Business Meeting Minutes – Aug. 10, 2011

Meeting opened at 7:30pm with a prayer.

Roll of Officers: Chaplain and Inside Guard were excused.

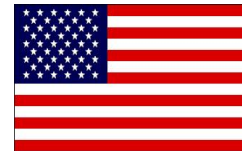

Respect Life: Upcoming Events

October is Respect Life month, and between now and the end of October there are an incredible number of opportunities to witness for life. Many of these events were started by or with the Knights of Columbus or are sponsored by our organization. All of us need to stand up as Pro-Life Knights and participate in these activities.

Pro-Life Freedom Ride, Sept 18

Fifty years ago people of all ages, races, religions, and politics joined in freedom rides across the South for the civil rights of all. This year, central Ohio residents are invited to take part in a new freedom ride to emphasize that legalized abortion is today's equivalent of the civil rights issues the nation courageously dealt with in the 1960's.

This freedom ride for the unborn will take place Saturday, Sept 18, in Franklin and Delaware counties, led by Fr. Frank Pavone, MEV, national director of Priests for Life. The ride will leave the parking lot of Delaware St. Mary Church, 82 E. William St., following the 12:15 Mass, at which Fr. Pavone will speak. Fr. Pavone is an excellent speaker and it is worth the trip to Delaware just to hear him.

The ride will proceed with a designated escort through downtown Delaware and on U.S. 23 and Interstate 270. They expect to arrive between 2:30 and 3:00 at the Complete Healthcare for Women abortion mill at 5888 Cleveland Ave. in Columbus. Fr. Pavone will lead a sidewalk vigil commemorating the unborn lost to abortion.

Priests for Life Fundraising Dinner, Sept 18

Following the freedom ride there will be a fundraising dinner for Priests for Life, featuring Hungarian cuisine. It will take place at 5:30 pm in the Jessing Center of the Pontifical College Josephinum, 7625 N. High St., with doors open at 5 pm. In addition to Fr. Pavone, speakers include Peggy Hartshorn, president of Heartbeats International, and Brian Patrick of EWTN. Reservations are required. Contact St. Mary Church in Delaware for details.

Rally for Heartbeat Bill, Sept 20

The Heartbeat Bill was passed by the Ohio House of Representatives 54-44 on June 28, 2011. It will ensure that "once a heartbeat is detected, the baby is protected." On Tuesday, September 20, a rally will be held at the Ohio Statehouse Atrium at 11:00 am to show our support of this important bill and encourage our state senators to pass their version of the bill.
