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Business Meeting Notes – May 8, 2013

The meeting was called to order promptly at 7:30 by Grand Knight George Schneider

Roll Call of Officers:

All officers were in attendance with the exception of:

Deputy Grand Knight - (some excuse about a boo-boo on his arm), Advocate, Warden, Outer Guard, 3 Year Trustee

The minutes of the last meeting were motioned for approval by Wayne Patterson, seconded by Edd Chinnock, voted on and passed.

Chaplain's Report: Deacon Hector first congratulated the council for our wonderful evening benefiting our "Blue Coats" and then reminded us of Fr. Jim's anniversary coming up on May 15th. He then read from *The Church* by Fr. Robert Barron, on the Catholic Church being a "Holy Ground". The good deacon then asked us to be involved with our input of thoughts responding to the parish survey on the renovation of our holy ground. We trust many of you did. The first proposed blue print is ready for viewing!

Membership Committee Report: Mike Sillings mentioned we have 3 men ready for the First Degree...which were obtained from the Ministry Market Place or as transfers. For the year we have added 8 members. Our large quota requirement (17) is keeping us from State Awards as is our lacking Insurance Member quota.

Communications: We had a nice write up in the Pickerington Times by Mike Hayes on our successful "Blue Coat" dinner. Try to find it online for the interview with our own Ron Blymire...the chair of the event. Great job, Ron.

Grand Knight's Report: G.K. George Schneider then began with a list of important items.

Our G.K. thanked all who turned out in support of our two First Communion celebrations and one Confirmation.

The Grand Knight then segued that in to others needing to continue their journey on to their Fourth Degree so they may attend in the future. He mentioned the next 2nd and 3rd degree would be 5/19 at St. Andrews...to get you closer to this goal.

The Grand Knight then turned over the meeting to Brother Len Fatica, chair of the Building Committee, for elaboration on the church renovation plans. Brother Len mentioned that this has been and will continue to be a long process...with the reading of Papal documents on the requirements of a church, the interviews of the architects and the review of their work, and an in-depth evaluation of the main areas needing attention. The top three in those areas are (in order) the cracked floors, the pews, and the AC/Heat. Other areas include the roof (already ongoing), the location of the Music Ministry (who are currently closer to the Altar area than the priests!), the change of the altar area and more. Please help with your suggestions and help us towards a final plan.

Treasurer Report: Brother Mike Phillips shared our bank account totals and we are financially sound.

Financial Secretary Report: All bills and income for the month were read. These bills were motioned to be sent to the trustees for

signing and payment. This was accomplished in a timely manner.

Report of the Trustees: The Trustees reported the upcoming election for officers would be discussed later and that we will have to assure our involvement with the Measure Up campaign next fiscal year, as we passed on that this year...or at least with involvement in our normal manner.

Chancellor's Report: No Report.

Report on Programs and Committees:

Program Director: Brother Frank Hare announced our programs were maxed for the year! Great job at keeping us at the top in Programs, Frank!

Church Director: No report.

Community Director: No Report.

Council Director: It was reported that the Mother Seton statue needs some renovation work herself. A motion was made by Brother Glavan that our council would arrange for off-site work. This was seconded by Wayne Patterson and passed. The church will still pay for the work. We will just "get 'er done".

Brother Glavan also mentioned that another attempt at a social of sorts will be held the 3rd Wednesday of each month ... in the morning ... for all you old folks. The social will be a pay for your own breakfast at Bob Evans at 9:15. Come if you can for some brotherly breakfast.

Family Director: No report.

Youth Director: Five applications for our scholarship offering have been received and were turned over to the Trustees for evaluation. These are for children or grandchildren of any Council Knight.

Right to Life Director: Brother Chinnock gave attendance figures for the PDHC Dinner which saw 280 people raise ~\$40,000. The Baby Bottle collection project yielded ~\$5,000 in returns. The goal to be reached is \$200,000, so we still have a way to go!

The Clinic is still not open ... YEA!!! Work on the building continues as does weekly prayer outside the facility. Times are Monday and Tuesday from 2:45 - 5:00 and Saturday morning from 10:00 - 12:00 noon. Please come by to pray with us.

And ... the rooms are already reserved for next year's Right to Life Bus Trip ... this will ensure us a discounted amount.

Squires Report: Brother Mike Phillips spoke and gave a shout out to Brothers Knight and Malott for covering a meeting for him. He then spoke on the Squires attending their state Convention on May 28 - 30 in Newark. They may also be scheduling a Clipper's game and might be asking the Knights for assistance in buying some new shirts ... smaller in size for our younger boys. More on this later.

Blue Coat Dinner: Brother Ron Blymire was again credited for an awesome event!

Unfinished Business:

None.

New Business:

A motion was made by Brother Bog Glavan and seconded by Edd Chinnock to pay for a full page advertisement in the State Convention booklet. This was voted on and passed.

A motion was made by Brother Mike Phillips to provide up to \$XXX for the purchase of formal Squires shirts. This was seconded by Brother Frank Hare, voted upon and passed.

A motion was made by Brother Jesse Garcia and seconded by Brother Frank Hare to provide a pasta dinner at a cost not to exceed \$XXX for the "Young Catholic Musicians" who will sing at select Masses on June 1 and 2. The cost will not be that high, but this gives us some leeway. The motion was voted on and passed.

Other Items of Interest: Due to some late developments, the elections for officers will be conducted at the June meeting. There is still time to become involved. Check last month's newsletter for positions and responsibilities.

Report of the Fourth Degree: No report.

Field Agent Report: Field Agent Stanley Krulia then congratulated us on achieving all of our program points. He then followed up with a reminder that purchasing fraternal benefits counts towards our insurance quota. The next discussion was for each of us to consider disability protection. Most people do not... thinking social security disability is enough. The fact is that this usually involves an investigation...which could take up to two years...and that 65% of those requesting are turned down.

