

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A Bad Decision ... in my opinion

Around 40 years ago, there was a significant change in the attitude of the Supreme Court of the United States. Until that time, the Court followed its constitutional mandate and merely determined if the laws brought before it were constitutional or not. But about 40 years ago, these 9 unelected men and women decided that they knew more than the legislature or the people of the United States and proceeded to make their own laws, thereby bypassing the checks and balances built into the constitution. Since then, they have invented all kinds of new constitutional "rights" that are not in the constitution or even implied. They have violated constitutional limitations with decisions that go way beyond what the founding fathers intended and stated in the constitution. Even though the constitution states that all rights not specifically granted to the Federal government by the constitution belong to the individual states, they expanded Federal government in ways never dreamed of by the founding fathers.

These decisions affect all aspects of our lives - they changed freedom of religion to freedom from religion, prohibited Christian and Jewish religious expression but not that of Muslim or cult-type "religions", restricted gun ownership in direct violation of the second amendment, have redefined eminent domain to threaten everyone's private property, have required individuals and organizations to not only accept but actually condone sexual perversion as normal behavior, and many others as well. The first amendment prohibits the establishment of a state religion, but the courts have used it to prohibit all expression of religion in public places such as schools, courthouses, city halls, parks, and playgrounds.

But perhaps the worst decision the Supreme Court ever made was that of Roe v. Wade and its companion decision Doe v. Bolton. On January 22, 1973, the Court said that women have a constitutional "right" to terminate a pregnancy. Doe v. Bolton expanded that "right" so the pregnancy may be terminated for any reason or no reason at all through all nine months of pregnancy. The constitution makes no mention of abortion, so in order to justify their decision the Court made up an entirely new "right", a right to privacy, which is also not mentioned or implied in the constitution. Even legal experts who support abortion admit that these were bad decisions that will someday be overturned.

Since the Roe v. Wade decision in 1973, over 40 million babies have been killed by abortion. And every year starting in 1974, hundreds of thousands of people have gathered on the anniversary of that horrible decision to let the Supreme Court and our elected representatives know how we feel about that decision and to urge them to change it. You have to give pro-lifers credit - they are persistent!

Again this year, people will gather from all over the U.S. to peacefully protest the horrific killing of unborn children and urge lawmakers to stop the travesty. For the last several years, representatives from the Seton Respect Life group, SPY students, and our own Deacon Hector have gone to Washington D.C. to join in this worthwhile endeavor. The Knights of Columbus sponsor the trip, which includes the bus trip to DC, the Mass for Life in the Basilica of the Immaculate Conception, overnight in a 5-star hotel in downtown DC, the Ohio Congressional Breakfast, and the March for Life itself. Last year 8 people from Seton went on this wonderful trip.

Again this year, the Knights will sponsor the bus trip **and I challenge each and every one of you to make the commitment to come with us.** It is an experience you will not regret and will remember for the rest of your life. Not only are we gathering for a great purpose, but we have a lot of fun doing it. I promise that the Mass for Life will be the most awesome you have ever attended and you will be forever impressed by the numbers and enthusiasm of the young people at the March.

The trip this year will be on January 21-22, 2008. As the 21st is Martin Luther King Day, many of you will only have to take one day off work to join us on the trip. The cost is reasonable - \$160 last year - and includes everything but your meals (the Ohio Congressional Breakfast is also included). I will let you know the cost for this year as soon as it has been determined, but should close to last year's cost. Contact me for more information.

Business Meeting Minutes

Business Meeting Minutes September 12, 2007

Meeting opened at: 7:31 by Grand Knight

Roll of Officers: Trustee 1 year - A. All other Officers present

Reading of the Minutes: - A motion was made to approve the Minutes from the previous meeting. This motion was seconded and passed.

Chaplain's Report: The Chaplain thanked all of the Knights for their help at the festival. He also reminded everyone that this month will be the first Knights 5th Sunday Mass and encouraged everyone to attend with their families.

Admissions: Norm Ragland, a new member was welcomed to the council, and Jerry Lowery transferred in from the Reynoldsburg Council. A second reading was made for Steven Riegel proposed by Jim Theising. It was noted that a 2nd reading was not needed. It was then suggested that the admissions committee should first OK the admission and the Council merely has to vote to accept the recommendation. It was agreed to form an admissions committee to meet with Mr. Riegel before the next 1st degree to resolve the issue and finalize the recommendation at a meeting before the 1st degree.

Grand Knights: The Grand Knight reminded everyone that council business is to be conducted here in this chamber, not in the gathering space.

