Membership Meeting Notes - January 12 2022

Note this was a combined meeting

Grand Knight Thom Laughery called the Business Planning meeting to order at 6:30 pm with prayer and then the Membership meeting started immediately afterward at 7:10 pm.

Roll Call of Officers: Missing were the Chaplain, Advocate, Outside Guard, 2nd Year Trustee, and Lecturer, all excused. Ralph Blamer motioned to approve the minutes from last month's meeting, Bob Coholich 2nd. Voted upon and passed.

Chaplains Report: Absent, no report.

Advocate Report: Mark Decker who is assisting Shawn Roberts since he is now working 2nd shift reported that he has reviewed National, State and the Council By-Laws written in 1993. He needs copies of any resolutions since then so he can update the By-Laws, both Jesus Garcia and Frank Hare will work with him on the updated resolutions.

Membership and Reading of Applications: Tim Lee reported that there are no new members.

Grand Knight's Report: DK Thom Laughery talked about the upcoming next quarter activities. The Wives Appreciation Dinner that was scheduled for 2/12/22 will now be on Saturday, 5/14/22; consider moving the Blue Coat Dinner scheduled for 5/7/22 to 6/4/22, will update at the next meeting; and Fish Fries start on 3/4/22. The Consecration to the Holy Family will occur on 1/16/22. A table for 8 has been reserved for the 1/30/22 Annual Clergy Dinner with Father Connolly, Father Ondrey, Deacon Greg Waybright, GK Thom Laughery, and DGK Francis Wilamosky along with their wives planning to attend. Read a Thank You letter from Monsignor Fairchild's family for the Knight's assistance as pallbearers and servers at his funeral mass. Read a Thank You card from Zack Goodchild, Seton's seminarian, for our continued support.

Chancellor Report: No report.

Treasurer Report: DJ Murphy sent out the financial report to the officers and program chairs, let him know if there are any questions or if anyone wants the numbers, all entries have been properly reconciled. The 2022 Liability Insurance policy has been paid for another year.

Financial Secretary Report: Frank Hare gave an update on membership dues paid for 2022, 63 members paid on line, another 75 paid by cash or check, 40 are Honorary Life and do not have to pay dues. 65 members still need to pay, a 2nd notice will be sent to them on 1/16/22. 3 members are no longer in the area, explained to them how to transfer out of our Council.

Trustee Report: The Trustees, Grand Knight, Treasurer and Financial Secretary will conduct an audit on 1/22/22 at 9 am.

Report on Programs and Committees

Program Director: No report.

Benevolent: Absent, no report

Community Director: Dan Murphy reported that there was 1 winner in the Football Frenzy contest from our Council ticket sales. Fairfield County 211 Hope Committee reported mental health referrals have been consistent over the past 4 years, but referrals for food, clothing, housing, utilities and transportation have been trending downward, low-income people and those over age 60 can get free tax filling assistance, PARC (Pickerington Area Resource Coalition) is discussing reactivating an interfaith council. A free dementia support group at Violet Springs is 1/20/22 at 5 pm. The St. Vincent de Paul truck this past weekend had less than the normal amount of donations, Meals on Wheels is looking for another partner where limited income

seniors can go for an outside meal since the Old Village Diner in Pickerington closed. Grace Fellowship Church is donating All Fairfield-Lancaster public transport bus fares for all Pickerington riders from 1/1 to 2/28/22.

Family Director: Chuck Slaby reported that the "Concretion to the Holy Family" will be 1/16/22; St. Patrick's Dinner will be Saturday, 3/19/22 and working on a Good Friday Family ceremony. Under Family, there are 5 programs listed with only two being required which are the "Concretion to the Holy Family and selecting the "Family of the Year" – will need nominations. The other three programs are having a Food Drive, Keep Christ in Christmas and the Good Friday Family promotion.

Right To Life: Mike Gohr indicated that the Respect for Life committee is planning an "End to Life" 2-hour educational program on 2/14/22 for Seton Parish with the Director for the Right to Life being the speaker. It was decided that the Knights of Columbus will be listed on the program.

Pancake Breakfast: Karl Schuster indicate that due to the current Covid concerns, the Pancake Breakfast scheduled for 1/16/22 will be cancelled, will revisit for the one scheduled for 2/20/22.

Fish Fry: Frank Hare asked everyone to mark their calendar as the first Fish Fry will be 3/4/22.

Public Relations: Francis Wilamosky stated the Council is registered, donated \$500 to be a sponsor for the Men's Conference on 2/26/22, and the Women's Conference on 2/19/22, received 4 tickets, need to determine how to distribute them. Plan to car pool from the Seton parking lot at 6:30 am, encourage everyone to attend.

He stated that we still need to conduct "Installation of Officers" ceremony for the new fraternal year; great meeting this evening; good crowd; the Council's forms are up to date; the Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity is due 1/31/22; semi audit is due 2/15/22; and the 1/1/22 Supreme Assessment reported that we are at 50% of reaching our membership goal for STAR award, will need 6 more new members; need to attend 2 insurance seminars; get 10784 form submitted electronically with Programs completed; have a realistic shot at getting STAR award for this fraternal year.
