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Business Meeting Notes - October 9, 2013

The meeting was called to order at 7:31 by Grand Knight George Schneider. Missed by one minute!

Roll Call of Officers:

All officers were in attendance with the exception of our Chaplain, Advocate, Inner Guard, 2 Year Trustee, 3 Year Trustee and Lecturer.

The minutes of the last meeting were motioned for approval by Dick Petersen/Edd Chinnock, seconded by Mike Sillings, voted on and passed.

Chaplain's Report: Deacon Hector spoke in place of Father Klima and spoke on a Bible Study group and the their amazing stories and reminded us that "God has given us EVERYTHING". He also showed us a vial of water from the Jordan River which he brought back with him from his trip to Israel...where all in attendance renewed their Baptismal promises. He challenged us all to be spokesmen of these promises!

Membership Committee Report: There were no new forms to be reviewed. We will still try to have a First Degree Ceremony this month on 10/23 with some candidates we have waiting.

Raising Funds for Life:

God has given me the health and strength to be able to have run the Columbus Marathon on Sunday, October 20th with a time of 4 hours and 7 minutes. This was my 47th marathon overall.

As many of you know, I am a strong advocate for the Pro-Life cause. Pro-Life activities are very close to my heart and I ran my 2nd marathon in support of life, from conception to natural death.

The month of October is dedicated as the month where we especially acknowledge that all life is precious and comes from God. As the 41st anniversary of Roe v. Wade and the annual March for Life approaches, I decided to help raise funds again this year for the Pregnancy Decision Health Center (PDHC), My goal this year is to raise \$2,620 for the charity "Momentum."

I am still accepting donations toward this goal. You can find me online at www.gomogo.org (find runner "Hector Raymond.") or send gifts to Pregnancy Decision Health Center (PDHC), 665 E. Dublin Granville Rd. Suite 120, Columbus, OH 43229 with memo with my name as runner. You can also make checks out to me and I will apply them on line in your name. All proceeds will be given to PDHC in Columbus.

Update: To date, I have raised \$751.30. I still have to raise \$1,868.70. All donations are tax deductible. Just a note, as many of you know, the Samuel's clinic has moved down the street from Seton Parish and is now operational. The PDHC is one of many ways you can help give our young mothers a choice. Many of them feel that they have no choice. Clinics like the Samuel's clinic give them only one choice, abortion. PDHC gives them the gift of a choice for life. Respect Life: Abortion Rate Update

Early in October the Ohio Department of Health released the **2012 Ohio Abortion Report** (it takes almost a year to compile the figures). After the historic 12 percent drop in abortions in 2011, abortions in 2012 remained near the lowest levels ever, even with a slight rise in from 2011. The 25,473 abortions is the second lowest level since 1976.

The 2012 report also reveals a:

5.3 percent overall increase within the African American community.

1.7 percent overall decrease within the white community.

30 percent decrease in abortions after 19 weeks gestation.

Decrease in teen abortions and increases in age groups older than 20.

Increases in major metropolitan areas of Cuyahoga, Franklin, Hamilton counties.

Mike Gonidakis, President of Ohio Right to Life had this to say: "As the first African American president, Barack Obama acted with complete irresponsibility and dangerous disregard by campaigning for and bringing business to an organization that has historically targeted minority communities. The results speak for themselves: abortions among whites went down while abortions among African Americans increased."

On another note, my wife and I just returned from a wonderful trip to South Korea and Thailand. My Air Force son is stationed in Korea and we went to see him and his family. While there, we also went to Thailand with them for a family vacation. Both countries are beautiful with warm, friendly people. Both countries are about 95% Buddhist, which frowns on killing any living thing. So it is no surprise that abortion is illegal in both countries, except for rape, incest, if a mother's life is in danger, or for severe fetal abnormalities. What is a surprise is that both countries have among the highest abortion rates in Asia. Apparently, their governments are not enforcing anti-abortion laws very well, though some Pro-Life doctors are challenging that.

Human trafficking is a problem in both countries, especially Thailand, which has some of the highest rates in the world. South Korea is a modern country with bustling cities and a high standard of living, but Thailand is much poorer. Even though women are making progress in Thailand - their Prime Minister is a woman - the desire for male offspring and the low regard for girl children leads some families to sell girl children to get money to survive. Once sold, the life of these girls is harsh and cruel with little option to ever escape it. We need to pray for these unfortunate girls while we work to stop human trafficking wherever it occurs.

Finally, the bus trip to DC is not too far away. The SPY leadership team is generating enthusiasm for the trip and expects to have a lot of response. The Mount Carmel of Buckeye Lake youth group is doing the same. If they achieve their expected results, we will only have a few seats available on the bus for other adult riders, **so if you are interested in going on this great trip with us, please let me know ASAP.** The cost this year is \$170/person, based on

staying two to a room. The cost includes the bus trip, hotel, and breakfast at the hotel.

Please come join us in prayer at the sidewalk in front of the Complete Women's Health Care clinic on Mondays and Tuesdays from 3 to 5pm and Saturdays from 10 to noon. We need to let Dr. Samuel know we do not want them in Pickerington!

Major Change to Council Operations

Saluting our Veterans

November 11, 2010 is Veterans day. What is Veterans day?

“**Veterans Day** is an American holiday honoring military veterans. Both a federal holiday and a state holiday in all states, it's always celebrated on November 11th each year. It is also celebrated as Armistice Day or Remembrance Day in other parts of the world, falling on November 11, the anniversary of the signing of the Armistice that ended World War I. (Major hostilities of World War I were formally ended at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918 with the German signing of the Armistice.)”

In 1954 the Holiday was changed from Armistice Day to Veterans Day to honor American Veterans of all wars.

The difference between Veterans Day and Memorial Day

Memorial Day honors service members who died in service to their country or as a result of injuries incurred during battle. Deceased veterans are also remembered on Veterans Day but the day is set aside to thank and honor living veterans who served honorably in the military - in wartime or peacetime.

Also did you know that the holiday is commonly printed as *Veteran's Day* or *Veterans' Day* in calendars and advertisements. While these spellings are grammatically acceptable, the United States government has declared that the attributive (no apostrophe) rather than the possessive case is the official spelling.

We are privileged to have veterans as members of our council. The next time you see one of them, thank them for their service. Without them and the sacrifices they made, we would not live in the greatest country in the world.
