Business Meeting Notes - August 13, 2014

The Installation of Officers began at 6:30PM under the direction of D.D Joe Dickman. Deacon Hector then blessed the Officer Jewels with water from the Jordan River. The installation was highly dignified and formal.

The official meeting came to order a tad earlier than our original 7:30 start time.

Roll Call of Officers: All were present with the exception of our Inside Guard and Trustee 2 Year.

The minutes of the last meeting were motioned for approval by Wayne Patterson, seconded by George Schneider, voted on and passed.

Chaplains Report: Deacon Hector...sitting in for Fr. Klima... spoke on the following topics:

He gave us thanks for the chalices, now used at all masses. Deacon Raymond next thanked those Knights who assisted with the altar server training.

Our good Deacon then gave us some statistics to ponder on the results of a University of Texas survey. The survey focused on social norms in an increasingly permissive society. The first item mentioned that 58% of those born in the U.S. today are to unwed mothers. Wow. He next listed percentages of groups...ranging from church going Christians who oppose single sex marriages to the opposite end including gay and lesbians who are non-Christians...on those who agree with or strongly agree with the following social norms:

- Viewing pornography is OK
- Premarital cohabitation is good
- No-strings-attached sex is OK
- Couples with kids should stay married except if abused
- Marital infidelity is sometimes OK
- It is OK for 3+ adults to live a sexual relationship
- I support abortion rights

The results showed polarized stands, as one would expect. Those to the Christian end were lower in acceptance for all items... except the fourth where they wished couples with children to stay married at most costs. The more permissive life style end of the scale showed percentages as high in approval for all items. The exception was on for the fourth item where children in a marriage did not seem as important of a deciding factor on remaining together. Although we must respect the lifestyles of others, the permissiveness it brings to our society is sad.

Membership and Reading of Applications: There were no new application forms to read at this time.

Grand Knight's Report: G.K. Glen Williams listed the following important items for our consideration:

School is back in session. Drive careful in the neighborhoods.

Our G.K. then thanked all officers and program directors in a great Officer's Meeting and establishment of programs and our budget.

He next listed the need to fill the following positions...a Vocations Director, Measure up Coordinator, Pennies for Heaven Coordinator and Matching Funds leader. Please consider taking over one of these spots as an individual or with a friend.

Our budget for last year showed only a 1.9% deviance...which means we are sending out what comes in...money-wise. That is our charge.

G.K. Glen then mentioned that we are behind in placement of five Memorial plaques. This will be reconciled.

Brother Williams then thanked our First Degree team for a great ceremony and our new Knights. The next session is set for September 24.

Our Council conducted the State Tour in July. Brother Wayne Patterson and Tom Laughery served as hosts. The State Officers were very grateful. The focus of the Knights for the next year is membership, participation, and Pennies for Heaven. We should have no problem fitting our programs into these areas.

Grand Knight Williams reminded us all of the Squires softball Challenge coming this Sunday! (*Recorder note: Our brother Knights met the challenge and the Squires were defeated. We unfortunately had one casualty as Brother Mike Sillings blew out a few Achilles tendons with surgery coming soon.*)

We also received some communications from Karl Anderson on Food for Family and received some money back from last years' service.

Treasurer Report: Brother Mike Phillips read the numbers and stated our situation is more than sound.

Financial Secretary Report: Brother Frank Hare read the bills. These were then motioned for payment by Wayne Patterson, seconded by Frank Piper and sent on to the trustees for payment. Brother Hare announced that both our audit and budget are finished for the next year.

Report of the Trustees: The Trustees reported that Ron Blymire must resign from his position as Inside Guard. Place your nominations now. We thank you Ron, for your dedication to the post and your excellent running of the Blue Coat Dinner function. Don't be a stranger.

Chancellors Report: Brother Frank Piper combined his Chancellor report with a Membership update. He informed us that our quota for membership for this fiscal year is seventeen and is six for new insurance members. Please search out a Form 100 and ask a friend. We will host a new Member Pizza Party sometime this fall. Our next First Degree is September 24.

Recorders Report: No Report.

Report on Programs and Committees:

Program Director: Brother Richard Petersen reported that we are on track with Programs and asked us to all help with the Seton Festival in September...and the Fall Family Festival. The latter date is October 25.

Church Director: Brother Wayne Patterson had no report, but mentioned the Chalices were in and Father loves them.

Community Director: Brother Thom Laughery reminded us that we would be marching in the Labor Day Parade and assured somebody would tow the float. (*Recorder note: the march was well attended and quite the success!*) Thom continued with reminders of the upcoming events such as the Festival, Thanksgiving Basket donations, Christmas Coat drive and more.

