## Business Meeting Minutes - December 8, 2010

Meeting opened at: 8:10 pm with prayer and POA.

Roll of Officers: Chaplin, 3<sup>rd</sup> year Trustee, 1<sup>st</sup> year Trustee, and Outer Guard all excused.

Reading of the Minutes: Frank Piper motioned for the previous minutes to be accepted as printed, and Tim Bowie seconded the motion. Minutes were approved as written.

### **Chaplain's Report:** N/R

**Admissions:** Mike Croyle stated we gained 3 more members at the last 1<sup>st</sup> Degree, and that the Degree team did a terrific job. We have brought in 5 new members so far this year and need 12 more to meet our goal. We need 6 more insurance members as well. All active members should make an effort to attend a Degree ceremony to show support for our new, incoming members.

**Grand Knight's Report:** Harry welcomed 2 new members Don and Justin. We received a letter of thanks from the Diocese for our donation to the T.V. mass. Wayne Patterson wanted Harry to mention the Wilderness Outreach program, which was mentioned at the Chapter meeting. This program is dedicated to restoring foot-trails in the National parks, as well as hold religious retreats there as well. John Bradford wanted to come to a future meeting and speak about the program to the Council. The Council agreed to extend him an invitation to speak. 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday Knights mass is at 9:30am. **Financial Secretary Report:** Reading of Receipts and Bills by Mark Borys. Motion made to accept the Financial Secretary Report made by Mike Phillips. Seconded by Harry Clyburn. Motion passed.

**Respect Life:** They have 21-26 persons paid for the DC bus trip. December 15<sup>th</sup> is the cut off date, so please turn in your application. You can get one on the Seton website. There are 6-7 more individuals that have promised to go but not paid yet.

Possibly another 10-20 from St. Charles, and Edd contacted St. Matthews who also have not filled their bus. He will see if we need to combine the travelers into one bus if possible. Cost right now is \$150.00 for a shared 2 person room, breakfast included. If you missed getting your signature down to be put on the Right to Life list in the newspaper, please see Edd to get it in.

**Family Director:** Photos with Santa will be this Sunday after every Mass. Please bring your kids to get your picture taken. Fun for all!!

**Youth Director:** New Director Joel Potts- Stated that the Free Throw Tournament will be January 9<sup>th</sup> at 1:30 pm. ### **Report of Standing Committees:**

**Old Business:** The motion from last meeting for the donation of \$XXXX to St. Gabriel Catholic Radio was put up for discussion. Good times and Bad

### "Awareness of Past and Present Times"

The Lord has created heaven and earth; the sun to lighten us by day, the moon by night. Even after man's first sin, followed by God's promise of redemption and grace, man's will was left free by God, in an absolute liberty to choose between light and darkness, good and evil. This explains the history of the world and the course of past centuries.

It is the ignorance and malice of men, or their goodness, which determines the splendor or beauty of an age.
