Business Meeting Minutes - October 12, 2011

The start of the official meeting was delayed as we listed to Stephanie Jursek from Catholic Social Services on a presentation of her duties as a Parish Liaison. They serve in partnership with groups ... such as the Knights ... to "Live the gospel" and help those in need. The three main areas of their assistance cover Family & Children (especially in regards to counseling), the Food Bank and finally Senior Services. The first has a program entitled "Pathways of Hope" designed to support those individuals suffering domestic abuse. A main senior Services program is called "Home of Choice", which assists all souls having lost their homes due to financial burden be given assistance in not only receiving a place to dwell, but furnishing it as well. Pamphlets were shared and distributed ... available on the Knights bulletin board or at the Ushers table at Church ... for individuals wishing to be involved either financially or in a variety of other ways.

The meeting was called to order at 7:53 by G.K. Tim Bowie

Roll of Officers: All officers ... with the exception of our Chaplain ... were in attendance!

Gene Ebert made a motion that the minutes for the previous meeting be read in their entirety. Harry Clyburn seconded the motion. The Recording Secretary anxiously awaited the opportunity to read the marvelously crafted notes, but alas the motion was voted down. Ed Chinnock motioned the previous notes be accepted as published with the exception of changing birthday wishes from Frank Hare to James Hare. C.W. Higdon seconded the motion which was resoundingly passed.

Chaplain's Report: No report

Grand Knight's Report: G.K. Tim Bowie wished Happy Birthday to all October celebrants ... with special thanks to Bud Joos and C.W. Higdon who were founding members of our council 18 years ago. Thanks again gentlemen for not only getting the ball rolling, but your great leadership and involvement throughout our existence.

The G.K. then solicited a report from Frank Piper and Wayne Patterson (Frank was "the voice") about the activities of the Columbus Chapter of Knights. Frank explained to all the chapter is a group of councils which assist with large projects such as the Clergy Dinner and purchase of Ultrasound Machines last year. They exist for our benefit and will assist us in the advertising of the RTL Trip to Washington in January. We can decide to "leave" the chapter ... as membership is voluntary. This may come up in May for a vote, if future involvement is deemed unnecessary.

Tim echoed emails sent earlier that day thanking all Knights who assisted with the moving of Scott Mucha between second and first floor apartments as he recovers from his stroke. The work was hard, but with the diligent effort of those in attendance, the goods were moved in roughly four and one half hours. Even Croyle broke a sweat. Family Director: Brother Mike Phillips spoke to all about the successful Insurance Seminar conducted by our Field Agent last week and how informative it really was. Thanks Mike and ... for helping us prepare for the future. Mike then reminded us all of the Fall Family Festival coming on Saturday, October 29th. All available Knights are asked to come prepare beginning at 2:00. Have the family show up beginning at 4:00 for pumpkin carving, food (with ribs on the menu!), corn hole tossing, bonfire warmth and even a hay ride through our potentially "haunted" forest. And *please*, if nothing else, try to stop in to assist with tear down/clean up at the end!

Youth Director: Brother Jesse Garcia mentioned that SPY was in fill swing and that they are hoping to be involved in the Fall Family Picnic ... and especially the "haunted" forest.

Right to Life Director: Brother Edd Chinnock reminded all that October is "Respect Life" month and that every Friday a Holy Hour is scheduled in the Eucharistic Chapel from 6 -700PM. All are encouraged to attend. Edd then updated everyone on the status of the "Right to Life" trip to Washington, D.C. The rooms and bus are reserved. Cost per person is \$150. The bus is set to leave Seton on Sunday, January 22 and return late on Monday, January 23 following the march. It is a great trip to attend in support of the abolishment of Roe vs.: Wade. Edd closed with an announcement of a "Tailgate for Life" fundraiser set for Tuesday,

October 18 at St. Andrew's Church in Upper Arlington.

