 We forget what we are taught.

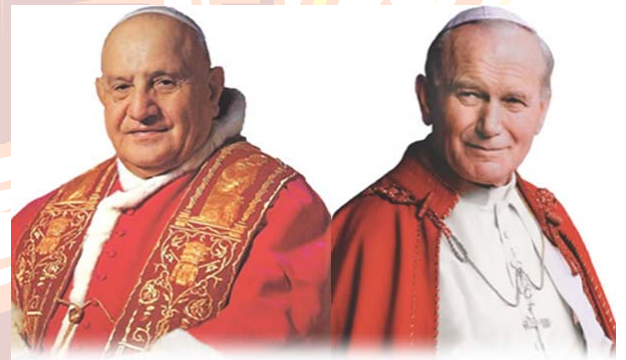

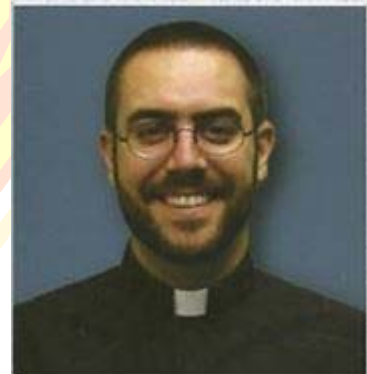

Business Meeting Notes - April 9, 2014

The meeting was called to order promptly at 7:30 by Grand Knight George Schneider

Roll Call of Officers:

All were present except our Inside Guard, Chancellor, and Trustee 3 Year who were absent. Our Chaplain and Treasurer were a tad tardy ... but were excused.

The minutes of the last meeting were motioned for approval by Wayne Patterson, seconded by Edd Chinnock, voted on and passed.

Chaplain's Report: No Report.

Membership and Reading of Applications: Reading of application for Frank Hoverman was unanimously accepted. Frank works at the Buckeye Boys Ranch, teaches religious education and reportedly has a great singing voice. Another First Degree Ceremony is tentatively scheduled for April 30, 2014. All new Knights at this Degree will receive a special certificate in honor of the canonization of Popes John Paul II and John XXIII.

Grand Knight's Report: G.K. George Schneider then conducted his report listing the following:

The Ministry Market Place was declared a success as at least five Form 100's were passed out. George thanked all who helped man the table.

George then asked some of our new Knights in attendance to introduce themselves and brothers Shawn Roberts, Dave Criminski, and Mike Kroll were welcomed in to the fold.

George then quickly mentioned items which will be covered later in the newsletter on the Car show, the success of the Fish Fry events, and a list of events occurring later this month.

Treasurer Report: Brother Mike Phillips was not immediately present, but we spoke about the "Magnet Sales" and how we are the distributor for the entire state and desperately need somebody to market these sales ... sending out notice to the newspapers, council newsletters, and maybe even setting up a quick blurb on the Catholic Radio station. If you have any inkling for this type of council commitment, please contact our Grand Knight! This is a tremendous money maker for our Council, with plenty of room to grow!

Financial Secretary Report: Brother Frank Hare read our bills and especially noted that the new griddles for next falls Pancake Breakfasts had arrived. He then declared out Membership at 249 strong with the six new members still being processed. We also have four Honorary members and eight Honorary Life members. The bills were motioned to be sent to the trustees for review and initialing, voted upon, passed, and then delivered and paid.

Report of the Trustees: The Officers slate for next year's election is almost complete. If anyone has an urge to run for a position, the responsibilities of each are listed later in this newsletter. Nominations will be accepted at the next meeting.

Chancellor's Report: No Report

Recorders Report: No report, but thanks to all who covered for Mike as he was out of town on business last month.

Report on Programs and Committees:

Membership Committee Report: No Report.

Program Director: No report, but reportedly we are on track for our reports to report.

Church Director: Brother Wayne Patterson mentioned that he still needs to talk to Father about collecting donations for our seminarians after Masses. He also mentioned the Chalices for Father are ordered and a sample should be ready for approval soon. He then reminded us of the upcoming events:

April 26 1st Communion Masses (same weekend as the Exemplification). 9:30 am and 1:00 pm - Please sign up for whatever Mass you can attend.

May 21 Confirmation Mass with the Bishop

May 25 40th Anniversary Mass at St. Pius in honor of Msgr. Funk - set up time at 11:00AM. The Mass begins at noon.

Council Director: Brother Glen Williams first listed those who were honored with our "Of the Year" awards whose write ups should be later in this newsletter. We thank each and every one for showing us what it means to be a servant of our Lord. Brother Glen then asked for one final great turn out for assistance at our final Fish Fry. We are sure you did not let him (us) down!

