Roll Call of Officers:

All officers were in attendance with the exception of our Chaplain who was most definitely excused.

The minutes of the previous meeting were motioned for approval as published by Wayne Patterson, seconded by Edd Chinnock, voted on and passed.

Chaplain's Report: Deacon Hector spoke in place of Father Klima (who is still recovering from gall bladder surgery!) Deacon Hector gave a quick overview (including video!) of the church renovation project. He asked all to sign up and join the new,

The Trustees also noted that the Clergy Appreciation night is scheduled for January 26, 2014 and our need to set up the invitations and reserve the necessary tables.

Chancellor's Report: No Report.

Report on Programs and Committees:

Program Director: Brother Dick Petersen reported that our programs were up to date and we have 175 of the 600 points necessary for Program completion already entered!

Another request is for us to attend a Liturgy Commission Service on Saturday, January 4th at a 9:00 Mass. Please put it on your calendars and plan to attend now.

As an update on our Chalice purchase intent ... we are now looking into stainless steel chalices, as the gold ones chip very easily.

Community Director: Brother Thom Laughery reminded us all of the Pancake Breakfast coming up on December 8th - which will include a visit from Santa!

He next reminded all of the **BUSY** month we will have in January ... with a Pancake Breakfast, the Wives Appreciation Dinner, and the Free Throw Contest where we support our Squires! Please be ready to help! He then motioned that:

MOTION – The Council will provide up to \$480 for the creation and donation of 10 large food baskets to be given to the Pickerington Food Pantry for Thanksgiving meals. The motion was seconded by George Schneider, discussed, voted upon and passed.

Brother Frank Hare volunteered to do the purchasing and arrangement of the baskets.

Brother Laughery also reminded us to put the Blue Coat Dinner (April), the Measure Up Campaign (May), and the possibility of us marching in the 4th of July Parade in Reynoldsburg on our calendars.

Council Director: No report.

Report of the 4th Degree – Brother Glavan reminded all of the Thanksgiving celebration to be held before the next Assembly Meeting and the Memorial Service which will follow. All Knights are invited to attend. Please bring a side dish to share.

Brother Glavan again reminded all of the 4th Wednesday of the month morning Breakfast Club now being conducted at the Olde Village Diner. Breakfast begins at 9:15. Stop by if you are free!

Family Director: Ryan Anderson mentioned the success of the Fall Family Festival and what a learning experience it was. He gave thanks to those who assisted ... especially Dick Petersen, Frank Hare, Wayne Patterson and those who came to help clean up at the end! Everyone was home in record time!

Youth Director: Brother Gene Ebert discussed our scholarship program and that applications were now being accepted. All apps need in by March 1st instead of April 1st as earlier published. There are two scholarships ... one for students in the 4th through 8th grades and one for High School students. Remember, they have to be a child or grandchild of a Knight to qualify.

Right to Life Director: Brother Edd Chinnock then asked us to consider praying outside the Clinic over the next few weeks. He also shared a story of a lady who stopped by and mentioned of how she had received a false test on her baby from such a facility and that abortion was given as the only option. She refused ... had the baby ... and all was well. She is thankful for our work and that she refused the direction offered by the clinic.

Squires Report: Brother Mike Phillips asked us all to remember the State Dodge Ball Tournament that our Squires are hosting on February 1st and 2nd and asks our involvement.

Unfinished Business: None.

Many Knights in attendance picked up a Christmas Card (already stamped and addressed to a seminarian) to mail ... after the inclusion of a gift card to perhaps a nice restaurant or retail store. The Seminarians need a boost in their pockets now and then.

We are organizing a Memorial Committee consisting of some Past Grand Knights and headed by Frank Piper to bring our Memorial Stone and other plaques up to date.

Brother Tim Bowie then gave a quick update on a few notes of interest. From a communication he received from Aimee Logsdon, whom we supported this year in her Christian College project, it seems she is doing well and thanks us for all of our assistance.

He then mentioned a communication from Brother Jim Anderson who transferred out of our Council to move further in his priestly pursuits in the Chicago area. Basically, it seems that by comparison, with our council and some in the Chicago area ... ours is WAY cooler!

And finally ...a donation of \$300 was given to our Council by Bernadette Loch in the name of our deceased brother Ed Loch from funds obtained from the sale of his handicapped items. We thank you, Bernadette.

