This month I would like all Knights to consider enriching their prayer life and faith knowledge by taking the time to review the memorials and Feast days included in the Catholic monthly calendar.

First, did you know there are three "firsts" in every month? The first Wednesdays are dedicated to the **Chaste Heart of St. Joseph**, the first Fridays are dedicated to the **Sacred Heart of Jesus** and the first Saturdays are dedicated to the **Immaculate Heart of Mary**. You can find the devotional prayers for each of these days easily with an internet search.

Next, did you know that September 8 is Mary's Birthday!!! Unfortunately, it falls on Sunday this year, but we can still give honor to Mary's Birthday. There also is the feast of "The most Holy Name of Mary" on the 12th and "Our Lady of Sorrows" on the 15th. The 14th brings the "Exultation of the Holy Cross" where we can recall the story of St. Helen and her quest to bring the remnants of the true cross back to the church.

Finally, there is a plethora of great saints honored this month. Health Corner - September 2025

Warning signs of a Heart Attack

Few things scare both men and women. One of those is the prospect of having a heart attack. Signs of a heart attack can actually differ between men and women. If you or someone you are with exhibits any of these symptoms, **call 911 right away**. It is much safer to call 911 than to wait and see if you or the person "gets better". Calling ASAP can save a life.

General signs or symptoms for both men and women:

- 1. Chest pain (angina) or discomfort
- 2. Pain or discomfort of the neck, jaw, or back
- 3. Pain or discomfort in the arms or shoulders
- 4. Shortness of breath
- 5. Feeling very tired, lightheaded or faint
- 6. Nausea or vomiting

Additional symptoms that women may feel:

- 1. Anxiety
- 2. Unusual tiredness or weakness
- 3. Upset stomach
- 4. Breaking out in a cold sweat

The following is a list of ways to prevent heart disease that are very effective;

- 1. Schedule a appointment with your doctor to go over your specific risks for heartdisease
- 2. Stop smoking right away (will cut your risk for heart disease by 50%!)
- 3. Moderately exercise each week for 150 minutes (like a brisk walk) or 75 minutes of vigorous exercise (like jogging)
- 4. Eat a heart health diet that removes or limits processed foods, sodium, and alcohol. Eat lots of fresh fruits and vegetables, lean protein, low fat dairy andnuts and seeds.

The body is the Temple of the Holy Spirit, so let's treat it that way, fellow BrotherKnights!
