Business Meeting Minutes - December 8, 2010

Reading of Minutes: These were motioned and seconded as approved as listed by two, awesome souls. Minutes were unanimously approved as written ... causing deep sighs of thankfulness to erupt from the acting recorder.

Chaplain's Report: Deacon Hector gave a Chaplain's Report on "Being a Good Father and the 10 Things You should do to be one". A main one is to "get caught praying". Tim Bowie mentioned what an affect he believes that has had on his family life.

The Catholic Men's Conference is scheduled for Saturday, March 5th. Please make your registrations online as soon as possible. Edd Chinnock motioned for the Council to spend XXX for the Conference. Stephen Malott seconded the motion. This will be voted on at the February meeting.

Brother Gene Ebert discussed the logic of the offering as being good for membership as well as helping any family in need and desiring a Catholic education for their children. Brother Gene mentioned the item was already scheduled for publication in that week's bulletin. More healthy discussion followed. Gene motioned that we open the scholarship to all Seton youth. Stephen Malott seconded. Final discussion followed and the motion as voted on and failed. Discussion was finalized as how to handle any scholarships coming in due to the early publication. Respect Life: March for Life Student Comments

As many of you know, our council sponsored a bus to take people to the March for Life in Washington, D.C., on January 23-24. We were able to join forces with St. Matthew in Gahanna, the St. Pius X youth group, and a few people from other parishes to fill the bus. This included Deacon Hector, 5 Knights from our Council, Fr. Streitenberger from St. Matthew, and about 5 Knights from other Councils. It was a great trip and all who went were inspired to continue to promote a culture of life everywhere.

Between the Seton SPY program and the St. Pius youth group, we had 15 students with us, the most we have ever taken. All the students asked me to express their thanks to the Knights for their support in sponsoring the bus trip, especially the SPY students whose cost was offset by our Council's generous donation. On the trip home, I asked them to write a paragraph about their feelings about the March. I intended to combine them to write this article, but their comments were so good I had to include them all.

David Bryant, 16, St. Pius X: I didn't know what to expect from the March. I knew I was Pro-Life, but didn't feel like there was much I could do to stop abortion. The priest's homily at the Youth Mass at the Verizon Center changed my attitude. He said "Young people - it will not take a miracle to change our culture (of death). It will take a thousand. But that's OK - we were created to do miracles!" I guess the main thing here was hope.

Emily Fogus, 15, Seton: This was my second year attending the March for Life. I loved seeing how many people truly care and recognize how important this issue is. My favorite part of the trip was the Mass for Life at the Verizon Center before the March. I experienced such an overwhelming feeling seeing all the people there praising and praying to our Lord Jesus Christ. When one of the speakers said "we are not the light to a world of darkness but a reflection of the light of Christ to the world" it really made me realize that everything, even concerning this issue, is possible through Christ.

Katie Rini, 17, Seton: I received the gift of going to the March for Life for Christmas this year. I was devastated when the bus was full. A few days before, a spot opened up! This was easily one of the best experiences of my life. Sometimes I would just stand and stare in awe at the masses of people all in D.C. for the same purpose. While we were waiting for the March to start I saw how many people were there to try and put a stop to abortion. It really hit me how strongly all those people thought about abortion. I thought about all my beliefs and now after the March for Life I have different thoughts about it. I am pro-life and that's never going to change. I believe we can put a stop to abortion. I can't wait until the March for Life in 2012.

Maya Cherry, 13, Seton: This is my first year going of the March for Life. The most extraordinary thing getting to see was how so many people from all over the country gathered in Washington D.C. for one cause. It was amazing that we could all

A NOTE FROM GOD

Why was this on my floor? How did it get here? Why is it so small? Why at this time in my life am I reading this now? I believe it is God sending me a note, and it is time that I listen.
