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Business Meeting Notes – April 10, 2013

The meeting was called to order promptly at 7:30 by Grand Knight George Schneider

Roll Call of Officers (all in attendance except otherwise noted):

Chaplain - Fr. Jim Klima, Advocate - Phillip Beagle, Recorder - Mike Croyle, 3rd Year Trustee - Tim Bowie - excused

The minutes of the last meeting were motioned for approval by Wayne Patterson and seconded by Mike Sillings then voted on and passed.

Chaplain's Report: no report

Membership Committee Report: Mike Sillings reported that for the 2012-13 reporting period we have 8 new members out of a quota of 16 for the star council award. It was mentioned that that any suspended members would be counted against the quota. It was brought up that we may have a transfer or re-instatement from a gentleman from New York.

Grand Knight's Report: G.K. George Schneider started his report with a thank you to the First Degree team on another fine ceremony for are 4 new Knights. Two of these new brother Knights (Brian Thompson and Rich Schlachter) were introduced and welcomed by those attending the business meeting. Our G.K also spoke of how special Easter is to him and the joy it brings.

He also brought up the following upcoming events and encouraged his brother Knights to be involved:

Seton's First Communion - May 4th
Confirmation - May 6th
2nd and 3rd Degree - 4/28 and 5/19

The 4th degree Exemplification took place on April 4th and 5th at Cherry Valley Lodge. George spoke what a great event it was and congratulated new SK Mike Phillips and those in attendance shared their appreciation. SK Phillips then took a few minutes to second George's comments on the specialness of the weekend.

Treasurer Report: Brother Mike Phillips shared our bank account totals and we are financially sound.

Financial Secretary Report: Brother Mark Borys then reported on all bills and income for the month. These bills were motioned by Edd Chinnock to be sent to the trustees for signing and payment, seconded by Wayne Patterson and was voted on and passed.

Report of the Trustees: Trustee Wayne spoke to the success of the recent fish fry fundraisers. He reported sales and revenue figures showing increases from previous years. It was said that spending budgets for the 2013-14 financial year will benefit from the success of both the pancake breakfasts and Lenten fish fries. Appreciation from those attending the meeting was directed to the brother Knights chairing these events.

Chancellor's Report - No report.

Report on Programs and Committees:

Membership Director - Mike Sillings: Brother Knights in attendance were encouraged to share any new ideas regarding membership. The Rule 3 event Feb 28th was a good start but more suggestions would be welcomed. We were reminded that Seton's Ministry Marketplace would be April 27th and 28th and help would be needed to man our table.

Program Director - Frank Hare reported all "of the year" submissions were completed by the April 1st deadline. Huge thanks were expressed to individual program directors for their help in completing the 7 needed write ups. Deputy Grand Knight Glenn Williams was singled out for going above and beyond with these efforts. Glen commented that other brother and lady Knights were a big help in assisting him. Frank also mentioned only 2 state program reports were needed by April 15th to complete all submissions for the 2012-13 year.

Church Director - Director Glavan shared that the Religious of the year award was presented to Deacon Hector at the April 6th first Saturday meeting. Deacon was given a handsome, engraved pen and pencil stand and a Kroger gift. Both were well received by Deacon.

Bog reported a previously discussed purchase of a new stove for the church would not be needed. *[Note from recorder after the meeting - Bog looked over the old unit and personally made needed repairs - no expense to the council. Users of the PAC kitchen express their thanks to Bog for his skills and hard work.]*

Rosaries for the upcoming First Communion and Confirmation have been purchased. Enhancement to the rolling sign-board to deter vandalism was discussed.

Community Director - A reminder of the upcoming Blue Coat dinner - Saturday, 4/27 was given by coordinator Ron Blymire. He shared that chefs Dick Petersen and Mike Elston were planning a wonderful menu and all Knights were invited to work or attend this night of appreciation to our police, sheriffs and firefighters.

Council Director - D.G.K. Glenn explained that he is starting the planning of our upcoming 20th anniversary celebration (in 2013-14). Any ideas and suggestions are welcome. Glen also shared his positive experiences at the 4th degree Exemplification and encouraged those not taking part recently to relive this experience.

