Treasurer's Report

Another fraternal year has arrived. The *State Program Manual* providing all councils guidance for programs has been updated and it is time again for our council to consider and approve a budget. While not the key factor determining our success as a council, the manner by which we allocate funds plays an important operational role. These funds support many of the activities that define our fraternal organization. The largest portion of our funds is generated by our dues followed by the fish fry events, pancake breakfasts, measure-up, gimme-five, Seton open dinner, pennies for heaven, pancake breakfast book sales commission, state bonanza ticket sales, football ticket sales, fall festival, donations from Santa pictures and interest income.

Over the years appropriate discussion has occurred concerning the amount and allocation of spending. The present consideration addresses many past concerns, allocates all funds equal to an amount generated during the past year and provides a greater opportunity for Program Chairmen to develop and administer their programs.

This year state program guidelines have elevated the *social concerns* elements in the community program to a separate program named "Respect for Life". This is now added to the council, church, community, membership, family, and youth programs. The budget under consideration allocates funds in the following manner: Administration 10%, Council 24%, Community 21%, Church 21%, Membership 6%, Youth 10%, Family 5% and Respect for Life 4%.

Elements and activities contained in the programs can be viewed in the *State Program Manual* available on the State web site. Additional elements specific to our Council were discussed during last month's officer and council meetings. Remember that presently about \$11.50 per member is disbursed due to various Supreme, State and Chapter assessments. For example, when examining the Council program budget the percentage allocation contains expenses for the state convention and mandatory advertising assessments.

There will be open discussion with opportunity for modification before the vote at the July meeting. If you desire modifications please attend and present your proposals. It is your council.

From the `Days of Devotion by Pope John XXIII

This is the fourth of the series about the prayer the `Our Father'

“As we forgive them”

This cry for pity and mercy which Christ's blood still implores with “loud cries and tears.” (Hebrews 5.7) corresponds the same divine Redeemer's appeal for mutual forgiveness between brothers and for true triumph – not illusory, deceitful or distorted – the true triumph of forgiveness and peace.

“Beloved” said the evangelist St. John, when he was ninety years of age, but still young in innocence and faith. John, the confidant of Jesus and Mary, “let us love one another” (1 John 4.7); let us love in all sincerity. Then we shall make peace.

Every endeavor to make our peace between one man and another, or one nation or another, is worthy of our heartfelt admiration. Every sincere and each movement towards peace, from what every quarter it may come, provided that it conceal no deceit and be inspired by pure justice and universal love, any such movement, we repeat, is worthy of our trust and respect.

All is forgiven to those who know how to forgive and are willing to do so. And everything becomes ennobled to the man who has kept, or found again, a pure and innocent soul, and expresses it in fairness, justice and brotherliness, true Christian brotherliness.
