Come to DC With Us!

In 1973 in its Roe v. Wade decision, the Supreme Court of the United States legalized abortion through all nine months of pregnancy until the moment of birth, even allowing the termination of a baby that already partially born. In a companion decision, Doe v. Bolton, it expanded its decision so a baby may be aborted for any reason or no reason at all. In several rulings since, it has ruled that the decision is entirely the mother's and the father has NO say in deciding whether to keep the baby or abort it. As Knights and fathers, this should anger us to the point where we take action to end this travesty.

Since the Roe v. Wade decision, over 40 million babies have been aborted. And every year starting in 1974, hundreds of thousands of people have gathered on the anniversary of that horrible decision to let the Supreme Court and our elected representatives know how we feel about that decision and to urge them to change it. You have to give pro-lifers credit - we are persistent!

2008 is the 35th anniversary of this horrible decision, and again this year, people will gather from all over the U.S. to peacefully protest the loss of unborn and innocent lives and urge lawmakers to stop the travesty. For the last several years, representatives from the Seton Respect Life group, SPY students, and our own Deacon Hector have gone to Washington D.C. to join in this worthwhile endeavor. The Knights of Columbus sponsor the trip, which includes the bus trip to DC, the Mass for Life in the Basilica of the Immaculate Conception, overnight in a 5-star hotel in downtown DC, the Ohio Congressional Breakfast, and the March for Life itself. Last year 8 people from Seton went on this wonderful trip.

Again this year, the Knights will sponsor the bus trip and **I challenge each and every one of you to make the commitment to come with us.** It is an experience you will not regret and will remember for the rest of your life. Not only are we gathering for a great purpose, but we have a lot of fun doing it. I promise that the Mass for Life will be the most awesome you have ever attended and you will be forever impressed by the numbers and enthusiasm of the young people at the March.

We will leave early on Monday morning, January 21, and proceed directly to the Basilica of the Immaculate Conception for the Mass for Life, with a stop at Breezewood, Pa, for lunch. We usually get to the Basilica between 4 and 5 in the evening - early enough to find some seats. The Mass doesn't start until 8pm, but when 10,000 people show up for Mass and the church only holds 6,000, you need to get your seats early. Well over half the people at Mass will be young people - high school and college - from all over the US. This Mass is likely to be the most impressive you have ever attended. Last year the entrance procession took over 20 minutes because there were so many Cardinals, Bishops, priests, deacons, and seminarians present. The homily is usually given by a Cardinal, the USCCB secretary for Life activities.

After Mass, we go to our 5-star hotel in downtown DC and will often grab some pizza or something else for a late dinner. The next morning we head to the Ohio Congressional breakfast for a wonderful meal and great speeches by various representatives and usually Senator Voinovich and other pro-Life speakers. You cannot fail to come away from this breakfast without learning something new and being fired up for the pro-life movement.

We generally have a couple of hours before the March itself, so most of us will try to see some of the DC area, before proceeding to

the gathering place for the March. After many more great speeches, the approximately 500,000 people gathered there march up Constitution Ave. to the Supreme Court building. I promise you will be impressed by the number and enthusiasm of the young people there!

Please join us for this important, wonderful, and fun trip to DC!

Business Meeting Minutes October 10th, 2007

Meeting opened at: 7:35 by Grand Knight Jesse Garcia

Roll of Officers: DGK, Outer Guard - Excused; Trustees (3rd/1st year) - A

Reading of the Minutes: - A motion was made to approve the Minutes from the previous meeting as recorded this motion was seconded and passed.

Chaplain's Report: The Chaplain encouraged everyone to attend the living Rosary. He also asked for help getting the high school students involved in the Parish. At Mass we are re-emphasizing the penitential rite. We should respond the Kyrie Eleison with enthusiasm. The Chaplain read a story of thanksgiving prayers and asked everyone to share one thing they are thankful for.

Admissions: No Report. Sunday Oct. 14th is the Ministry Marketplace. We will have a booth for the October Blitz

Grand Knights: The Grand Knight started by happily announcing that the IRS has waived our fine for late submission of our Tax Form. He then complimented the 1st degree team for their spot on performance last month. At that 1st degree the team received their 1st degree certification cards. The Grand Knight then encouraged everyone to try to attend, especially the officers.

The Grand Knight then noted that the Knights wall was being completed. The plaques have been hung. The wall will be repainted and then the plaques will be replaced. A section is dedicated for the Council, Assembly 2900 and the Squires.

Church Director: The Church Director thanked Hector and Bill Sharon who handled the 1st Saturday Mass in October. Adoration is filled for the year and we are now working on next year. There was some discussion of the Knights 5th Sunday Mass. There were many present but some were disappointed. It was discussed that we should sit together next time to make ourselves more visible. In addition many people do not have Knights shirts.

Youth/Squires: Last month there was a leadership retreat in Danville. We had 1 councilor 3 squires and 1 state officer attend. Next weekend 10/13 is the fall retreat we will have ½ councilor ½ State Officer and 1 Squire attending. Next month Ed Chinook will speak about the respect life committee and the Squires will be making a donation to help support some of our parishioners going up to the march in DC. For the pancake breakfast they had 10 Squires, 4 councilors and only 2 Knights assisting. John Sambuco was especially helpful. The Squires made XXXX profit. It was disappointing to get so little help when the Squires requested it.

Unfinished Business:

By-Laws: - A copy of the By-Laws Resolutions was handed out and each was voted on the first was the 1st resolution - Council 11187 will conduct elections on the 1st business meeting in May This motion was opened for discussion. Then a vote was called and the motion was passed.

The 2nd resolution was to define the setting up of an admissions committee. This motion was handed out for review and the floor was opened for discussion. There was no discussion so the vote was called and the motion was passed.