Respect Life - Upcoming Events

Respect Life is alive and well in Pickerington! The Pick-Life group met recently to plan future events and will be involved in quite a few in the next few months.

First is the Labor Day parade in Pickerington on September 1. Pick-Life marchers and other community members will be handing out flyers and candy, so watch for us!

September 13 is the National Day of Memorial for Victims of Abortion. Columbus Right to Life is hosting this event, but a final location has not been determined yet. It might be in Pickerington, so watch the bulletin for more details. Over 55 million babies have been lost to Abortion since the 1973 Roe v Wade Supreme Court decision legalized abortion in the U.S. Come help us remember all those lost souls.

Father Frank Pavone of Priests for Life is the keynote speaker at the Columbus PDHC fundraising banquet on September 17 at Villa Milano. I have heard Fr. Pavone speak several times and he is a dynamic speaker who does a wonderful job of explaining the various Respect Life issues. If you have never heard him speak, you owe it to yourself to come to this banquet. Let me know if you want to go so we can get tables for our group. The banquet is free and Villa Milano does a great job with the food, but you will be asked to donate to PDHC.

On September 24, the fall 40 Days for Life campaign will begin at Founders mill on E. Broad St. It will last until November 2. The Seton Respect Life group has not selected a day to pray there, but I will let you know when we do. Please join us in prayer for victims of abortion - both the babies and the mothers, fathers, and families.

Dr. Monica Migliorino Miller is a Pro-Life leader who was one of the earliest advocates for the right to life. She wrote a book, *Abandoned-The Untold Story of the Abortion Wars*, about her personal experience as a pro-life leader, talking women out of abortions, retrieving aborted unborn from clinic trash dumpsters, and much more. I have read this book and it is very moving and challenging - to see what she and the other early abortion foes did is very impressive. Dr. Miller will be speaking at St. Andrews on Saturday, October 4, at a free event to honor the Columbus Right to Life sidewalk counselors. It is open to all, and Dr. Miller should be a great speaker to hear. You can register for this on the GCRTL website.

Former Ohio State great Chris Spielman is the keynote speaker at the Lancaster PDHC fundraising banquet on October 21. I am sure I do not have to tell all you Buckeye fans about Chris, but he is a dynamic, committed speaker who is sure to move you with his testimony. This is a free dinner at a church in Lancaster (I will get the exact location and let you know) but donations will be requested. Please contact me if you would like to go so we can sponsor a table for the Seton group.

Finally, on September 25 there will be a Prayer-a-thon, with youth groups from around Columbus. I will have more details in my next article, but mark your calendars to attend this important event. Even if you cannot attend, please support our youth with your pledge.

As you can see, there is a lot going on! Please join us for as many of these events as possible – only by standing up for life can we truly return to a Culture of Life.

My husband, Wayne, played in this above mentioned softball game also. He told me the Squires had challenged the Knights, and they must play to prove they could still play and beat these young men, half their age. In Wayne case, the squires are more than three times younger than he is.

I actually begged him not to play. He assured me he would probably only have to play a couple of innings. He said lots of Knights were coming to play and it would be all right!

Well, that isn't what happened. Only six Knights showed up to play. I assume many of the other Knight's wives were able to talk their husbands out of taking such a foolish risk.

Now, I am not calling anyone who did play a fool. I'm just saying that in any challenge, a man should consider his over all health, his age, his risk of injury and weigh that against the challenge. My empathy goes out to poor Mike, Danielle and Emma! Mike is much closer than Wayne is, to the age of the Squires, and he was hurt very badly. I'm asking, "Is the risk of injury worth proving a point?"

Wayne did have to play every inning, as did all the men who took part in this game against the Squires.

I am thankful that he did return home without having a heart attack, a busted head, a broken hand, a broken leg or even worse.

But, poor Mike did get hurt. No, it wasn't anyone's fault. No one wanted to hurt anyone. The point I am trying to make is this: "Never take chances with your health for any reason, especially not to prove to some young people that "you've still got it!" (Whatever "It" is?) The welfare of your own health and your family's financial security is much more important than taking a risk like that."

I hope all the mature and more experienced Knights, O.K. all you old guys, like Wayne, have learned a lesson from poor Mike's misery! NO softball game challenge is worth all that suffering!!! NONE!!!

To the Squires, I would like to make a request. The next time you feel like challenging the Knights to a sport, I have a few suggestions:

4. Corn Hole Toss
5. Horse Shoes

Whatever you decide, please make it a non-life and limb threatening event, O.K.? Promise? Thank you all!
