Membership Meeting Notes - May 11, 2022

Prior to the meeting, JoEllen Gohr, President of the Board of Directors for the Bishop Griffin Resource Center, made a presentation pertaining to the special work their organization is doing as part of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul. Their services include a food pantry and thrift store on the east side of Columbus fighting poverty and offering assistance to those in need, currently serving 200 families per week. They are in the process of constructing a new building which will be a Mid-Ohio Market servicing all zip codes, expanding their services to include programming in Basic Needs, Health and Wellness, Education and Employment and Financial Literacy. Father Klima has joined the Board of Directors and is their spiritual advisor.
