fund a majority of our charitable works across the world. Please take the time to give the insurance programs a hard look. If you see a need please contact our insurance agent. Star Council is still a very prestigious award that demonstrates the strength of our council. Ed noted that you can be considered and insurance member without buying insurance. Annuities are also counted

toward our insurance goals and are a very good investment. The Grand Knight pointed out as a former agent that there are 2 ways almost anyone can take advantage of the insurance programs. One is the \$50.00/ year new member plan. This is a whole life policy and is available to all Knights not just new members. The Annuity program is the other. It has a \$300.00 minimum investment. They have never had a losing year. Our State Representative Fran Vendetta noted that the Star Council award is very important to him. He has been informed by our new general agent James Palance that in the state of Ohio 100-105 councils achieved the Columbian award but only 29 received the Star Council award. The rest were missing the insurance. He has pledged that if we get the membership he will see that the insurance is taken care of. So we can use him to help us make this goal.

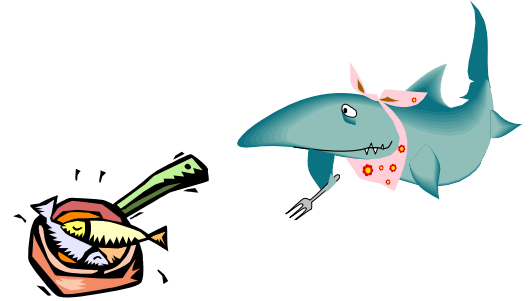
Welcome new Brother Knights ...

2007 March for Life

The March for Life in Washington, DC, on January 22, 2007, the 34th anniversary of *Roe v. Wade*, was another great event. The number of young people - high school and college students - was truly impressive. While it is hard to know exactly, my guess is that about 75% of the estimated 300 to 500 thousand marchers were students. To see that many young people getting excited about protecting life from conception until natural death gives one a lot of hope for the future. Again this year, Seton parish had a good representation. We sent 12 people, including 4 SPY students and our deacon, Hector Raymond. All of the SPY students expressed gratitude to our Knights council for its support.

The Mass for Life on the vigil of the March was again an awesome event. The Basilica normally holds about 6000 people, but at least 10,000 managed to squeeze (and I do mean squeeze!) in. The entrance procession had so many seminarians, deacons, priests, bishops and cardinals it took 25 minutes! I counted 31 bishops and 7 cardinals - there were so many priests I didn't even try to count them.

At the Ohio Right to Life Congressional Breakfast the morning of the March, we heard from Senator George Voinovich, Rep. Jean Schmidt, Rep. Jim Jordan, Dr. Jack Willke (the founder of Right to Life), and keynote speaker Ramesh Ponnuru, author and senior editor of National Review.

At both the Mass and the breakfast, a recurring theme was stem cell research. This isn't too surprising, as one of the new Congress' pro-choice leadership's goals is to federally fund embryonic stem cell research, which has already been vetoed by President Bush.

In a handout that accompanied his speech, Senator Voinovich had this to say about stem cell research:

"I am increasingly concerned that too many Americans are unaware that many of the most promising advances in medical research and treatment today are not attributed to embryonic stem cells. Rather, a great deal of the progress in the area of stem cell treatment and research is a result of the non-controversial, non-life ending use of adult and umbilical blood cord stem cells.

I would like to take this opportunity to provide an update on the progress scientists have made through the use of non-embryonic stem cells.

First, embryonic stem cells, as their name suggests, are derived from human embryos developed from eggs that have been fertilized in an in vitro fertilization clinic. Removing stem cells from these embryos destroys their potential life, making their use very controversial and something I cannot morally support.

On the other hand, adult stem cells are unspecialized cells found among specialized cells in mature tissues or organs. These cells can be gathered by scientists without any harm to the individual. Also included in this ethical category of stem cells are those from umbilical cord blood derived from placenta of a newborn baby. Once considered medical waste and discarded after birth, science has determined that cord blood has the potential to save thousands of lives.

To date, adult stem cells have been used to treat 70 diseases such as breast cancer, multiple sclerosis, rheumatoid arthritis, sickle cell anemia, spinal cord injuries and many others. For example, a group of physicians have been able to reconstruct the bladders of seven patients with advanced bladder disease with the individual patients' own progenitor cells. Another group of researchers, who discovered the benefit of adult stem cells in repairing the heart, have treated 10 patients with their own bone marrow adult stem cells along with bypass surgery with extremely positive results."

What Senator Voinovich didn't mention, but other speakers did, are the problems with embryonic stem cells: so far, NO embryonic stem cell treatment can even pass animal testing because of their nasty habit of creating cancerous tumors. There are NO human trials underway or even scheduled because of problems like this. Also, because adult stem cells come from the person being treated, there is no problem with rejection or infection like there is with embryonic stem cells.

Senator Voinovich closed with this concern:

"I am gravely concerned about the possible implications of spending taxpayer dollars on an issue like embryonic stem cell research that divides Americans on moral and ethical grounds. I believe it is my moral responsibility to direct the federal government's dollars toward the areas of research that have the greatest near-term potential to help the largest number of Americans.

In the current budget environment in which limited resources are available for federal medical research, I have concerns that increasing funding for embryonic stem cell research will take away opportunities for research in areas like adult and umbilical research - or even for research or treatment for specific diseases like cancer, juvenile diabetes or Parkinson's disease - that have proven their usefulness."

Finally, Senator Voinovich and the other speakers urged us to contact our representatives in Washington and let them know how we feel about stem cell research. **As a committed pro-Life Knight, make it a point to contact our representatives soon and urge them to support adult stem cell research ONLY.** Be sure and contact Senator Voinovich as well, to thank him for his support for a Culture of Life.
