
Let's keep this momentum going, and have a great February!

#### Respect Life: March for Life

We had another great trip to the March for Life in Washington, D.C., thanks to this council and their support by sponsoring our own bus this year. Mike Croyle deserves a special mention for his great work in organizing the trip, even though he never attended the March prior to this year.

Six youth from Seton accompanied us on the trip, including two Squires. They all thank our Council for their support and the financial aid to help offset the cost of the trip. I asked one of them, Taylor Bowie, to write an article for the Catholic Times. She did such a great job, I decided to reprint her article here:

> March for Life 2009 By: Taylor Bowie

"It is a poverty to decide that a child must die so that you can live as you wish". This is one of many quotes that I read on signs and shirts this week in Washington D.C. This past Thursday, January 22, was the 36<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Supreme Court decision to legalize abortion throughout all nine months of pregnancy. Every year since 1973 thousands of people have crowded the streets of Washington to show what they believe, this has now been called the March for Life.

I am 15 years old; I attend St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish, and am a freshman at Pickerington North High School. This was my fourth trip to Washington for the March for Life. I find it amazing how many youth there are at the March. Most people at my school don't care about these issues, and if they do they keep it to themselves. A lot of teens care too much about their social status to voice their true opinion. My friends and I proudly wear our pro-life shirts, our church youth group shirts, and our cross necklaces to school to let everyone know that we do believe and we aren't embarrassed. That is the exact same thing I saw this week in Washington, teenagers who aren't embarrassed about their religion and their beliefs. Thousands of people my age standing up for what they believe is right, literally shouting it at the top of their lungs. The group that I went with this year decided to go to a youth mass at an arena in Washington before the March. There was an estimated 30 thousand people, youth, at this mass! It was an incredible mass and experience. On the night before the March there is a vigil for life at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception. This vigil is approximately three hours long. The procession into the church takes 30 minutes alone. This church is so crowded that there are people sitting on the floor, you can hardly move without stepping on someone. Seeing all the people at these masses and this March gives me hope that maybe someday our voice will be heard.

The fact is about four thousand babies are aborted each day. Since 1973 that is approximately 49,551,703 abortions! My generation is being killed by people who are trying to better their own lives. The next baby that is aborted could have been the doctor who finds the cure for cancer, the next Nobel Peace Prize winner, or simply a mother or father themselves, but now we will never know. Abortion is a tragedy in not only our country but throughout the world. We might not be able to change the world but I encourage you to do what you can to change our country, or Ohio, or your own town, or even someone's life by telling them how you feel about this controversial issue. Yes, you might come across someone who is pro-choice and you might not be able to change their mind, but at least you got someone thinking about it. Our goal is to overturn Roe vs. Wade, but in order to do that it needs to be done one person at a time, so talk to the people in your own life. Abortion is murder, that is the hard hitting fact, are you going to sit back and let the next generation, the future of our country, be destroyed by this, or are you going to stand up for what you know is right?

Thank you, Taylor, for writing such a great article!

One final thing: the misnamed "Freedom of Choice Act" (FOCA) will be considered by Congress soon. This act actually removes freedom of choice by forcing people opposed to abortion to pay for them and forcing doctors, nurses, and hospitals to perform abortions even if it is against their moral principles. If you didn't get a chance to sign postcards after Mass, please pick up a postcard strip, sign them, and send them to your representatives in Congress. We must oppose this disastrous act!
