Respect Life: An Abortion Worker's Story

Every week in Franklin County 100 babies are lost to abortion in four facilities. That is 5200 lives intentionally eliminated each year in Franklin County alone. Ruth Yorston, the executive director of Greater Columbus Right to Life shared that statistic with us at a meeting at our home in August. Ruth used to work in an abortion clinic so we invited her to share her conversion story with the Seton Respect Life group and other guests.

Ruth told us she came from a very pro-choice family - her father was an atheist and her mother was a nurse involved in cancer research. She was offered a job at Yale University, but wound up working at an abortion clinic in Ft. Wayne, Indiana in a belief that she was helping women. Ruth said she rarely went to church, firmly believed in the women's liberation movement and supported freedom of "choice". When she was 21 she needed a job to help pay for college, so she went to work at her mother's abortion clinic as a receptionist.

She never told anyone where she worked while she was employed there, which looking back, suggests to her that even then she was uncomfortable with abortion and somehow felt it was wrong. She always stayed in the reception area and never ventured downstairs to where the abortions were performed. Operation Rescue was going on at that time and she said they lived in fear of what these "radical pro-lifers" would do. Operation Rescue staged peaceful sit-ins and opposed violence against abortion clinics, doctors, and workers, but the clinic workers didn't believe it. They were afraid to walk past the protesters so the clinic provided escorts to walk them up the sidewalk to the clinic.

Around this time she began attending a pro-life evangelical church, but the pastor never gave a pro-life sermon so she never realized what the pro-life message was. Ruth feels strongly that pastors must speak out from the pulpit to educate their congregations about the sanctity of life. She switched to a Bible college because she had found Jesus and wanted to study the Bible and His words more thoroughly. She never mentioned on her application or told anyone at the college that she worked at an abortion clinic for fear they would kick her out. Around this time she began dating a youth minister from a Church of God, but did not tell him about her job either. When they got serious about each other, she finally decided to tell him. She said he handled it calmly, didn't yell or freak out, but later decided not to date her anymore. While praying about it, he felt that Jesus wanted him to give her another chance, so he gave her a book about fetal development that described how from the moment of conception the embryo is a unique human being with its own DNA.

Ruth said this really struck her and she realized what abortion really was and how harmful it is. She quit the abortion clinic within the week. She said the hardest part was telling her mother, who is still pro-choice. She began studying about pro-life issues and decided she couldn't remain quiet, so became a pro-life advocate.

Ruth's message was spirit filled and left us with the challenge to do all we can to promote a change of heart and a firm commitment to a culture of life. The Greater Columbus Right to Life provides Pro-Life resources, education, training, support, speakers, and legislative lobbying in Columbus and the surrounding area. It is an organization worthy of our support.

One upcoming event that might interest all of you is their "Tailgate for Life" fundraiser on Sunday, September 26, at Grove City Church of the Nazarene. The guest speaker is Rebecca Kiessling, who was conceived in rape and almost aborted. She is now a high profile pro-life family attorney and speaker.