Squires Report: Brother Mark Knight listed the numerous areas of involvement coming up for our dwindling group of boys. A retreat is scheduled for October 22 and 23 in Danville which many of the group plans to attend. The boys intend to assist with the Fall Family Festival ... as always. They are on the docket for setup, and tear down for the Pancake Breakfasts ... and undoubtedly more. They will be in attendance or serve at the Memorial Mass for deceased Knights. The boys will also be involved with a "tree planting project" at the request of Fr. Klima. More information is coming on that. And finally ... due to the aforementioned dwindling numbers as a result of age and graduation into knighthood ... the group intends to make a big push for recruitment and wish our council assistance in this as well.

Unfinished Business:

The motion to donate \$XXX this year and for the next three years to St. Gabriel Radio Station for the purchase of a new signal was amended by Edd Chinnock to be \$XXX for this year only. Mike Croyle seconded the motion. Brother Jim Anderson then spoke on the station, its growth and the perceived rush together long term donations. Jim said the target total was 2 million dollars and previous attempts failing to gather on a million caused the concern. An anonymous couple has greatly assisted in the purchase with an offer to "match" donations received up to a certain amount by a set date ... thus the perceived rush. To date we are close to the match, with \$XXX already pledged. Jim then spoke on the aim of the station ... to "deepen faith and deepen devotion". The new signal will reach over 4.4 million people in Ohio! Jim then handed out information resulting from a 2010 survey of those listening to Catholic Radio. Of the nearly 2,000 respondents, 9 out of 10 said the station influenced them to become more spiritually engaged. 50% attended Mass more frequently as a result of listening. 7 out of 10 mentioned that Catholic Radio helped teach their kids more about the faith. Jim concluded his speech with the response as to the "business plan" of the station. His response pointed to the positive direction of the station ... with a past debt of over \$XXX, but now a current cash value of \$XXX.

Brother Harry Clyburn then offered his concern on that a council as large as ours should not hesitate to even offer more funds. He mentioned our financial status and funds available for donation. Harry feels that the more souls reached would mean the more saved. He asked "Is there a greater charity"?

The motion as stated above was eventually voted on ... and passed. Brother Jim said this donation would undoubtedly place us on the large donor list.

New Business:

Our Basketball ticket money was designated to assist the Holy Spirit soup Kitchen among others.

The Ministry Market Place is scheduled for Saturday, November 5th and Sunday, November 6th after all masses. G.K. Tim Bowie requests volunteers to set up and man the table after any of the masses. Since this is the Memorial Mass weekend, we especially need new volunteers. Please spend about a half hour or so and help us gain new members to our council ... and spread the word

about our service!

The Charity Ticket Sales handout is on the books for February 19. Clergy Night is set for February 12.

Perhaps a child or grandchild would be a good candidate for membership?



'Typical' Caregiving Scenario Defined in New Report

A new Gallup poll aims to describe the life of an average caregiver and shines light on the vast amount of time family caregivers spend each month caring for a loved one.

The Gallup poll is part of a three part series, which aims to describe what it means to be caregiver. Researchers surveyed 2,805 adults, aged 18 and older, who self-identified as caregivers and were working at least 15 hours per week. Most respondents reported caring for someone 75 or older, and 72 percent of these caregivers were providing care for a parent. A majority of these caregivers did not live with the person to whom they provided care, but 66% of individuals not living with the person they cared for lived within 10 miles.

The poll finds that caregiving is generally a long-term commitment and is often a major time commitment, with more than 19 days per month devoted to providing care. 13 or these days were spent with tasks such as shopping, food preparation, housekeeping, laundry, transportation, and taking medicine, while 6 of these days were spent assisting with personal tasks such as toilet visits, eating, dressing, grooming, and bathing. Caregivers also spent 13 hours per month coordinating physician visits, managing financial matters, and researching care services for their loved one and an average of 5 hours per day in which they provide care devoted to companionship.