Family Director - Director Mike Phillips reported on the success of the Seton Egg Hunt on March 30th. It was a beautiful day weather-wise and the Knights were thanked for their donation of water and other beverages water. Kudos were given to the Squires for assisting with the filling of over 2,000 plastic eggs. Mike noted the efforts of Patty and Luke Woods for acquiring gift certificates from local merchants to distribute (KFC and Graeter's to name a couple). On a personal note as a father, Mike expressed the joy this event brought him. In concluding Mike mentioned he was transitioning the Family Director duties Ryan Anderson.

Youth Director - Brother Gene Ebert (scholarship chairman) announced that 5 applicants had been received for our annual scholarship award. These would be forwarded to the trustees for discussion and a decision.

Squires Report - Mark Knight and Mike Phillips updated us that another new Squire has been brought into the fold bringing their current membership up to 17. There are also 2-4 other possible candidates being recruited. Upcoming events currently being discussed are a Crew soccer game, Clippers baseball, a corn-hole tournament and the State Convention. Knights in attendance were informed that formal request and motion would be made at an upcoming meeting for new Squires shirts.

Right to Life Director - Director Edd Chinnock explained that he's been away for a while and gave a quick recap of the Right to Life bus trip on January 24th and 25th. There were 60 registrants and 2 cancelled - 26 were students with 16 from Seton. All were asked to check out comments from the students in the February and March council newsletters. Edd thanked the council for their support of the trip and also thanked them for the recent donation towards the right to life yard signs.

Ed provided an update that the Pickerington Dr. Samuels clinic was going through a great deal of local certification scrutiny but is scheduled to open in the next month. Praying outside the clinic continues Mon and Tue (2:45-5:00) and Sat (10:00-noon). A dinner to raise funds in support of PDHC opening a Pickerington location will be held Thu, April 18th at 7:00pm in the PAC. All Knights are encouraged to show their support at these events.

Pancake, Fish Fry, St. Patrick's Day, Blue Coat Dinner and other committees - For the upcoming Blue Coat dinner Brother Blymire mentioned that a final headcount was being determined and clean-up is always an area needing assistance. Arrangements were in the works for the invocation and babysitting.

The Fish Fry committee reported that 35-40 Knights volunteered for each of the 5 events. The council was thanked for their hard work and support. A much needed final breakdown and cleanup of the PAC kitchen was performed on March 26th. The committee expressed huge thanks to the 10 brother Knights who came on short notice to assist.

Unfinished Business: Much, much discussion and debate took place on the amount of council funding of attendees to the 2013 State Convention. The areas of concern were the number of family members attending, convention banquet fees, vehicle travel reimbursement, room reimbursement and per diem returned by the state. It was stated \$1,192 was disbursed in 2012 for that convention. In the end 2 motions were presented:

Motion #1 - council 11187 will pay for \$XX for 2 attendees, 2 spouses and 2 children registration and banquet cost fees totaling \$XXX. Motion was made by Wayne Patterson, seconded by Edd Chinnock voted on and passed.

Motion #2 - council 1187 will disperse up to \$499 for each of the 2 attendees to cover convention expenses outside of the before mentioned convention registration / banquet fees (based on turned in receipts - motel and gasoline were discussed). Any per diem granted by the State will be returned to the council. Motion was made by Mike Phillips and seconded by Terry Reine, voted on and passed.

New Business: Several Knights mentioned a future discussion and possible by-law changes should take place regarding convention attendance and expenses well in advance of the 2013-14 State event.

An idea was brought up to purchase K of C name tags for the Knights who act as ushers at masses. After some discussion it was mentioned permission from Father would be needed and the church provides other badges. The idea was withdrawn.

Wayne Patterson mentioned that the Seton teacher appreciation dinner would be held Apr 13th and our council has been asked to assist with serving and cleanup.

Cash Bonanza: Brother Sillings reported the first turn-in of the Cash Bonanza tickets was completed and encouraged his fellow

Knights to continue selling / buying these tickets. The deadline and next turn in will be May 17th. The council receives \$XXX per ticket sold.

Council Officer Duties

Gentlemen, the time has come for our election of officer's for the next fraternal year. Many ask at this time, of the duties of the positions. These are listed here below for your consideration. Those not included here...Financial Secretary, Lecturer, and Chaplain...are due to the fact that they are appointed by either the Grand Knight or Supreme.

For any of you who wish to eventually attain the position of Grand Knight, a good practice (but, not a requirement) is to hold all offices. This aids you in directing your officers once in the top spot.

