Business Meeting Minutes - January 13, 2010

Meeting opened at: 7:40pm with prayer and POA.

Roll of Officers: Chaplain, Lecturer, 1st yr Trustee, all excused.

Reading of the Minutes: Ed Chinnock stated that there should be a correction from last month's minutes. The bus committee not Ed Chinnock cancelled the Right to Life bus. The changes were made, and the minutes were motioned to be accepted by Ed Chinnock, seconded by George Schneider. Minutes approved with changes.

Chaplain's Report: No Report

Grand Knight's Report: We received a thank you card from Ruth Whitlatch, for the mass card for her husband, Harry Whitlatch, who passed away.

At the Chapter meeting they discussed supporting the Care Line Women's Care Centers. They set up programs to help women choose life over abortion, and have locations set up right next to abortion clinics. They will be buying 2 houses in Columbus, and they want the Knights to raise \$ 15,000 for ultrasound machines. Studies show that if the mothers see an ultrasound of their baby, they are 94% more likely to keep the baby. The Chapter is starting a March Madness ticket sale to raise money for this cause. Each one is \$ 10.00 each, and we need to start selling them immediately. Care Line is Catholic oriented, and Bishop endorsed.

2010 is a National salute to hospitalized Veterans. Send out Valentines to the Vets. See Wayne for information.

Frank Piper was awarded the VIP club award for recruiting 5 new members so far this year.

Treasurer Report: Frank Piper read the numbers for the month.

Financial Secretary Report: Reading of Receipts and Bills by Mark Borys.

Chancellor's Report: Annual Men's Conference is coming up, March 6th 8am-2pm. Tim handed out pamphlets at the meeting. Please get the message out! There will be a possible car pool meeting at the church at 6:30-6:45am. Tim will get it set up. There will be items for sale at the event. Please bring cash, not all vendors can take credit or debit cards.

Advocate Report: No Report

Report of Service Committees/Programs:

Membership Chair: Jim Doty stated we have 4 members went through 1st degree. Mr. Ritter has not been done due to scheduling conflicts. Will get him through soon. March Blitz is coming up, so everyone get ready!!!! Cancelled the meeting on the 24th. Wayne stated that we were falling behind in insurance quota, so he called Matt our insurance agent and Matt is having an open house in March. This will be for new members. He is providing information on what the Knights can do for new members' insurance needs. No selling, just information and helping with new member recruitment. Brother Harry Clyburn wanted clarification on just what was going to be provided, since there are many insurance providers in the parish, and he wanted us to be mindful of that fact. Wayne stated it is a Knights membership

drive only, and that we can promote it in church news media with Father Jim's permission.

Respect Life: Ed Chinnock stated the Right to Life Committee had to cancel the bus to D.C. and it cost us only \$XXX for the deposit. Wives' Dinner: Wayne stated that we only have 2 responses so far. February 20th is the date, with it starting at 6:30pm. We serve the wives first then eat. Please get your info to Wayne ASAP.

Report of Standing Committee's:

Fish Fry Committee: Ed Tavares stated that we need volunteers to help set up, clean up, and serve. There will be sign up sheets at the first one coming up. 5 fish fries this year. Charitable contributions are getting set up. The second one will go to Catholic Relief Fund for Haiti. St. Gabriel's radio will broadcast dates and time for free. Flyer will be in the Bulletin. Notify all the retirement homes in the area that we start @ 5:30 for them. Brother Tom brought up if we should be giving meals for free for the fire department and police station. We have been always doing this, and there will be no change on this position since we are making a profit every year even with the free meals. Wayne stated that if the chairs want to change it, they need to discuss it and bring it to the council for a vote. We are leaving it the same at this time.

FELLOWSHIP

Brothers,

I am the local Captain for the Seton Parish Men's Fellowship, which is loosely guided by Diocesan Catholic Men's Ministry.

The purpose of the fellowship meeting is to discover the meaning hidden in the pattern of daily existence - to discern what God is telling us in the seemingly casual encounter with family members, co-workers and neighbors. The late Great John Paul II told us to look for the Truth about Man in the way we experience life. This in no way diminishes the importance of Scripture or the primary role of the Church in revealing God's goodness. But JP II points out that modern man is not paying attention to those sources of Revelation. He says that modern man is paying attention only to himself and the emotions he feels as he seemingly bounces off one unconnected incident after another. We can supplement and reinforce our belief in the Transcendent by inquiring into and studying the unfolding events of our lives. **We believe that fellowship is the unique setting in which the Catholic man can see more fully the presence of God through story telling.**

Fellowship Meetings

"The Sharing is the teaching and the Teaching is the Sharing" derives from that characteristic of the group meetings.

The meetings are not prayer/petition sessions, although they have some of that. They are not charismatic gatherings, although praising is incorporated. They are not instructional periods in Church teaching, although it is likely that the sharing will be instructional. They are not group therapy sessions, although that component exists in the exchange of experiences. They are not bible study discussions, although Scripture is a key element.

That last sentence caught my attention. When one participates in Scripture Studies, the hour goes by so quickly that there isn't much time for anything else. The Word of God is so rich, we always end our session wishing we had more time.