The Grand Knight also reminded everyone not to commit us to any expenditure. While we are pretty good at helping those in need; there are proper channels that need to be followed:

Submit the request to the Officers: The officers will have a chance to review the issue and make our recommendation. Should this step be skipped, I will table the motion until the next officers meeting. Remember you can submit this via email and I will get it out to the officers.

Motion: Submit your motion to the council. If the expenditure is under \$500 we will have a discussion and vote, if over \$500 the motion will be tabled and published in the newsletter and then discussed at the next meeting and voted on.

Forms: Fill out the Request for Funds form, this form is used to track our payouts. It can be found on our website or Mark has (or will have) extra copies.

What we are trying to accomplish is, first a bit more control over the money going in and out, and second making sure that people are getting their money back in a timely manner.

I have updated the form on the website, it asks for more information from the chairs. For starters you will have report the number of Knights you have working and the hours worked ... this allows us to use this sheet for the annual survey.

The Grand Knight informed everyone of the thank poster from the SPY Kids for the donation to help attend the Catholic Youth Conference.

The Grand Knight noted that the officers meeting is an open forum for any one that wants to attend, where if we get a proper quorum, bills may be presented, voted on and then paid for. The paid bills would then be read at the following meeting; again the idea is to expedite the refund issue.

Communications:

We received a request from Bishop Campbell to support the National Youth Conference by sending in \$100 to help with the opening and closing ceremonies. We will not be doing this as we have already donated \$500.00 at the parish level. The Grand Knight will write up a letter informing him of our donation.

St Gabriel has requested a donation of \$200.00 we will talk about this later.

District meeting is moving from the 14 to 21st of October, anyone in the 4th degree may attend. It will be in Lancaster.

We received a thank you form from the Diocese for our Matching Funds Contribution, this money helps with the buying of materials needed to support our Diocese religious education programs.

Treasurers Report: All Bills paid at the end of August

Development Fund - XXXX with 2 checks yet to cash. We still have not received the bill for the magnets.

Bills: It was explained that matching funds is for Catholic education and the first \$25,000 is matched by the State, so by donating early we are more likely to get matching funds for the Columbus Diocese.

The Bills were turned over to the Trustees for approval.

Financial Secretaries Report: At the beginning of July 55 notices were sent out for late payments. As of today we are now at about 38. We anticipate collecting several more. We have also received letters informing us of members that no longer belong to the Parish. These letters are forwarded to Supreme to process a withdrawal to reduce our per capita tax. The Actual suspensions will occur on Nov. the 2nd. That is when the unpaid members will be subtracted from our rosters.

Trustees Report: The bills for this evening were approved.

Chancellors Report: No Report

Service Committees:

Membership: It was reported that we had a new member pizza party on Aug. 27th. Thanks were offered to all who attended. It was a little warm in the room, but everything went very well. We will do another in about 6 months. We will have a membership table at the ministry marketplace. This will be our recruiting activity for the October blitz. Fran was thanked for updating our Council flyers. Did not see any upcoming 2nd or 3rd degree' on the calendar. But one would occur on Oct 7th in Lancaster and on the 28th at OLPH. It was noted at the new member pizza party that none of them had received the council news letter. We should come up with a way to get their addresses or emails to keep these new members informed.

Bud Joos informed the council that he had spent 2 days updating all of the Church mailboxes and he suggested we give every new member form the last 2 years a newsletter in their box. Bud volunteered to follow through with this process.

It was suggested putting the membership information on the web site in the member's only section. This would allow members to view their information and update it if necessary. It was suggested save the current membership list as excel to make it easy to put on line.

Church Director: All of the adoration hours are filled through the 31st but we do need some for 2008. The hour is Mon 5-6 am. Youth/Squires: The Squires were contacted by the matching funds chairman and have already submitted \$100.00. They had not been asked to participate in the past. This weekend is a fall leadership retreat in Danville. 4 or 5 members will be attending. Pancake breakfast is being scheduled for September 30th. They are working with John to assist. Wayne Patterson has volunteered to but the sign put in advance.

Respect Life Committee: - On Oct 4th Pregnancy Decisions health care center is having a fundraising dinner. Seton Respect Life is sponsoring a table. If anyone would like to attend please let the chairman know and he will put in a reservation On October 28th we will have the 4th annual life chain on Main Street in downtown Pickerington. We will gather in Herman Hall after the 11:15 Mass and travel over there together. The SPY group will make some posters for us. Once there we will quietly pray for an hour. We would love to have as many people as possible. The Annual March for Life is on January 22. We will leave Reynoldsburg in the morning of the 21st and return late on the 22nd. We are hoping to get a number of SPY students. That Monday is Martin Luther King Day so many may not need to take an extra day off. We stop in Breeze wood for lunch then on the Basilica. The Mass there is unforgettable with an entrance procession taking over 20 minutes. We then stay in a 5 star hotel. In the morning we go to the Ohio congressional breakfast and meet various representatives from Ohio. Then we meet by the Smithsonian and march to the Supreme Court building. There is usually close to 500,000 people. See the committee director for more info Last years cost was \$160 for adults \$100 for students. The Director then requested \$400.00 to support the sponsoring of SPY students on the trip. The motion was seconded. Some discussion called out that we should evaluate where our money is going as a lot seems to be going to the youth and the Church and we need to support the community as well. There was some question about how much was donated last year. The vote was called and the motion was passed.

