## Business Meeting Minutes

Prior to opening the meeting, the Council presented the Seton Preschool with a check for \$XXX for new mats. Donna and Karen thanked the Knights for their generous donation and provided cookies and fudge for us.

Meeting opened at: 7:33 pm

Roll of Officers: Chaplain, Recorder, Warden, 3 Year Trustee - Excused.

**Reading of the Minutes:** Edd Chinnock filled in as recorder in Mike's absence. Harry Clyburn moved the minutes be accepted as published. Frank Piper seconded and motion passed.

**Chaplain's Report:** No report.

**Report on Admissions:** No report.

**Communications:** None.

**Grand Knight's Report:** Wayne thanked everyone for supporting the spaghetti dinner for a brother Knight from New England. They raised \$10,000, which will greatly help with his medical expenses. He is suffering from Lou Gehrig's disease and is in Amsterdam for an experimental treatment.

Bob Mulholand passed away July 1. Thanks to the 4<sup>th</sup> degree Knights who stood guard and came to the funeral Mass. We need a nameplate for the plaque in front of Seton. Jerry Lowery will order it and will be delivery will be about 4 weeks. Plaques are also needed for Leon Quigley and Robert McDonald. Jerry will also order these.

Wayne read part of Fr. Jim's bulletin article about the loss of the Jesus statue we ordered and the loss of our money. Wayne thanked Bog Glavin and Jerry Lowery for their great work in restoring the present statue. It looks great! Bog and Jerry briefly described the process they are using to restore it.

The tour meeting will be July 19, 2009.

Mike Croyle has agreed to be publicity director for the Council. This is a new position designed to raise our visibility in the parish and community.

**Trustee's Report:** No report.

**Chancellor's Report:** Tim passed out prayer cards with a nice prayer for our priests.

**Advocate's Report:** No report.

**Report of Service Committees/Programs:**

**Membership:** No report, but Mark noted this position is still vacant.

**Program Director:** No report.

**Church Director:** In Ray's absence, Bog Glavan reported that the statue reconstruction is complete and refinishing is underway. He thought it would be nice if we could purchase a solar powered floodlight to illuminate the statue at night. Tim Bowie moved that up to \$100 be spent to purchase a floodlight.

Steve Malott seconded and the motion passed.

**Squires:** Steve reported that our Circle won three of the four major state awards at the State Convention: State Chief Squire of the Year, State Squire of the Year, Fr. Prior of the Year .

The Squires would like to help with the statue restoration, so Steve asked Bog for ideas. Bog and Jerry suggested that they help with the flowers and weeding and power wash the stone wall in front of the statue.

The Squires had a fun event when 14 of them attended a Clippers game.

They challenged the Knights to a kickball or softball game on August 26. The Knights accepted the challenge in softball and Steve will coach them.

The Squires again volunteered to help with festival clean up.

They would like to put on a pancake breakfast to raise funds in September. They want a date that will not interfere with Knights activities and asked for some help from the Knights.

They are again going to try to host a dodge ball tournament on January 22 and would like help from the Knights. Edd Chinnock pointed out that the March for Life trip will not return until early AM on the 23<sup>rd</sup>. Steve will see if another date is available.

**Respect Life:** Edd stated that if our Council is going to sponsor a bus to DC for the March for Life in January, it is time to reserve it. He moved that the Council agree to sponsor a bus with the same provisions as last year (at least 40 people paid in full by December 1, or by the date we must cancel the bus to get a full refund of our deposit.) Tim Bowie seconded the motion. When asked who would head up this project, Tim Bowie, and Edd Chinnock agreed to be co-chairs (with Mike Croyle as a consultant). In answer to a question, it was stated that the bus will not cost the Council as the travelers will pay the costs, but the money has to be run through the Council for bookkeeping and legal purposes. The motion passed.

**Blue Coat Dinner:** Ron reported that the dinner was a great success again this year, though attendance was down from previous years. He attributed this to the summer date and will move the date to April next year and try Saturday instead of Friday. Dick Peterson and John Letourneau did a great job with their beef and chicken entrees. Harry Clyburn expressed regret and sadness that so few Knights showed up for this great dinner. We should fill the hall to show our respect and gratitude for all these brave men and women do for us.

**Report of Standing Committee's:**

**Statue:** The company we were buying it from has filed for bankruptcy. We will make sure our refund claim is made to the proper courts, but we will likely receive only pennies on the dollar, if at all.

**Kroger Cares Program:** No report.

**Development Committee Magnet Sales:** No report.

**Unfinished Business:**

**Msgr Bill Maroon scholarship fund:** Wayne reported that many of the Knights received individual letters requesting donations. This is a good cause and each Knight is encouraged to consider his own donation. The motion was tabled until the next meeting.

