The Knights of Columbus stands with the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops in opposition to the recent decision by the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) to force Catholic employers including hospitals, universities, and charities to provide health insurance that covers contraception and sterilization.

The new rule from HHS gives Catholic institutions until August of 2013 before it begins forcing insurance plans to cover all FDA-approved contraceptive methods and sterilization procedures, including several drugs that induce abortion. The mandate will force individuals and groups with religious or moral objections to purchase and provide such coverage. More information is available

Business Meeting Minutes - February 8, 2012

The meeting was called to order promptly at 7:30 by Grand Knight Tim Bowie

All officers ... with the exception of our Chancellor and Two Year Trustee ... were in attendance, with the Recorder just squeezing in under the wire as the roll was being called. Thanks Glen for standing in for me and learning the correct pronunciation of Joos along the way.

The minutes of the last meeting were motioned approved as read by Edd Chinnock, seconded by Wayne Patterson and passed.

Chaplain's Report: No report ... but he did arrive later.

Admissions Committee: Reminded all of the reading of Michael Katchmar and the possibility of a First Degree Ceremony on Leap Day ... Wednesday, February 29th.

Grand Knight's Report: G.K. Tim Bowie then wished Happy Birthday to all February celebrants ... with apologies to Brother David Oboy for the misspelling of his name in the newsletter.

The G.K. then requested help for the upcoming Pancake Breakfast on February 12th. Please make your calls on the Phone Tree and welcome any new bodies arriving. Make them feel part of the crew. Tim also announced the cancellation of the Squires Pancake Breakfast scheduled for February 19th as many of the boys will be out of town on the confirmation retreat or otherwise unavailable.

Tim then mentioned that the normal officers' meetings scheduled on the first Saturday of the month are for any member to attend, especially if they are planning to present something for the council to sponsor. He then spoke of conflicts with the next two first Saturday's due to the CMC and Easter. Treasurer Report: Mike Phillips reported on our funds on hand. He intends to roll over part of the Magnet Fund into a CD.

Financial Secretary Report: Brother Mark Borys then reported on all bills and income for the month. These bills were motioned

to be sent to the trustees for signing and payment. This was accomplished in a timely manner. Mark then mentioned that our latest financial report was turned in to the State. He then revealed that we were down to 45 members left with unpaid dues. Hopefully, all will come back into the fold.

Report on Programs and Committees:

Membership Committee Report: Mike Sillings is our new Membership chair. He will work with Mike Croyle to learn the ropes and hopefully a First Degree Ceremony will be added to our list for February 29th.

Program Director: Brother Frank Hare made a request for attendance and assistance at the Wives Appreciation Dinner on February 18th.

He also asked brothers to consider nominees for the State "Of the Year" awards. But, please don't just nominate ... write a short blurb on why you think that brother, clergy, youth or woman is worthy of such recognition.

Brother Hare then reminded all to be ready for the St. Patrick's Day celebration coming up on March 17th!

There was also a reminder about the Blue Coat Dinner scheduled for April 14th in the PAC.

Community Director: No report

Council Director: Brother George Schneider again reminded us of the First Degree on February 29th with a Candidates Call at 6:30PM and the Ceremony at 7:00PM. If you have not attended a degree in some time, please come. It is good to review the principles upon which we were founded. George then mentioned an opportunity to attend a Men's Lenten Retreat on March 24th. Our own Jim Anderson will be speaking at this retreat. See George for more information.

Family Director: No report

Youth Director: Brother Jesse Garcia mentioned that the Seton scholarship is up on the web and direct applicants there.

Right to Life Director: Brother Edd Chinnock gave a summation of the successful "Right to Life" to Washington, D.C. Forty-one were in attendance, with seven Knights from our council and eight Seton youth. Please read last month's newsletter to read comments from the youth who made the trip. A special thanks and acknowledgment goes out to sister Lorraine Rossi-Sharon, who assisted greatly with one traveler who seemingly was suffering a stroke. Lorraine stayed behind to care for and attend to the travel of this individual after all was under control!

