Business Meeting Minutes

Business Meeting Minutes for Febuary 14, 2006

The Meeting Opened at 7:34 pm by the Grand Knight Lloyd Stauffer

Role Call:

Chancellor, Lecturer - absent, 2 year Trustee - excuse, all other Officers in attendance.

Reading of the Minutes: A motion was made to dispense with the reading of the minutes and approve them as published. The motion was seconded. There was no discussion and the motion was then passed.

<u>Admissions</u>: - We received 1 Form 100 for Ben S Pruitt. Ben is married and works for Nationwide Insurance and attends Seton Parish. We have had 3 new members brought in last month.

Grand Knights Report: - The Grand Knight announced that we have a new Insurance Field Agent Mike Berry and introduced him to us. Mike told us that he would be contacting all associate members in the next 90 days. He also let the Council know about 2 insurance programs that everyone might not be familiar with. The Annuities program which can be started with \$300.00, and the Long Term Care insurance.

The Grand Knight then notified the council of an expenditure issue that had occurred in Dec. The Council was notified of brother Knight in serious financial jeopardy with very little time to act. The Officers made a decision to spend significant funds over and above what they were legally authorized to spend. The Amount was slightly over \$XXXX. The reasons were all from the heart in an effort to assist our brother in need. To approve the funds correctly an emergency council meeting should have been called. This issue has been discussed at all levels including District and Supreme. This is also a contributing factor into why we have asked for contributions to the Knights in need fund. The Grand Knight opened the floor for questions and was asked why this was not brought up during the January meeting. The Grand Knight stated that at that time the Financial Secretary, who acts as Supreme Presentation, could not be present and it was required that he be present for the statement. As a result of this some financial changes are being made. The only area where the Grand Knight will approve funds without a vote in council will be for Knights in need and it will never be more the \$XXXX. All other requests will be required to go to vote in council before approval. This includes budgeted items.

<u>Communications</u>: - We received 3 letters from the Logsdon family who attended the Right to Life March, thanking us for assisting in paying for the trip.

<u>Chaplain's Report</u>: - Fr. Jim is recovering well and thanks all for their continuing prayers as he recovered from his surgery. Deacon Hector Raymond handed out copies of Lenten regulations for fasting and communion. There are some wonderful speakers coming in Lent. Deacon Hector Raymond reminded everyone that Ministry Training was next Saturday.

<u>Treasurers Report</u>: - Report of the Checking and Savings accounts were given.

Financial Secretary Report: - The Financial Secretary was not

present so only part of the bills were available.

Motions for Upcoming Financial obligations:

There was Motion to approve up to \$70.00 for 1st Saturday Snacks. This motion was seconded and will be voted on at the next Council meeting.

There was a Motion to approve up to \$1,200.00. The motion was seconded and the motion was passed.

A Motion was made to approve the spending of up to \$4000.00 for supplies for the fish fry'. The motion was seconded and passed.

A Motion was made for the approval of \$100 to support a Priest or Deacon on the Right to Life March trip. This will bring the total support for the trip to \$500. The motion was seconded and passed.

A Motion was made that we approve \$40/month for the Fist Saturday Mass for the remainder or the year. The motion was seconded.

A Motion was made to approve the expenditure of \$180 in postage for the remainder of the year. This motion was seconded

A Motion was made for the expenditure of up to \$400 for refreshments for the remainder of the year. The motion was seconded.

<u>Trustees Report</u>: - The Catholic Men's conference is coming up on March 10th. All Knights are encouraged to try to attend and support this wonderful conference that was at Seton Parish the last 2 years.

The Free Throw Contest was held here at Seton, but the results weren't available. The March Blitz is next month. We will need at least one new member to complete our new member obligation for the month.

Elections are coming up soon and the trustee will begin looking for those interested in serving as an officer in the coming year.

The Trustee reported that they are work on but a little behind on the semi-annual audit.

There was some discussion about the possibility of having the Grand Knight serve a two year term so they have time to learn the job. This was met with some discussion for and against including the amount of commitment needed for 2 years. It was eventually agreed that the subject needs more exploration.

4th Pancake breakfast: - 310 breakfasts were served. Income was \$1130. Expenses were \$220. All four total \$2850 profit. It was found that a brother Knight works for Bob Evans and has volunteered to sell us supplies at their cost for next year. SPY will be having a pancake breakfast on Feb. 25th and has asked for assistance from any Knight that can help.

Kroger Cares: - There were XXXX in charges last month and we received a check for XXXX. The total for the year last year was XXXX. Help is needed for 12:00 noon till 9:00 pm. The City has changed to ordinance on portable signs so we will have the sign up but we may be required to take it down.

Squires Report: - The Squires helped with the Free Throw competition both here and at Reynoldsburg. They had a retreat on the weekend of February 17th in Danville. They will have another in March which will include the State Volleyball tournament. At the fish fry the Squires will be selling pop at the fish fry' for \$0.75 a can.

Your Money or the Government's?

It is amazing the lengths our government will go to in order to control how you spend your money and to increase its control over your life! In the February issue of *National Right to Life News* is an article about efforts in the new Congress to prevent you from spending your own money on prescription drugs and other health care:

"Nine years after the pro-life movement won the ability of senior citizens to avoid rationing of lifesaving medical treatment, food, and fluids under Medicare, this right is under renewed attack by leaders in the new Congress.

At issue is the fundamental question of whether seniors will be prevented from *using their own money*, if they wish, to gain access to insurance that will not ration prescription drugs - or medical treatment.

A partial assault, already passed by the House and likely soon to come to a vote on the Senate floor, would limit the ability of older Americans to use their own funds to obtain innovative lifesaving drugs. A complete assault - to repeal the right entirely, as it applies to medical services as well as prescription drugs - has been promised by a key congressional leader and will likely be up fro a vote later this year.

In the words of NRLC Executive Director David N. O'Steen, Ph.D., "Government imposed rationing is a form of involuntary euthanasia. It is outrageous when, by law, the federal government prevents people from using their own money to save their own lives."

The economic reality is that in order to provide Medicare coverage for the baby boom generation as it retires without massive tax increases (which are highly improbable), government payments per beneficiary will not be able to keep up with medical inflation. If the finds available for health care for senior citizens from all sources are so limited, the only possible result will be rationing. Since senior citizens are required to participate in Medicare, this would amount to government imposed involuntary euthanasia.

Private fee-for-service Medicare plans created an escape valve. They represent an alternative to rationing that does not either break the budget or require new taxes. This alternative permits those eligible for Medicare to voluntarily supplement government payments for health insurance premiums with their own funds, if they wish, in order to obtain unrationed, unmanaged, private fee-for-service insurance.

However, on January 12, 2007, the U.S. House of Representatives passed H. R. 4, under which the federal government would fix an upper limit on what private Medicare plans could pay for each prescription drug.

Government price-fixing would effectively deny older Americans the choice of paying their own money to select Medicare prescription drug plan that cover more costly, more effective, innovative lifesaving drugs. President Bush has pledged a veto."

Even worse, other proposals are being considered that would eliminate private fee-for-service options altogether.

I call on all Knights of Columbus to take action now! Contact your Representative and both Senators with this basic message:

In order to protect senior citizens' lives, we must ensure their right to get un-rationed medical care and an un-rationed prescription drug benefit under Medicare. We must not prohibit older Americans from adding their own money, if they wish, to get un-rationed insurance.