The 3rd resolution allows for the calling of a secret vote is there is even a single dissenting vote for the admission of an applicant.

The 4th resolution defines our relief fund as \$500 and sets our maximum single distribution at \$250. It also allows us to restore the fund back up to the original \$500 when it gets to \$100 or below during the year by a vote of at least 3/5 of a valid quorum during a council meeting.

Actual Resolutions below

August 2007 11187

Resolution: (Reference Article I) When Officer elections are conducted

Council 11187 will conduct officer elections the first business meeting in May.

Resolution: (Reference Article V) Admissions Committee

By direction of the Grand Knight, the Membership Director shall appoint an Admission Committee of no fewer than three (3) members, one of which shall be the Membership Director or the Recruitment Chairman. The Recruitment Chairman shall refer the application to the Admission Committee and thereupon said Committee shall contact the applicant to schedule an informal meeting with the members of the Committee.

The Committee shall, at the discretion of the Grand Knight, conduct such meetings either

- a. on a regularly scheduled, monthly basis, or
- b. on an "ad hoc" basis as needed.

The purpose of such a meeting shall be twofold:

- a. to afford the applicant an opportunity to inquire as to the nature of the council's activities/organizational structure and receive information regarding any other matters pertinent to the Knights or the council; and
- b. to provide the Committee with an opportunity to inquire as to whether the applicant is a practical Catholic at least eighteen (18) years of age.

After completion of such a meeting, the following will take place:

- a. Should the Committee members withholding endorsement because the applicant has informed the Committee that said applicant is not a practical Catholic at least eighteen years of age, said applicant shall be deemed rejected and the membership form will not be forwarded to the general membership. A copy of the Form 100 shall be retained by the membership director.

b. Unless the application is rejected for the reason stated above, it shall be read by the Grand Knight at the next available business meeting, the council shall proceed forthwith to ballot for the admission of such applicant after said reading.

The recommendation of the Admission Committee shall be evidenced by the certificate of the Chairman of the Committee on a form to be prescribed by the Board of Directors.

Resolution: (Reference Article V) Balloting for Candidates

A voice vote for a candidate may proceed secret balloting. If approved the candidate will receive provisional approval. If after provisional approval any member notifies the GK in confidence concerning the unfitness of a candidate, the council will proceed to Article V for secret ballot at a regular business meeting before the candidate is approved for the induction ceremony.

Resolution: (Reference Article VII) Relief Fund

The sum of \$500.00 shall be paid from the General Fund to the Financial Secretary and shall be known as the Relief Fund. The Grand Knight, Financial Secretary and Treasurer shall constitute a Relief Committee. They shall investigate the case of any brother who is reported to be in distress or in need of relief and if in their judgment the case is one deserving of assistance, they shall have the power to draw from this Relief Fund such a reasonable sum of money to afford assistance as the circumstances of the case may require, providing the in no single case shall more than \$250.00 be paid out without reference to and approval by the Council. If the fund decreases to \$100 or less the Grand Knight may request that the fund be replenished to \$500. A supermajority vote by the council is necessary for approval.

Squires Resolution: The Following resolution was brought back to the council for discussion

Whereas the Knights of Columbus is a Catholic family fraternity, and

Whereas the Columbian Squires is a program sponsored by the Knights of Columbus to further the positive development of Catholic boys, and

Whereas Knights of Columbus Council 11187 would welcome the membership of any former member of Columbian Squire Circle 4891, and

Whereas both the Knights of Columbus and the Columbian Squires value continuing education and religious and social service.

Be it resolved that the first year membership dues and initiation fees for the Knights of Columbus Council 11187 shall be waived for any new member who: In addition the Knights of Columbus will reimburse up to \$50.00 for K of C insurance purchased. was enrolled in the Columbian Squires Circle 4891 upon his 18th birthday, and:

Within 6 months of his 18th birthday becomes a member of the Knights of Columbus Council 11187.

Be it also resolved that membership dues for the Knights of Columbus Council 11187 shall be waived for a period of up to three(3) additional years for any members who has met the above requirements and:

Is attending a college, university, or other institute of higher education and/or Active US Military Service, and;

Provides yearly proof of his continued involvement in church activities or social services, either in his parish or in his educational community.

Determination of said member's qualifications shall be determined by the Council Officers.

The motion was called to vote and passed.

Wives appreciation dinner: A motion was made last month and tabled to approve the expenditure of up to \$XXXX for the Wives appreciation dinner and the Fall Festival. The vote was called and the motion was passed.

Retention: We have processed all the intent to suspend that we have. There were 30/29 that we have sent to Supreme. We then have an additional 60 Days for Supreme to attempt to contact them and encourage them to renew their membership.

New Business:

Purchase of Quicken: A motion was made to approve the expenditure of XXXX for the updating of Quicken. The motion was seconded and approved.

Recorder Review minutes on income of pancake breakfasts: The Recorder was asked to research the donation of a percentage of our pancake breakfast funds donated to the Squires. The Squire noted that the motion was for the current year only and a new motion would have to be made to extend to proposed donation.

Motion to support the Coat Drive: A motion was made to approve the spending of up to XXXX to support the annual Coat Drive. The motion was seconded and passed.

E-Mail address: It was requested we have a master e-mail address. It was noted that this information is available out in the member's only part of the web site. Everyone should review the information and verify its accuracy. Please contact Mark Borys with any corrections.

Income Problem: The Treasure stated that we have an income flow problem we have spent XXXX more than we have brought in this year. We need to work on new sources of income. We are looking at renting a hall from the VFW as a possibility. Other sourced of income ideas would be welcomed.