Kroger Cares Program: - The issues with our Employee Identification number continued. A request for a copy of our number was made to the IRS and we should receive the number in a few weeks. After that we will simply need to fax the information to Kroger to reactivate our account. All moneys collected will still be received by us. Pancake Breakfast: The Chairman made a motion to request \$1,000 for the upcoming season. There was some discussion

about the amount requested as we spent \$1,900 last year. The motion was raised to \$2,000 and seconded. The motion was called and passed

Wives Appreciation Dinner: No Report. A motion was made to approve expenditures for \$1,500. The motion was seconded and tabled. It will be published in next month's newsletter.

Unfinished Business:

By-Laws: We received a guideline from Supreme. In the next newsletter there will be copies of our resolutions. Our resolutions are:

This resolution defines our relief fund as \$500 and set our max at \$250 per distribution. It also allows us to restore the fund during the year by a vote of the council.

MOTION - By-Law Resolutions:

The following resolutions were submitted to the Council at the last business meeting, they are being published to be reviewed and at the October business meeting will be discussed and voted on.

Resolution: (Reference Article I) When Officer elections are conducted

Council 11187 will conduct officer elections the first business meeting in May.

Resolution: (Reference Article V) Admissions Committee

By direction of the Grand Knight the Membership Director shall appoint an Admission Committee of no fewer than three (3) members, one of which shall be the Membership Director or the Recruitment Chairman. Within five (5) days after the presentation of an application for membership in the council, the Recruitment Chairman shall refer the application to the Admission Committee and thereupon said Committee shall contact the applicant to schedule an informal meeting with the members of the Committee.

The Committee shall, at the discretion of the Grand Knight, conduct such meetings either

- (a) on a regularly scheduled, monthly basis, or
- (b) on an "ad hoc" basis as needed.

The purpose of such a meeting shall be twofold:

- (i) to afford the applicant an opportunity to inquire as to the nature of the council's activities/organizational structure and receive information regarding any other matters pertinent to the Knights or the council; and
- (ii) to provide the Committee with an opportunity to inquire as to whether the applicant is a practical catholic at least eighteen (18) years of age.

After completion of such a meeting, should the Committee members file a written report withholding endorsement because the applicant has informed the Committee that said applicant is not a practical Catholic at least eighteen years of age, said applicant shall be deemed rejected. Otherwise, the recommendation of the Admission Committee shall be evidenced by the certificate of the Chairman of the Committee on a form to be prescribed by the Board of Directors. In the event of the failure or neglect of the Admission Committee to make a report within five (5) days after meeting with an applicant, the Grand Knight shall forthwith present said application to the council for action.

Unless the application is rejected for the reason stated above, it shall be read by the Grand Knight at the first meeting following the time allowed for the report of the Admission Committee, and except when notice of applications shall be published as provided for in Section 110 of the Laws of the Order, the council shall proceed forthwith to ballot for the admission of such applicant after said reading.

Resolution: (Reference Article V) Balloting for Candidates

A voice vote for a candidate may proceed secret balloting. If approved the candidate will receive provisional approval. If after provisional approval any member notifies the GK in confidence concerning the unfitness of a candidate, the council will proceed to

Article V for secret ballot at a regular business meeting before the candidate is approved for the induction ceremony.

Resolution: (Reference Article VII) Relief Fund

The sum of \$500.00 shall be paid from the General Fund to the Financial Secretary and shall be known as the Relief Fund. The Grand Knight, Financial Secretary and Treasurer shall constitute a Relief Committee. They shall investigate the case of any brother who is reported to be in distress or in need of relief and if in their judgment the case is one deserving of assistance, they shall have the power to draw from this Relief Fund such a reasonable sum of money to afford assistance as the circumstances of the case may require, providing the in no single case shall more than \$250.00 be paid out without reference to and approval by the Council.

If the fund decreases to \$100 or less the Grand Knight may request that the fund be replenished to \$500. A supermajority vote by the council is necessary for approval.