At Seton, we have several different groups and times to meet everyone's demanding schedules, our goal is to get 3 more groups started this Spring - isn't it time for you to give yourself, your family and GOD more time?

Respect Life: Fighting for Claire

While waiting for the March for Life to begin on January 22, we struck up a conversation with a group of young nuns also waiting for the March to begin. We asked them what order they belong to and where they were from and that opened a whole discussion about these amazing women. They are members of Sisters of Life, an order founded in 1991 for the protection and enhancement of the sacredness of every human life. They take the traditional vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience but also take a fourth vow to protect and enhance the sanctity of life. This group was from the Bronx in New York City, where they operate centers to help pregnant women avoid abortion. They come from all over the US and Canada, including one nun we met from New Zealand!

The peace and joy in their faces as they discussed their order, mission, and the March for Life gave us hope that with love like this we will be able to return to a Culture of Life. One of the nuns we spoke with gave us a magazine published by their order - "printed through the generosity of the Knights of Columbus." Hooray for our Order! In this magazine was a story I would like to share with you:

Fighting for Claire

Mimi and Tito, long time friends and co-workers of the Sisters of Life went through every parent's worst nightmare when they went to the hospital for a routine 18 week ultrasound. Mimi "knew the minute they put the machine up to my stomach, I could see in their eyes, something was wrong." It seemed that the baby had encephalocele - a condition where a portion of the brain is outside the skull. The doctors provided pictures of children with severe abnormalities, informed them that they had a few weeks to decide what to do, and set up a genetics counseling session.

As they undertook the whirlwind of doctors visits, first to a local specialist and then to high risk pregnancy specialists in Manhattan and onto a nationally recognized genetics specialist, Mimi and Tito began to recognize that the more specialized and acclaimed the doctors were, the greater was the pressure to "terminate." One perinatologist at their local hospital, who was supportive after the couple stated their conviction to give life to their child, pulled them aside and described how, today, doctors have to be so careful with the words they choose with expectant parents, because the wrong wording to describe an abnormality as minor as cleft palate or a club foot can mean the difference between life and death for the child. And Mimi and Tito came to experience first hand the inner anguish that accompanies poor word choice.

The diagnosis of encephalocele was confirmed, and a fear they heard over and over again was that, because the skull was open, "the brain will be spilling out of the head." Throughout the pregnancy, doctors couldn't find the baby's cerebellum, the section of the brain which controls fine motor skills. Up to nine doctors and technicians could not find the cerebellum. But the adverse diagnosis was not enough. The solution? Abortion.

Sitting in the office of the genetics specialist, listening as he spoke soothing words that were all wrong to her, Mimi realized with a sinking feeling that she was in the "epicenter of the culture of death." "I had heard that phrase before, but

I had never experienced what it felt like."

As the medical saga proceeded, Mimi found herself going to Mass everyday, receiving the Eucharist and begging the Lord to touch her child and heal her with a miracle. While Mimi prayed with fervor and great faith, Tito prepared for whatever the Lord would allow. They surrounded themselves with friends and family who shared their conviction that their baby was a precious gift from God regardless of her medical condition, and who prayed for Mimi and Tito's strength and consolation throughout the ordeal.

And then the time drew near for Mimi to deliver the baby. A C-section was planned at the specialized Manhattan Hospital, but God had other plans. Mimi went into early labor and was rushed to her local hospital, where, amidst the fear and stress of the unknowns contained in high-risk pregnancies, she delivered by C-section a healthy baby girl, to everyone's amazement. Every newborn is given an APGAR test, which measures the physical health, reflexes, etc., of the baby on a scale of one through ten. Little Claire Marie, the "hopeless" case, scored a 9.9!

There was, at the base of Claire's head, a small sack that was surgically removed two months after her birth. Whether Claire's story is a miracle worked by God in the womb of her mother or whether the multitude of specialists simply got confused by the sight of the small sack and offered a severe misdiagnosis, we may never know. But Mimi and Tito know that they chose the good in the face of trial - loving and accepting their child regardless of any medical condition - and that will have eternal rewards.

One final note: Over 90% of babies who test positive for Down's Syndrome are aborted, but no one knows how many would actually have Down's.

From the `Days of Devotion by Pope John XXIII

In the General Audience of 25 October, 1959 Pope John spoke of the great prayer; "Our Father." This is the second of the series about the prayer the `Our Father'

THY KINGDOM COME

When we speak of the kingdom of God we must not confuse it with political constructions based on human power, such as were frequently found in past ages and still appear here and there today, expressions of human and material dominations.

We pray for the kingdom shall come (cf. Matt 6.10) in the sense in which Christ conceived it, and as the liturgy sings of it in one of the church's finest outpourings of her official prayer; "the kingdom of truth and light," a "kingdom of holiness and grace", a "kingdom of justice, love, and peace." (Preface, Feast of Christ the King.)

These beloved and mysterious expressions which make clear the choice that is set before all individuals and social communities, families, nations and the whole world.

So we are either to walk with Christ, every one of us bearing his cross, light or burdensome as it may be, or to go on without him, lost in uncertainty, danger and disorder, towards universal ruin.
