Saluting our Veterans

November 11, 2010 is Veterans day. What is Veterans day?

"**Veterans Day** is an American holiday honoring military veterans. Both a federal holiday and a state holiday in all states, it's always celebrated on November 11th each year. It is also celebrated as Armistice Day or Remembrance Day in other parts of the world, falling on November 11, the anniversary of the signing of the Armistice that ended World War I. (Major hostilities of World War I were formally ended at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918 with the German signing of the Armistice.)"

In 1954 the Holiday was changed from Armistice Day to Veterans Day to honor American Veterans of all wars.

**The difference between Veterans Day and Memorial Day**

Memorial Day honors service members who died in service to their country or as a result of injuries incurred during battle. Deceased veterans are also remembered on Veterans Day but the day is set aside to thank and honor living veterans who served honorably in the military - in wartime or peacetime.

Also did you know that the holiday is commonly printed as *Veteran's Day* or *Veterans' Day* in calendars and advertisements. While these spellings are grammatically acceptable, the United States government has declared that the attributive (no apostrophe) rather than the possessive case is the official spelling.

We are privileged to have veterans as members of our council. The next time you see one of them, thank them for their service. Without them and the sacrifices they made, we would not live in the greatest country in the world.

Meeting opened at: 7:50 pm with prayer and POA.

**Roll of Officers:** Chaplain, Chancellor, Outer Guard, 2<sup>nd</sup> Year Trustee, 1<sup>st</sup> Year Trustee all excused. District Deputy was present at the meeting.

**Reading of the Minutes:** Edd Chinnock asked that several corrections be made to the Respect Life section of last months minutes. The corrections were made to the minutes, and Wayne Patterson made a motion to accept the amended minutes. Edd Chinnock seconded the motion, and the vote was made in favor of the adjusted minutes.

**Grand Knight's Report:** Harry Clyburn

Bill Sharon is stepping down as the Adoration director. Paul Thornborn is concerned that there are Knights signing up and not going to the scheduled time. There were discussions on moving the time slot from 5am to another open slot. There might be possible Friday night openings. Harry is going to send a letter to the membership about this issue.

Jesse is running the Email address updates. The mailer that was sent out requesting Email information was not successful. Harry suggested we mail out the newsletter so everyone can read it. From the `Days of Devotion by Pope John XXIII'

This is the month that we remember our fallen knights. This is writing by Pope John XXIII

**"All Souls Day"**

The devotions of Holy Church which flower around the altar of the Blessed Sacrament and the altars of the Virgin and the saints are all beautiful and precious. But this devotion to the memory of our dead "who have gone before us with the sign of faith is particularly worthy." It is above all a meditation on eternal truths enabling us to perceive what it is that passes away and what is destined to survive.

Today we have come to pay our respects to the memory of the dead, and a tribute of prayers to the Lord for their souls, in the hope that divine mercy may finally receive them into heaven. But the memory of those who have gone before us, to whom were linked by bonds of fidelity and gratitude must also accompany us in all acts of our daily life.

For this memorial that they deserve; this redounds to their honour; this is the spirit of Christian prayer for the dead, which is inseparable from Christian life and practice.

While the melancholy but stirring Liturgy of the Dead rises in the air with the chant "Deliver me O Lord!, we are as it were invited to raise our eyes from their graves and look elsewhere for those who were so dear to us; parents will seek their children, children their parents, the bridegroom his bride and his wife her husband - and all those who have benefited from the ministry of a soul consecrated to God will recall the image of him or her who was a spiritual father or mother to them."

## Respect Life: March for Life

**Join our own Deacon Hector on a very special trip to Washington DC this January!** Our council is again sponsoring a bus to take people to the March for Life in Washington, D.C., on January 23-24. Until you have seen it for yourself, you cannot appreciate the enthusiasm and dedication of the many people who attend this March, especially the young people. You also have to see hundreds of thousands of people gathered together to believe it. It will make you wonder how so many of our representatives can continue to vote pro-abortion. **This is the year YOU need to make this trip!**

This is a great trip and we were able to keep the cost down to \$150 per person (based on two per room) which includes breakfast at the hotel. We will leave Seton about 7:00am Sunday morning and head directly to the Basilica of the Immaculate Conception for the Mass for Life with a stop for lunch along the way. **If we did nothing else, this Mass would make the entire trip worthwhile.** The entrance procession has so many Cardinals, Bishops, priests, deacons, and seminarians it takes 30 minutes! Great pro-Life homilies and talks from Cardinals and Bishops highlight the Mass. And seeing the vast numbers of young people there celebrating with us truly gives us hope for the future.

After Mass we re-board the bus and go to a really nice hotel in the downtown area. After our breakfast at the hotel (included in the price), we will go to the Youth Rally and Mass. **This event is so popular we couldn't get tickets last year, but this year they are having two rallies to accommodate the overflow.** The Verizon Center holds about 20,000 young people and another 10,000 will be at the DC Armory. Think about that: over 30,000 young people will be celebrating Life with a Rally and Mass, and both venues will likely be so full they still have to turn people away! After Mass, we will have our own mini-March from the Verizon Center to the Mall for the actual March for Life.

Around noon the March for Life rally will begin on the Mall. After many inspiring speeches, the March itself starts around 2:00 and we march to the Supreme Court building to show the justices and our elected representatives our opposition to abortion. **The enthusiasm of the huge numbers of young people gathered has to be seen to be believed!** After the march we get back on the bus for our trip home, with a stop for dinner about halfway, and arrive back at Seton after midnight.

This is a wonderful trip and every Knight should make it at some point. **I am asking each and every Knight to prayerfully consider making the trip THIS YEAR.** We need to fill the bus by December 15 to avoid having to cancel the trip like last year. We really need Knights, their ladies, and kids to help fill the bus, so if you can join us, please sign up as soon as possible (note: the price goes down for more than two to a room, so families get a break).

## Insurance Corner

The laws and rules of our Order, as well as state (provincial) laws, specify that the Knights of Columbus may accept insurance applications from members only. As a member, you may apply for insurance on yourself, your wife and your minor children.

The Order's Board of Directors has taken action, though, to assure that a Knight's widow maintains the right to purchase additional insurance for a limited time. This can be of great benefit and comfort to those we leave behind.

This "right to apply" is available only to the widows of insured members. If a member has not availed himself of our highly rated life insurance program, or purchased an annuity or long-term care policy, this benefit is not available to his widow.

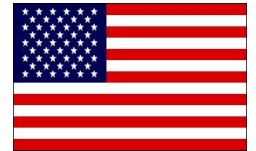
But if the member was an insured member, his widow has the right to apply for additional insurance on her life and on the life of the member's minor children. This right must be exercised within one year following the Order's receipt of proof of the insured's death.

Know two things. First, I'll assist your widow and children in any way possible if you should die, both with your Knights of Columbus insurance and any other life insurance you may have. Second, I'll provide them my best professional advice and service, to assure that they have adequate insurance protection.

I have no greater responsibility.