Grand Knight: The Grand Knight is responsible for the welfare of the council. He presides over council meetings, acts as an ex-officio member of all committees, appoints a membership and programming director, convenes officers for a monthly meeting, and ensures all necessary reports are submitted to the state and Supreme Council. He should also be aware of the council's financial status and ensure that his signature appears on all checks drawn. The Grand Knight is a member of the Advisory Board with general supervision of the council's Columbian Squire circle.

Deputy Grand Knight: The Deputy Grand Knight is second in command. He assists the Grand Knight with council affairs and fulfills all duties assigned to him by the Grand Knight. Should the Grand Knight be absent from a council meeting, the Deputy Grand Knight presides. He is chairman of the council's retention committee and also a member of the Advisory Board charged with overseeing the council's sponsored Columbian Squires circle.

Chancellor: The Chancellor has a variety of responsibilities. Primarily, he assists the Grand Knight and the Deputy Grand Knight in the execution of their duties and oversees the council in both their absences. He is charged with strengthening the members' interests in council activities. The Chancellor is chairman of the admission committee and a member of the Columbian Squires circle ceremonial team.

Recorder: The Recorder is similar to a court reporter or a secretary. He is responsible for maintaining a true record of all actions of the council and its correspondence.

Treasurer: The Treasurer is responsible for the safekeeping and maintaining records of all council funds and accounts. He is responsible for depositing money into the council's accounts and provides a certificate of such monies to the Grand Knight. He is also responsible for payment of all expenses.

Advocate: The Advocate is the legal representative of the council and serves as the council's attorney at trials and investigations of any interest to the council. While he does not need to be a member of the legal profession, he should be familiar with the council by-laws, the Order's Charter, Constitution and Laws, Methods of Conducting a Council Meeting, and Robert's Rules of Order.

Warden: The Warden is the 'watchdog' for council property and degree paraphernalia, except the property of the financial secretary, treasurer and recorder. He is also responsible for setting up the council chambers for meetings and ceremonial work. During ceremonial exemplifications, he will appoint and supervise guards.

Inside/Outside Guards: The Guards have similar responsibilities, but distinct differences. The Outside Guard tends to the outer door admitting visitors and members to the inner door. Once at the inner door, the Inside Guard checks to make sure that their membership cards are current.

Board of Trustees: The Board of Trustees consists of three members elected by the council and the Grand Knight, who serves as chairman of the board. They oversee the work of the Financial Secretary and Treasurer, and with the Deputy Grand Knight serve on the council's retention committee. During council elections, only the Three-year Trustee is voted on, with the others moving on to become two and one-year trustees, respectively.

Respect Life: PDHC Pickerington

As I told you last month, The Pregnancy Decisions Health Care board voted to open a PDHC office in Pickerington to offer women a pro-life alternative to abortion. PDHC offers free ultrasounds, referrals to pro-life doctors, help to women in crisis pregnancy situations, and abstinence education. PDHC type clinics have proven to be some of the best defenses against abortion. PDHC has selected a site in Pickerington and is currently in negotiations to secure that location.

The PDHC fundraising dinner was a huge success! About 280 people attended and over \$40,000 was raised. Keynote speaker David Mahan from Eagle Rock Church in Pickerington described the abortion problem in Ohio, Fairfield County, and Pickerington. He also discussed abstinence education and how PDHC sponsors abstinence education in many school systems, including Pickerington. As an abstinence educator he is right on the front lines and can share many stories directly from the students themselves.

One of the highlights of the evening was when courageous Worthington area student Caleb described how he was scheduled to be aborted but his mother stood up against pressure from her parents and decided to have him. She made the difficult and unselfish decision to give him up for adoption to a wonderful, loving family. Caleb gave a truly inspiring witness.

Another highlight was when Whitney, a PDHC client, described her unintended pregnancy while she was still in college. She considered abortion in spite of being raised in a pro-life family, but when a friend directed her to PDHC she realized she could not

kill her baby. She elected to continue her pregnancy with PDHC's help and also decided to give her child up for adoption. Hearing from someone directly helped by PDHC really let the people at the banquet see the good that PDHC does.

Thank you to the many Knights that did attend the banquet and for your generous donations. Along with the approximately \$5,000 raised with the baby bottle campaign, we have made a great start on funding the Pickerington PDHC location. We are still a long way from the total funds needed to support a PDHC office in Pickerington, however. So if you were unable to make the fundraising banquet for some reason (like opening night of the golf league), please make a donation to PDHC.
