Grand Knight Francis Wilamosky called the meeting to order at 7:03 pm with a prayer and Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll Call of Officers: Missing were the Chaplain and Deputy Grand Knight, both excused. Wayne Patterson motioned to approve the minutes from last month's meeting, George Bartos 2nd. Voted upon and passed.

Chaplains Report: Absent, no report.

Membership and Reading of Applications: Tim Lee reported we have 234 members, gained 1 member and lost 1 member.

Grand Knight's Report: GK Francis Wilamosky reported that a motion to accept the budget for fraternal year 2022/2023 will be voted on later in the meeting. A Retreat event with a theme of "Reflect Back, Look Forward" and team building will not be held on Saturday, 10/15/22, but later since it is not our 30th anniversary this October, Tim Bowie, George Bartos, Al Kluczynski, and John Heppner have volunteered to serve on the planning committee. Received an email from Michael Redmon, Life Program Coordinator for St. John XXIII Council, seeking volunteers to assist the Special Olympics softball tournament in Hillard on 8/21/22 from 8 am to 5 pm, if interested, please email Michael.redmond40@gmail.com. Gave a brochure pertaining to money market funds that the Knights offer paying 5% to 7% to our Financial Secretary to review. Looking for someone to help order shirts and find a new vendor for long sleeve shirts, passed around information from Ohio Select. Looking for someone to take over the role of Public Relations. Would like to see our Council become a Sponsor for the Seton Festival next year. Supreme suggest that the Grand Knight, Program Director, Family Director, and Community Director attend the "Safe Environment Training" program. Would like to see all Brothers go through the "Protecting God's Children" program, Brother Rob McKee has volunteered to present this 2-hour 15-minute program at Seton. Received a request from the Parish Secretary to drive Parishner Michael Armstrong to Grant Hospital for a medical procedure on either 8/12, 8/19 or 8/26/22.

Deputy Grand Knight: Frank Hare mentioned that DGK Dick Petersen is seeking volunteers to help rub pork butts on 8/10/22 and pull pork on 8/11/22 for the Seton Festival, 5 pm in the PAC.

Treasurer Report: DJ Murphy sent out the financial report to the officers and program chairs, let him know if there are any questions or if anyone wants a copy, entries have been properly reconciled. Explained that the budget for FY 2022/2023 proposes approximately \$XXX in income and \$XXX in expenses since we ended FY 2021/2022 with approximately \$XXX in our general account.

The new Master has not yet been announced. Fall Exemplification will be coming up, but no date has been set.

Community Director: Thom Laughery reported that he is working with PDHC (Pregnancy Decision Health Center) in Lancaster to see what their needs are that we can support. Supreme also has a program, ASAP, to assist pregnant women rather than having an abortion, for every \$XXX donated, get \$XXX back in a rebate. Financial Procedures

From time to time we need a refresher on Council procedures, so we set the “wayback” machine to a past article.

This article will attempt to clarify the financial procedures that have caused some past confusion and to explain some changes that will enable the Council to fully comply with directives from other authorities and to improve the Council’s financial accountabilities.

Budgets versus Authority to Spend

These items are separate processes. One has NO impact on the other. Budgets are used to guide the Council’s financial operations during the current year, while “authority to spend” is an approval process whether an item is included or not included in the budget. Including an item in the budget is NOT approval to spend unless it has been presented to the membership.

If you are one who routinely spends money on a particular item or event, i.e., chairperson, you may be asked to provide input into the planning for the budget; nevertheless, you must request membership approval to actually spend the money.

There are limited exceptions to this requirement. Our administrative cost are not voted on, this includes payments to Supreme and State Chapters for “per capita” and related membership expenses, etc.

All other expenditures will require membership approval before encumbering the funds. If it is a recurring expenditure, e.g., first Saturday, postage, meeting refreshments these expenses should be approved an annual basis and presented to the membership before hand. The budget process provides an excellent vehicle to track expenditures against the approved amount and will quickly hi-lite when an approved amount is exceeded and additional approval is required.

Non-anticipated expenses must be approved as the need arises.

No expenditures will be reimbursed without membership approval.

It is worth noting that exact amounts are not necessary for approval. A “not to exceed” amount is acceptable.

All requests for reimbursement of previously approved expenditures must be presented with a “Request for Reimbursement” form, which can be found on the web page, along with appropriate receipts. The form must be signed by the Knight making the expenditure and, for those events having multiple chairpersons; the form must be signed by all chairpersons. Requests should be presented in a timely manner and not left to accumulate. We will do our best to make reimbursement within 2 weeks of receiving the request.

Receipts and Deposits

All receipts and deposits must be processed through the Financial Secretary. No exceptions! The Financial Secretary will take possession of all receipts and deposits and will make himself available accordingly or will provide prior delegation. In the event that prior arrangements can not be made with the Financial Secretary to take possession, minimally, the Financial Secretary will be notified that a deposit has been made and the deposit receipt will be delivered to him. If the deposit is a night drop, a copy of the deposit form and a breakdown of the deposit by denomination will be presented to the Secretary prior to his contacting the bank. Night deposit bags and deposit forms are available from the Financial Secretary.

Steps for Council Approval of Expenditures

We try to keep things simple and workable for everyone, so we came up with this process. Following this will allow things to move in a forward manner.

1. Identify which Council Program your expense is related to.

Note: This newsletter contains the directors/chairman associated with each area

2. Discuss your expenditure with that Program Director.
3. The Program Director decides if they want to spend their budgeted funds. If not, and they feel it is worthwhile, they can discuss with another Director about partnering.
4. The expenditure is then presented at the officer's planning meeting by the Director. If the Director cannot attend, an email or phone discussion must occur with the GK. GK can then present.
5. Proper RFR and motion procedures must be followed.
6. The expenditure is then presented at the Membership meeting and voted on.

NOTE: Any expenditure brought up at the membership meeting will be tabled until presented at the Officer’s Planning meeting