Community Director: Brother Thom Laughery reminded us all of the "Measure Up" campaign to be run the first week in May. Please volunteer to stand and collect when called. He also announced we will again march in the Labor Day parade after considering the 4th of July parade as an alternative. Labor Day "wins" due to its proximity to the Seton Festival.

Family Director: No report this month.

Youth Director: Brother Jesse Garcia mentioned that attention is in preparation for the HS Retreat. Brother Gene Ebert then ecstatically announced that **seven** scholarship applications have been turned in.

Squires Report: Brother Mike Phillips stated the Squires are thankful for the opportunity to sell sodas at the Fish Fry events as they have made a decent profit. They also look forward to assisting with the Car Show. He included that their next activity would be stuffing plastic eggs with candy and treats in preparation for the "Easter Egg Hunt" at Seton on April 19th beginning at 11:00am. Come out if you can assist! He then brazenly concluded with a challenge issued by the Squires to, play the Knights in a softball game on June 22nd at 2:00pm. The Knights readily accepted ... after assuring the location of the contest would be near in proximity to a Health Care Center! Brother Glen Williams will "coach" the Knights and burgers and brats will follow the game ... for those still standing.

Right to Life Director: Brother Edd Chinnock then reported that we still need people to assist in praying outside the Clinic on Hill Rd. He mentioned the visit by Shawn Carney, the originator of the Respect Life, and how groups now exist in all 50 states and over 20 countries! Council Officer Duties

Gentlemen, the time has come for our election of officer's for the next fraternal year. Many ask at this time, of the duties of the positions. These are listed here below for your consideration. Those not included here...Financial Secretary, Lecturer, and Chaplain...are due to the fact that they are appointed by either the Grand Knight or Supreme.

For any of you who wish to eventually attain the position of Grand Knight, a good practice (but, not a requirement) is to hold all offices. This aids you in directing your officers once in the top spot.

Grand Knight: The Grand Knight is responsible for the welfare of the council. He presides over council meetings, acts as an ex-officio member of all committees, appoints a membership and programming director, convenes officers for a monthly meeting, and ensures all necessary reports are submitted to the state and Supreme Council. He should also be aware of the council's financial status and ensure that his signature appears on all checks drawn. The Grand Knight is a member of the Advisory Board with general supervision of the council's Columbian Squire circle.

Deputy Grand Knight: The Deputy Grand Knight is second in command. He assists the Grand Knight with council affairs and fulfills all duties assigned to him by the Grand Knight. Should the Grand Knight be absent from a council meeting, the Deputy Grand Knight presides. He is chairman of the council's retention committee and also a member of the Advisory Board charged with overseeing the council's sponsored Columbian Squires circle.

Chancellor: The Chancellor has a variety of responsibilities. Primarily, he assists the Grand Knight and the Deputy Grand Knight in the execution of their duties and oversees the council in both their absences. He is charged with strengthening the members' interests in council activities. The Chancellor is chairman of the admission committee and a member of the Columbian Squires circle ceremonial team.

Recorder: The Recorder is similar to a court reporter or a secretary. He is responsible for maintaining a true record of all actions of the council and its correspondence.

Treasurer: The Treasurer is responsible for the safekeeping and maintaining records of all council funds and accounts. He is responsible for depositing money into the council's accounts and provides a certificate of such monies to the Grand Knight. He is also responsible for payment of all expenses.

Advocate: The Advocate is the legal representative of the council and serves as the council's attorney at trials and investigations of any interest to the council. While he does not need to be a member of the legal profession, he should be familiar with the council by-laws, the Order's Charter, Constitution and Laws, Methods of Conducting a Council Meeting, and Robert's Rules of Order.

Warden: The Warden is the 'watchdog' for council property and degree paraphernalia, except the property of the financial secretary, treasurer and recorder. He is also responsible for setting up the council chambers for meetings and ceremonial work. During ceremonial exemplifications, he will appoint and supervise guards.

Inside/Outside Guards: The Guards have similar

responsibilities, but distinct differences. The Outside Guard tends to the outer door admitting visitors and members to the inner door. Once at the inner door, the Inside Guard checks to make sure that their membership cards are current.

Board of Trustees: The Board of Trustees consists of three members elected by the council and the Grand Knight, who serves as chairman of the board. They oversee the work of the Financial Secretary and Treasurer, and with the Deputy Grand Knight serve on the council's retention committee. During council elections, only the Three-year Trustee is voted on, with the others moving on to become two and one-year trustees, respectively.