On another note back in Ohio, Edd mentioned the Right to Life group will observe Forty Days of Life and on March 14th are asking for 24 around the clock coverage and prayer at an abortion clinic. If you can support, the clinic we will target is the one on the corner of Cleveland Avenue and N. 161. Call Edd if interested.

Edd then discussed the Conscience Rights Act and the bill to have all organizations, including Catholic hospitals, to have coverage for employees seeking abortions, sterilization, or abortion drugs. Catholics see this as a direct assault on our Religious Freedom. Congressmen Steve Austria and Ron Portman support defeat of this bill. Please call or write and thank them for their support. Edd then motioned for \$1000 to be donated to Kinder Women's Care Center in support of their cause. The motion was not seconded. After lowering the request to \$500, it was seconded on for approval next month.

He thanked all who assisted, giving special mementos for those who did. The event also brought in one new Squire ... First we need all the help we can get ... especially for tear down. The guys who have been cooking since noon are just worn out by then. Please hang around and give a hand. Next, we need the lovely ladies to bake weekly desserts for the hungry masses. We will again be offering an "Early Bird Discount" beginning at 5:30PM for early arrivals.

John then made a motion to purchase six A-Frame Sandwich Board signs at a price not to exceed \$XXX for advertisement of the events. Respect Life - HHS Mandate

As I write this article I am on vacation in Arizona. Last Sunday the pastor at the local church we attended focused his homily on the HHS mandate that requires all institutions to offer contraception, sterilization, and "morning after" abortion drugs at no cost in their health plan coverage. While there is an exception for religious institutions, it is so narrow that Jesus and his disciples would not qualify. Many Catholic institutions, including hospitals, schools, universities, social service agencies, food banks, adoption centers, etc. would have to offer this coverage even though it is contrary to Catholic teaching. When Cardinal elect Timothy Dolan of New York met with President Obama to discuss this issue, the president offered a compromise: he said Catholic institutions (provided they can prove to the government they meet certain religious standards) had a additional year to "find a way to violate our consciences" as Cardinal Dolan so clearly phrased it.

The penalties for not complying with this mandate are so harsh that they would quickly bankrupt any institution that get hit with them. In his homily, the priest quoted Cardinal Francis George of Chicago as saying that within two years of this mandate being enforced, there would be no Catholic hospitals, universities, schools, or social service agencies left in the United States.

The Obama administration wants to make this a contraception issue, apparently believing that because statistics show 99% of Catholics have used birth control at some time in the past the bishops are out of touch with most Catholics. Statistics also show that Catholics lie and commit adultery, but we don't expect the Church to condone these actions. The Obama administration completely misses this point.

The fact is, this is NOT a contraception or even abortion issue. It is a direct attack on religious freedom. The Obama administration wants to decide who can believe what and wants the government to decide what religious beliefs and practices are acceptable. They claim this is about "essential preventive services", but if that is the case, why choose only contraception? Why not tooth brushes and toothpaste? Aren't they "essential preventive services" as well so should be offered free of charge by your health plan?

We need to stand firm with our Bishops, who unanimously oppose this mandate. Listen to what they are saying about this issue and take the actions they suggest. Right now, TODAY, write or call your Senators and Congressman and ask them to co-author and support bills to allow meaningful conscience exceptions to the HHS mandate. Also write Bishop Campbell and thank him for his leadership on this issue, and tell him as Tom Wagner put it in his Catholic Man of the Year speech, that we, as Knights of Columbus, "have your back".

Prosciutto wrapped asparagus and Mushroom Risotto

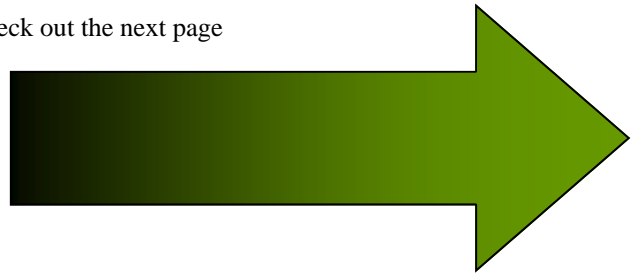
And the piece de resistance - Chef Mike's Flambé of Peaches Foster.
