Secret societies and fraternal organizations were abundant. And besides, Catholics weren't well-liked or highly thought-of. There was even some Catholic resistance to the idea of the Knights of Columbus. Local priests took issue with the concept. A similar Catholic group even refused to allow Father McGiveny to establish a branch of their organization in Connecticut...It was seemingly inconceivable that an organization begun in such unwelcoming circumstances would go on to become one of the world's largest Catholic fraternal organizations.

As Knights we should be proud to continue Father McGiveny's vision and I would like to ask you all to welcome the six new Knights to our council. Thanks to Frank Piper for his hard work and ideas and thanks to all of the Knights who came to the First Degree. It was quiet impressive for our Deputy Director to see this kind of turn-out and outstanding ceremony.

There is a possibility that we will have another First Degree in April which will put us close to the Star Council Award. Continue the "Consider Yourself Asked" program to recruit new Knights to our council.

Our third fish fry turned out to be our second highest "meals served" fish fry ever! We had a great turnout of Knights. We also had a lot of new Knights coming in to help with clean up. ## RESOLUTION: State Convention Attendance (Reference Article X)

The State Convention is a business trip for the delegates. Delegates are normally the Grand Knight and Deputy Grand Knight, or may be appointed by the Grand Knight in the event of either the Grand Knight or Deputy Grand Knight's lack of availability.

The Council shall provide a stipend (Per Diem. To be given to the Delegate prior to the convention) for attending, and is used to cover any expense incurred by the Convention (Entertainment, Food, Laundry, etc.)

Depending on the location of the Convention, the Council will pay the following, per delegate, with proper receipts):

**OUT-OF-TOWN** (requiring overnight accommodations):

**Registration Fee:** (to include Delegate, their Spouse, and up to two (2) Children (16 and under, with the exception of the child being a Columbian Squire, then the age range will be up to 18 years of age), is attending). This fee will be paid up-front by the Council, to reserve places for the Delegates, and does not require a receipt.

**Hotel Room:** (including tax and fees). Any extra services provided by the hotel at an extra expense (e.g. in-room movies, mini bar, etc.) shall be paid by the Delegate. A receipt will be required of the Delegate.

**Total Travel Mileage:** (at the current rate, as advised by the State Council). All reimbursements from the State Council for mileage will go directly to the Council. A receipt will be required of the Delegate.

**TOTAL PER DIEM EXPENSES:** \$200.00 (Broken down as follows: Travel Day: \$50.00, Convention Day: \$100.00, Return Day: \$50.00)

**IN-TOWN** (NOT requiring overnight accommodations):

**Registration Fee:** (to include Delegate and their Spouse only)

**Total Travel Mileage:** (at the current rate, as advised by the State Council). All reimbursements from the State Council for mileage will go directly to the Council. A receipt will be required of the Delegate.

**TOTAL PER DIEM EXPENSES:** \$100 (Broken down as follows: Travel Day: \$25.00, Convention Day, \$50.00, Return Day: \$25.00)

## Respect Life: At The Movies

Recently, Vicki and I went to the Marcus Theatre here in Pickerington to see the movie "God's Not Dead". This is a wonderful movie that every Knight should see. The story revolves around a college philosophy professor who requires every student in his class to sign a paper stating that "God is dead". One student, a Christian, refuses to sign the paper even though the professor threatens to fail him. The professor then tells the student he has 20 minutes in each of the next three classes to prove to the class that God is NOT dead. If he cannot convince the entire class, he will fail the course, which could jeopardize his chances of getting into law school. There are several intertwined stories that keep the movie interesting between classes.

But "God's Not Dead" isn't the only message in this article. Prior to seeing that movie, we took our two young grandchildren to the Marcus to see a family movie. While we were waiting for both these movies to start, we saw advertisements for notorious abortion doctor Samuel's Complete Healthcare for Women clinic in Pickerington. We found it to be very offensive for abortionists to be advertising where impressionable children and young people can see their ads.

Vicki and I were not the only ones offended - Deacon Hector told me he went to a movie at Marcus and when they showed Dr. Samuels ad he got his money back and left the theater. Several other people from Seton have also expressed concern over these ads. I will leave it up to you to decide if you want to boycott Marcus Theatres, follow Deacon Hector's lead and ask for your money back, or take some other action.

The Pick-Life group decided to try to get these ads removed so I called the general manager of the theater and talked to him about it. I found out that the ads come from the regional director in the Milwaukee headquarters of Marcus Theatres. He gave me the name of this director and I talked to him about this. He said he would consider our request but had to get approval from his team.

We need to give him a little push to do the right thing and drop these ads, so **we are asking EVERY Knight, his wife, his family, and anyone else you know to write to Marcus Theatres and request that they not carry ads for Complete Healthcare for Women.**
