For those of you that do not know, the purpose of the State Tour is to inform the Ohio Councils in each Diocese throughout the State, how the State General Program is doing, a progress update, how we finished with our Supreme Council Quotas and what areas we need to focus on going forward.

Ironically, one area of focus for the state this year is something I mentioned in my first letter and that is Participation by the membership in all Ohio Councils, much as I stated, our state officers said the same, "We want to get councils participating from the start and keep them participating, the goal is 100% participation...!" So, brothers, I can not say it enough, we have a huge membership, our fine Financial Secretary corrected me from last month we have 243 members in our council, what that means to me, a lot of hands to help carry the load, if we get 100% participation, there is not much we, as a council, cannot achieve. We are going to get quite busy in the next couple of months, there will be plenty of opportunity to help out, so now is the time to start.

The other area of focus, as always, but with even more emphasis this year is new members, we are at a 20 year low last year for the State, some of that is attributable to attrition, we have lost many members over the last two years and that number goes against the new member tally, none the less, new membership is down, the goal is one new member per month, per council, I believe that number is achievable for our council, we are all recruiters, and I am a firm believer that there are a lot of men in our church that are simply waiting to be asked, please extend your hand and ask.

The State Deputy and his staff were quite impressed with our Council and very appreciative that we were able to host the State Tour this year, and hope we'll do it again next year.

I hope we are all enjoying this summer, be safe, and get involved. Thanks!


