Respect Life: NRL Pro-Life Essay Contest

Last month the Respect Life article included the comments of the teens that accompanied us on the bus to the March for Life in Washington, DC. Their comments were great! This month's article is by another teen, this one the winner of the senior level (grades 10-12) National Right to Life Essay Contest. Maureen Mead of Blasdell, New York won first place with this article:

When They Say "A Woman's Right to Choose"...

What is a right? Miriam-Webster Dictionary says that a right is "a power or privilege to which one is justly entitled." Our founding fathers thought that every human being has unalienable rights, and one of these is the right to life. How then does our country justify abortion? Those in support of abortion will say that it is acceptable because of a woman's right to choose. They say that it is the woman's body, and thus she has the right to choose what to do with it, even if that means abortion.

People who use the phrase "a woman's right to choose," coined by pro-abortionists as a marketing technique and never meant to be a legitimate argument, are forgetting one important thing. Just because it is in your power to make a choice, that does not make the choice right. I can choose to walk down the street and shoot someone, but that does not mean that there should be a law allowing me to do so. A choice is always just a choice, it is not the outcome.

Yes, we have many choices to make, but just because we can choose to end another person's life does not ever justify doing so. Yet there are those who argue, "Who are you to tell me what to do with my body?" The truth is, this does not just involve the woman's body anymore. The baby in the womb is not simply an attachment or growth, but a new person, with rights to its own body. This is not a potential for human life this is a human being. As a human being, although small and hidden from view, this unborn child has just as much right to its body as the next person. We would not suggest that a mother could kill her three year old because her child is not big enough to have rights yet, but we deprive an infant in the womb its right to be born simply because it is so small.

Furthermore, if I saw a woman about to do something to her body that could severely harm her, I, and the average person with a conscience, would do everything to try and prevent her from doing it. Abortion is extremely harmful to women both physically and psychologically, and yet the world stands by silently and lets it happen.

Everyone deserves the right to grow up, laugh, make mistakes, and live their life fully. No one deserves to have their life brutally ripped from them. Abortion is the greatest act of cowardice, because it preys on those who cannot defend themselves. We have the right to make choices, but what are we choosing? We have an obligation to protect the weak and the innocent. There will never be a day when it is justifiable to take another person's right to live simply because we can.

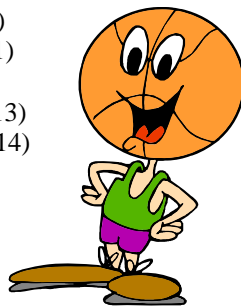

The Primary Way Fathers Can Prevent Teen Marijuana Use

Recently I received a radio question from a father of a fourteen year-old asking what to do about his son's marijuana smoking. This was a timely question since teen use of marijuana is the highest in history.

Teens received a mixed message from all the media hype during the drive to legalize marijuana during the 2010 elections. Many teens think, "If it's legal, then it must be o.k. to use." One Denver psychiatrist reported that sixty percent of his teen patients involved with marijuana had gotten their pot from a person holding a medical marijuana card from the state of Colorado. In other words, a large quantity of legally purchased medical marijuana is being illegally channeled to teens.

My personal expectation is that marijuana is going to be a growing problem for parents and their teens, especially as the push for legalization makes headway in the decade ahead. I'll be giving several recommendations to combat the teen pot plague in the future, but in this newsletter I want to zero in on the single most important thing fathers need to know about preventing teen marijuana use.

The peer group is the prime conduit for the spread of teen marijuana use. In order to prevent, or to correct, marijuana use, then something must replace the primacy of the teen peer group's influence in your child's life. A multi-million dollar collection of youth studies have revealed that the most effective strategy for combating teen marijuana use and the peer culture spreading it is to replace peer pressure with parent pressure.

How do you replace peer pressure with parent pressure? In a word, **time**, and lots of it. Don't be fooled by the misleading advice that says "quality time" can make up for large quantities of time with your children. It can't.

Here's what I wrote about fathering time in my book, *Legacy*:

"The loss of parental time almost guarantees trouble in the teen years, when dwindling parental influence can be eclipsed by the peer group and the media.

Your children in their pre-teen and teen years are going to be in a tug-of-war between the values of the peer group and your morals and beliefs.

To win this contest, you must take a proactive approach to fathering by building up the bond between you and your children. By spending generous amounts of time with them throughout their childhood, you overcome peer pressure with parent pressure. Successful fathers don't wait for teen problems to explode. Instead, they make the time investments long before they might seem necessary.

Many parents are deceptively lulled into a false sense of security by their child's seeming ability to survive in an anti-Christian peer culture. Despite this, after a decade of immersion the peer culture usually gains its hold. By the time parents realize what's

happened, their seventeen-year-old has embraced hedonism, rejected their authority, and spurned the Faith. In desperation, such parents search for the magic bullet to reverse what has been done.

The first decade of a child's life is prime time for fathering. This is a main reason why St. Joseph's Covenant Keepers is putting a renewed focus on equipping and encouraging younger fathers. Even though this stage of life puts intense career and work demands upon a man's life, he can't be distracted from putting the fathering accelerator all the way to the floor. The best time to deal with the problem of the negative influences of the peer group is *before* your child becomes a teenager.

Though this option isn't for every family, homeschooling is an effective way to increase "parent pressure." The primary reason I was attracted to homeschooling was its effectiveness for allowing parents to be the primary socializing agents for their children rather than the peer group. As a youth pastor I saw more than enough evidence that I didn't want peer dominance for my children, but I didn't know of an effective vehicle to overcome it until I encountered homeschooling. For those interested in exploring this topic further, I suggest a careful reading of chapter six in *Legacy*.

Finally, family dinner time is prime time for building parent pressure. Guys who regularly skip dinner with the family might be setting up their children for trouble down the road. University studies show that teens who have infrequent family dinners (0-2 x per week) are two and a half times likelier to use marijuana. Family meals (that include dad) are an effective way to nourish your relationship you're your children. This simple step will increase your influence in your child's life and simultaneously reduce the allure of negative ones. So, try to get home from work on most nights so that you can share a family meal.
