Roll Call of Officers: Missing were the Chaplain, 3rd Year Trustee, and Lecturer, all were excused. Ralph Blamer motioned to approve the minutes from last month's meeting, Edd Chinnock 2nd. Voted upon and passed.

Chaplains Report: Absent, no report.

Membership and Reading of Applications: Shawn Roberts, no report.

Grand Knight's Report: GK Jesus Garcia reported receiving a phone call and email pertaining to a donation to purchase an Ultra Sound Machine, directed to Chapter that has 41 councils. Contacted in regards to a Christmas billboard in Lancaster, we do the Christmas magnets instead. Clergy Dinner will be 1/13/19, cost is \$35 per person, RSVP by 1/6/19, will ask Father Jim and Deacon Hector, consider getting a table. There is a new procedure from the State for retention, starts with 1st billing documentation, a hand written note is needed with reason if resigning from the Council.

Treasurer Report: Dan Murphy sent out the financial report to the officers and program chairs, let him know if there are any questions. Taxes have been filed. Year end RFRs, scan/email to Dan by 12/16/18.
