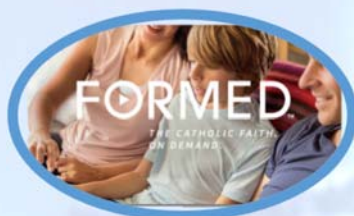

Here's how easy it is to get FORMED: First, if you are not registered on our parish web site (<http://www.setonparish.com>) do so at your earliest convenience. Once registered you will notice the Formed.org oval at the bottom center of our homepage. Click that oval and the program will take you to a page containing a statement concerning "Safe Environment." Read the statement. If you agree, click the button and submit the form. The program will take you to a page with the parish code. Copy the code and then click on the picture. This will take you to the <http://www.formed.org> website. Click the Sign up button on the upper right and enter the parish code provided and follow the instructions on how to setup your own account. Now set up a username - whatever username you'll remember and a password. You can keep it simple now and change it later if you want.