The Knights of Columbus disability purchase involves no such investigation. Consider it rather than depleting your savings, relying on the government, or your work policies. A last fact is that 90% of disability does not come from injury...but rather illness. Can you afford to get sick?

District Deputy Report: No report.

Following a devastating tornado in suburban Oklahoma City, Okla., the Knights of Columbus has initiated local disaster response efforts to help those affected.

The Knights of Columbus Oklahoma State Council has begun organizing relief efforts in and around Moore, Okla., to assist those displaced or otherwise negatively impacted by the storm. In addition, the Knights of Columbus Supreme Council sent an initial donation of \$10,000 in support of the Oklahoma Knights' response.

Council Officer Duties

Gentlemen, the time has come for our election of officer's for the next fraternal year. Many ask at this time, of the duties of the positions. These are listed here below for your consideration. Those not included here...Financial Secretary, Lecturer, and Chaplain...are due to the fact that they are appointed by either the Grand Knight or Supreme.

For any of you who wish to eventually attain the position of Grand Knight, a good practice (but, not a requirement) is to hold all offices. This aids you in directing your officers once in the top spot.

Grand Knight: The Grand Knight is responsible for the welfare of the council. He presides over council meetings, acts as an ex-officio member of all committees, appoints a membership and programming director, convenes officers for a monthly meeting, and ensures all necessary reports are submitted to the state and Supreme Council. He should also be aware of the council's financial status and ensure that his signature appears on all checks drawn. The Grand Knight is a member of the Advisory Board with general supervision of the council's Columbian Squire circle.

Deputy Grand Knight: The Deputy Grand Knight is second in command. He assists the Grand Knight with council affairs and fulfills all duties assigned to him by the Grand Knight. Should the Grand Knight be absent from a council meeting, the Deputy Grand Knight presides. He is chairman of the council's retention committee and also a member of the Advisory Board charged with overseeing the council's sponsored Columbian Squires circle.

Chancellor: The Chancellor has a variety of responsibilities. Primarily, he assists the Grand Knight and the Deputy Grand Knight in the execution of their duties and oversees the council in both their absences. He is charged with strengthening the members' interests in council activities. The Chancellor is chairman of the admission committee and a member of the Columbian Squires circle ceremonial team.

Recorder: The Recorder is similar to a court reporter or a secretary. He is responsible for maintaining a true record of all actions of the council and its correspondence.

Treasurer: The Treasurer is responsible for the safekeeping and maintaining records of all council funds and accounts. He is responsible for depositing money into the council's accounts and provides a certificate of such monies to the Grand Knight. He is also responsible for payment of all expenses.

Advocate: The Advocate is the legal representative of the council and serves as the council's attorney at trials and investigations of any interest to the council. While he does not need to be a member of the legal profession, he should be familiar with the council by-laws, the Order's Charter, Constitution and Laws, Methods of Conducting a Council Meeting, and Robert's Rules of Order.

Warden: The Warden is the 'watchdog' for council property and degree paraphernalia, except the property of the financial secretary, treasurer and recorder. He is also responsible for setting up the council chambers for meetings and ceremonial work. During ceremonial exemplifications, he will appoint and supervise guards.

Inside/Outside Guards: The Guards have similar responsibilities, but distinct differences. The Outside Guard tends to the outer door admitting visitors and members to the inner door. Once at the inner door, the Inside Guard checks to make sure that their membership cards are current.

Board of Trustees: The Board of Trustees consists of three members elected by the council and the Grand Knight, who serves as chairman of the board. They oversee the work of the Financial Secretary and Treasurer, and with the Deputy Grand Knight serve on the council's retention committee. During council elections, only the Three-year Trustee is voted on, with the others moving on to become two and one-year trustees, respectively.

Mother Seton Statue Refinishing

Photos are of Dr. Bogomir Glavan working to refurbish the Mother Seton Statue. The statue was dedicated in 2003 in memorial of the establishment of Seton Parish in 1978. After 10 years in the harsh outdoor environment the Statue, made from fiber glass, had developed holes and cracks and lost its shine. Bog and I move the statue to his garage where he could easily get to his tools. Bog patched to holes and cracks with auto body filler and applied several coats of primer which also filled in many minor cracks in the body of the statue. We then move it from his garage to his front yard under a canopy for painting. Bog and I then applied 4 coats of white auto body paint finishing, then finished the job with 4 coats of clear coat that included a pearl additive to make it shine like a new Corvette. Bog, Charlie Higdon and I then move it back to Seton today. I then installed new lighting.

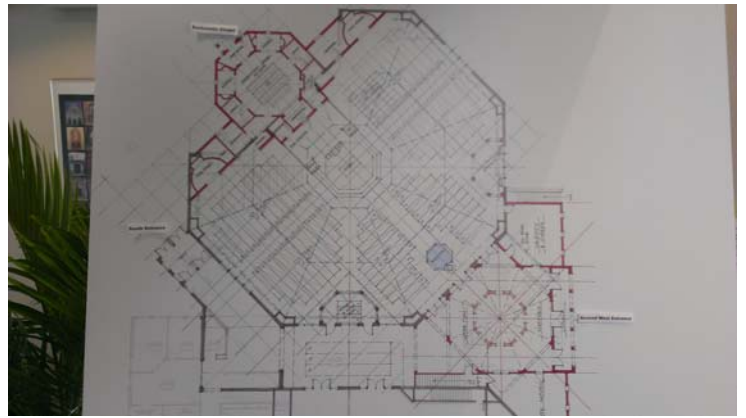
But the bad news is that the "Complete Healthcare for Women" is now open for business.