Respect Life: March for Life Bus Trip

We are busy preparing for the bus trip to DC for the March for Life. Due to a scheduling conflict, the Our Lady of Mount Carmel Buckeye Lake youth group will not be going with us this year. In addition, our SPY youth group will not need as many seats as they initially thought. This means we have about 25 seats available on the bus for additional riders. **This is a great opportunity for YOU to attend this wonderful trip with us!**

We will leave early Tuesday morning, January 21, and return late Wednesday night, January 22. We will go directly to the Basilica of the Immaculate Conception for the vigil Mass. If you have never been there, you MUST come see this gorgeous Basilica and the Knights of Columbus bell tower. The vigil Mass is like no other Mass you have ever attended – there are so many Cardinals, Bishops, priests, deacons, and seminarians that the entrance procession alone takes 30 minutes.

After Mass our bus will take us to the hotel where we will have a pizza party and visit with our fellow riders before going to bed. The next morning, after breakfast at the hotel (included), the youth will go to the Youth Rally and Mass for Life while the other riders can go to any of the many Pro-Life events going on that morning. Priests for Life, 40 Days for Life, and many other groups have displays, speakers, and events we can attend.

Around noon, we will meet the youth as they return from the Youth Mass and go to the March itself. They have many great speakers and representatives at the rally before the March. Once the March begins, we will walk up Constitution Avenue to the Supreme Court building, where there are additional speakers. Those who wish can then go across the street to the Capitol building for a reception hosted by congressional representative Jim Jordan and other Ohio congressmen. Senator Rob Portman often attends as well. This is a great opportunity to meet some of our

congressmen.

After that, we will meet our bus for the trip home. You get all this for only \$170 per person (double occupancy). Please contact me if you are interested in this trip or get the registration/information form on the Seton Parish website.

We still need help at Dr. Samuel's local facility, so please come join us in prayer at the sidewalk in front of the Complete Women's Health Care clinic on Mondays and Tuesdays from 3 to 5pm and Saturdays from 10 to noon. We need to let Dr. Samuels know we don't want them in Pickerington!

Major Change to Council Operations

The Council is working to streamline its operations and reduce the actual time spent at the Business meeting each month. Meeting length has been one of the issues that keeps our members away.

So effective December 7, 2013 we will be back to the first Saturday of the month being an Officers meeting. It is still an open meeting, but participation by the general membership will be limited to observation.

In order to reduce the business meeting times the following procedure will be followed:

1. Should any member wish to have the Council participate in a project, they will be required to talk to the Grand Knight and be placed on the agenda for the next Officers meeting. This requires you to present your idea/project at the Officers meeting.

(This will be required whether or not an expenditure of funds is required.)

Prior to the Officers meeting, you need to talk to the committee chair in order to:

- a. Make sure they are on board with your request
 - b. They have the funds available (if required)
2. At the next Officers meeting the presentation will be made to the officers and once given and all presentations are made, the Officers will go into an "executive session" and only Officers will attend, everyone else will be excused. You will be notified prior to the Business meeting if you can submit your proposal to the Council.
 3. During the business meeting, if you present a motion for expenditure or want the Council to participate in an activity it will be tabled until you have met with the Officers. Exception to this will be requests directly from the Pastor of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish.

41st Annual March for Life – 2014 - Trip Information (Save)

Departure Information: We shall depart from St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish, 600 Hill Rd., Pickerington, Ohio 43147 on chartered bus by Lakefront Lines at 6:00am on Tuesday, January 21st. **PLEASE ARRIVE NO LATER THAN 5:30AM.**

Directions to Seton from 70 West from Columbus: Travel on I-70 East towards Wheeling. Take Exit 112A towards Pickerington. Travel 2.9 miles through Pickerington. Seton Parish is on the left.

Stops on the trip: We will make lunch and restroom stops on the trip out and restroom stops on the trip back. Lunch will be fast food style stops. You need to bring money for food or snacks purchased at these stops.

Arrival Info (Jan. 21): We arrive at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, 400 Michigan Ave. Washington, D.C. (202-526-8300) at ~4:00pm. The Mass for Life begins at 6:30pm. You can eat and tour the basilica between 4:00 and 6:30pm. Dinner is on your own.

After Mass: We will board our bus and proceed to our hotel begin_of_the_skype_highlightingend_of_the_skype_highlighting for check-in, late snacks, and bed time. We are staying at the Embassy Suites Washington, 1250 22nd St NW, Washington, DC 20037, 202-857-3388.

Day Two Events (Jan. 22): After our breakfast at the hotel (included), you are free to attend any of the pro-Life events in downtown DC. Meet at the Mall by the Smithsonian for the 12:00 noon rally. The March immediately follows, ending up at the Supreme Court Building. If time permits, we may attend Congressional open houses or events. 