**Treasurer's laptop computer:** Frank purchased the new computer and software and used it at the meeting.

**New Business:**

**St. Gabriel Radio donation:** Wayne stated that the Knights of Columbus Councils in the Columbus Diocese were asked to donate \$25,000 to help keep St. Gabriel (1580 am) running. He thought we could have a pasta dinner in September or October to raise money for this worthy cause. Ron Gesco agreed to chair the pasta dinner committee. Tim Bowie moved that we donate \$XXXX to St. Gabriel and use the pasta dinner to raise the funds, but if less than \$XXXX we make up the difference. Harry Clyburn seconded. Due to the amount, motion will be published and discussed at the next meeting.

**Knights participation in events:** Harry expressed his concern at how few Knights participate in various events. The Blue Coat dinner had so few Knights there two of our wives had to welcome our guests. This is unacceptable. He said with 250 Knights in our Council, we should send several buses to DC for the March for Life, not just one we barely fill. We need to find ways of improving Knights' participation in all of our events.

**Squires presentations:** Steve thanked Harry Clyburn for speaking at the Squires State convention and said he did a great job. He then presented Deacon Hector Raymond with a certificate of appreciation for outstanding service to the Squires. He also presented Frank Piper and Mike Croyle with certificates of appreciation for assistance and being counselors.

**Field Agents Report:** No report.

**District Deputy Report:** No report.

**4<sup>th</sup> Degree Report:** Jerry Lowery reported that the officers for the new year will be installed July 26 at the Cathedral. The next Exemplification will be October 24 in Marietta.

**Lecturer's report:** Hector talked about St. Gabriel radio and the wonderful resource it is. He will be speaking on a program at 10:00 am Friday 10 August). He suggested that individual Knights become sustaining members by donating \$20/month.

## Chancellor's Spot: Virtue

We don't talk about Virtue much these days, but we should. For many of us, it's a term that may be familiar, but perhaps not fully comprehended.

In his letter to the Philippians, St. Paul points us toward a virtuous life: *"My brothers, your thoughts should be wholly directed to all that is true, all that deserves respect, all that is honest, pure, admirable, decent, virtuous or worthy of praise."* (4:8)

By definition according to Wikipedia, **Virtue**: A virtue is a character trait or quality valued as being good. Personal virtues are characteristics valued as promoting individual and collective well-being and thus, good by definition. The opposite of virtue is vice.

As members of The Knights of Columbus, our core, our foundation is a virtuous life. We can acquire human virtues through our own effort under the guidance of reason. By deliberately choosing to do what is good and right, we strengthen our Human virtues; With God's grace, we derive more strength and can master our weaknesses, temptations and the evil forces that challenge us every day, so that we can live a moral life.

The Human and Theological Virtues surround the four Cardinal Virtues of Prudence, Justice, Fortitude and Temperance. St. Augustine sums it up beautifully, *"To live well is nothing other than to love God with all one's heart, with all one's soul and with all one's efforts; from this it comes about that love is kept whole and uncorrupted (through temperance). No misfortune can disturb it (and this is fortitude). It obeys only God (and this is justice), and is careful in discerning things, so as not to be surprised by deceit or trickery (and this is prudence).*

The Theological Virtues are Faith, Hope and Charity; they inform all the moral virtues and give life to them. The Theological Virtues allow us to participate in the divine nature and have a relationship with the Holy Trinity. According to The Catechism, *the moral life of Christians is sustained by the gifts of the Holy Spirit.*

The seven *gifts* of the Holy Spirit are wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord. They complete and perfect the virtues of those who receive them.

The *fruits* of the Spirit are perfections that the Holy Spirit forms in us as the first fruits of eternal glory. The tradition of the Church lists twelve of them: "charity, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, generosity, gentleness, faithfulness, modesty, self-control, chastity."

It is not easy for man, wounded by sin, to maintain moral balance. Christ's gift of salvation offers us the grace necessary to persevere in the pursuit of the virtues. Everyone should always ask for this grace of light and strength, frequent the sacraments, cooperate with the Holy Spirit, and follow his calls to love what is good and shun evil.

### **BIBLE OF THE POOR**

When our forefathers built their churches they adorned them with sacred imagery, paintings, or stained glass illustrating the mysteries of the lives of Jesus and Mary. It was like a Gospel open for everyone to read, easily understood by all and rightly called the Bible of the Poor.

This is just what the rosary of Mary has been to us for seven hundred years. A joy to our eyes and hearts in the contemplation, in so many images, of the chief episodes of the life and mission of Jesus and of Mary; of Jesus the Son of God, our Redeemer, of Mary the Mother of Jesus and our Mother too. It is a prayer that rises from our lips and our innermost hearts, begging for the divine gifts that may satisfy the needs of individuals and of the whole church.

What a great and mysterious thing is human life too, Christian life, a sequence and interwoven pattern of its own joys, sorrows and triumphs. Is this not so my brothers?

The altar that occupies the most sacred and a central place in our churches bears the missal and the chalice all that is contained in the Gospel narrative and perpetuated in the Eucharistic sacrifice.
