Saluting our Veterans

November 11, 2009 is Veterans day. What is Veterans day?

“**Veterans Day** is an American holiday honoring military veterans. Both a federal holiday and a state holiday in all states, it's always celebrated on November 11th each year. It is also celebrated as Armistice Day or Remembrance Day in other parts of the world, falling on November 11, the anniversary of the signing of the Armistice that ended World War I. (Major hostilities of World War I were formally ended at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918 with the German signing of the Armistice.)”

In 1954 the Holiday was changed from Armistice Day to Veterans Day to honor American Veterans of all wars.

The difference between Veterans Day and Memorial Day

Memorial Day honors service members who died in service to their country or as a result of injuries incurred during battle. Deceased veterans are also remembered on Veterans Day but the day is set aside to thank and honor living veterans who served honorably in the military - in wartime or peacetime.

Also did you know that the holiday is commonly printed as *Veteran's Day* or *Veterans' Day* in calendars and advertisements. While these spellings are grammatically acceptable, the United States government has declared that the attributive (no apostrophe) rather than the possessive case is the official spelling.

We are privileged to have veterans as members of our council. The next time you see one of them, thank them for their service. Without them and the sacrifices they made, we would not live in the greatest country in the world.

Insurance Corner - November

When Did Zero Become Better Than Fifty?

As your field agent it is my responsibility to fill any needs you have in order to insure that you and your family are protected when disaster strikes. Our primary program is of course life insurance but the need for **Long Term Care** is at an all time high.

Here are some objections that I often hear, and how I answer those:

“It is just too expensive!”

Did you know that a 40 year old can get into the Knights of Columbus Long Term Care program starting at around \$5.60 a month? A 60 year old for around \$18 a month? A 70 year old for around \$46.00 a month!?!

“My family and/or spouse will take care of me!”

If you are a young family make sure you remember that your spouse will more than likely be forced to work in order to help pay for long- term care expenses and sustain your current way of living. This would leave one of the children to take care of you. PLEASE make sure your spouse and family are aware of your plan to depend on them during this time and what they may have to do for you!

“I will just sell my house or just go on Medicaid!”

Be aware of the housing market today and think of what it may be in the future. Medicaid is a State and Federal Government program that pays for certain health services and nursing home care for older people with low incomes and limited assets, according to www.medicare.gov. The look back period is now 5 years! Did you know that the average costs of a nursing facility is between \$30,000 and \$60,000 a year in the Columbus area?

“Medicare will take care of me for my long term care!”

Medicare is not Long Term Care! Medicare pays only for medically necessary skilled nursing facility or home health care. However, you must meet certain conditions for Medicare to pay for these types of care. The Knights of Columbus long-term care is to assist people with support services such as activities of daily living like dressing, bathing, and using the bathroom. Medicare doesn't pay for this type of care called "custodial care." Again this is according to www.medicare.gov.

Last and my all time favorite: “Why would I get \$50 a day when that won't cover everything? I have enough in my retirement and assets, I'd rather not spend money on something I may never use!”

*If you believe zero coverage is better than the minimum coverage of \$50 a day then all I can say is **something is better than nothing!***

Do not wait to ask questions about Long Term Care! Life insurance is there to protect us when we die. Long Term care is here to help you and your family while you are living and this need can hit us at ANY time. Young or old, it can happen at any time!

Respect Life: Get Involved

“All it takes for evil to triumph is for good men to do nothing.” I thought of this famous quote during our monthly Knights meeting last week after my Respect Life report. In my report I described the 40 Days for Life program and asked for support from the Knights. 40 Days for Life began as an activity of a Knights of Columbus college council at Texas A & M University in 2004. Within a couple of weeks it involved over 1000 people, leading to a 28% decline in abortions in that community. Since then, this program of prayer, fasting and silent witness has energized the pro-life movement across the nation with over 200 events this fall in 45 states, 5 Canadian provinces, and Denmark. I circulated sign-up sheets asking for some Knights to spend one hour praying outside an abortion clinic on Cleveland Ave. Not one single Knight signed up.

This got me thinking about our commitment to a Culture of Life. Our Council has been very supportive of pro-life issues while at the same time being very apathetic. For many years we have helped the SPY students afford the bus trip to DC for the March for Life. Last year we even sponsored the bus and are doing so again this year. In the past we have paid for Deacon Hector to go on the trip as well. Your response to the anti-FOCA postcard campaign was overwhelming and we get great support on the annual Pro-Life newspaper ad signature campaign. The Lenten collection of baby items for PDHC is one of our most successful endeavors. We fill that Pac’n’Play several times during Lent!

On the other hand, we have gotten little or no Knight’s participation in Life Chains, nursing home visits, abortion clinic praying, etc. In my newsletter articles I frequently ask you to contact your Congressional representatives to support pro-life initiatives and a culture of life. I have no way of knowing if any of you actually call or write those representatives, but I hope you do. **If you have never contacted them, you need to read the opening quote again.**

Our Knights Council is full of wonderful, committed men, but we always have to be on guard against apathy. Each one of us must think long and hard about our commitment to a Culture of Life and decide what we are going to do to make that Culture of Life a reality. Publicly showing your support for life issues at an abortion clinic or Life Chain is a good way to start. **Calling or visiting your Congressmen is critical - we cannot afford to wait for others to do it.**

The various health care bills currently being considered by Congress are another good way to get involved. In spite of the administration’s statements to the contrary, abortion WILL be paid for by tax dollars and will be REQUIRED to be covered in some fashion. Every single amendment to specifically prohibit federal funds from being used to cover abortion from any of these bills has not passed. The one “compromise” the White House offered not only allows for federal money to subsidize abortions in private plans and mandates federal funding for abortions in the public option, it also requires that at least one insurance plan cover abortion in every geographical region in the country. This is in spite of the fact that only 13% of Americans want the health care reform bill to use tax dollars to fund abortions.

Regardless of what you think of the overall bill and the need for health care reform, it is urgent that every Knight call or write ALL THREE of your representatives in Congress and ask them to include language in the final bill to support these

critical Respect Life issues.
